This weekend saw the return of Deacon Jay to the Seminary for his last year of classes before, God willing, he will be ordained a priest next May. Deacon Jay has been with us at St. Julie throughout the summer and has had a good taste of parish life as an ordained minister. He had many opportunities to preach, to participate in the Mission Trip, attend Finance Council meetings, preside at his first Baptisms to name just a few experiences. In our many conversations, he has shared how he has continued to learn about both his vocation and about himself. I am grateful for the ways in which Deacon Jay assisted our parish this summer and we all wish him the best for the coming academic year. Deacon Jay will continue to be a part of our community as much as possible on weekends as the Seminary's calendar permits.

It seems appropriate to me to use this moment to encourage us all to think about the vocation to priesthood or religious life. Our Church needs more priests and religious. We know that first hand since our parish became a one-priest parish this summer. We need to encourage and foster vocations among our young people and not so young. The vocation mantra is that God is calling, but are we/you willing to answer? As a disciple of Jesus, we are all empowered to 'ask' someone to consider their vocation. In thinking of my own calling to the priesthood, it was evident because people in the parish and in my high school were willing to ask "have you ever thought about being a priest?"

Have you asked someone? Have you looked at your children or a young person in our parish and thought they'd make a good priest or religious sister? Do you pray for someone - if not yourself - to respond to God's call in their lives? Vocations are the Church's responsibility - and you are the Church!

God bless our seminarians and all who are discerning a calling to serve the Church in the vocation of priesthood and religious life!

Also, if you feel God's tug at your heart to share your faith and talents, we're always looking for help as catechists and/or aides. We know that Jesus said, "let the children come to me," how will you help a child see Jesus and know Jesus?

MASS SURVEY RESPONSE...

Another comment that was on the Mass times Survey was a request for a children's room in the church. My first response is that the "church" is the children's room! We should welcome all to be a part of the Mass. I know that this is, at times, challenging as young people get restless, they act up. I believe that causes some anxiety for parents as they don't want to be disruptive to others. Sometimes they might even encounter a 'look' that conveys discontent. To me, kids are kids. Like the Lord we need to love them, nurture them, at times correct and challenge them, but above all we need to welcome them to Mass. The proverbial Cry Room was a way to segregate kids and to provide a place to play with out being disruptive. In practice I think these rooms allowed kids to be distracted from the Mass without being distracting of the Mass. I think it is important to not distract a child from the Mass as they have the opportunity to be touched by God's grace as much as anyone else. I know they don't get all that goes on, but the sooner we try to 'engage' their minds around the grace of being at the Mass, the sooner they can hopefully experience the welcome of Jesus. Our narthex serves as a "quasi cry room," and seems sufficient for parents who do have to step out for a moment with a rambunctious little one. However, in the end, the goal is that the 'family room' is the within the walls and windows of the church!



21st Sunday in Ordinary Time

Reading I:

Joshua 24: 1-2a, 15-17, 18b

We will serve the Lord!

- The Book of Joshua describes the story of the Israelites as they take possession of the Promised Land.
- Joshua gathers the people in the center of the land at Shechem to renew their covenant commitment to God.

Reading II:

Ephesians 5: 21-32

Christ loves us as spouses love each other.

- The reading from the Letter to the Ephesians describes the mutual respect that should prevail in ordinary human relationships because of the new life shared in Christ.
- The fidelity and love between wife and husband symbolize the fidelity and love between God and the people and between Christ and his Church.

Gospel: John 6: 60-69

You have the words of eternal life.

- Jesus' divinity is clearly implied in the Gospel of John.
- In today's passage the disciples are faced with a choice.
- Peter, representing the Twelve, affirms their decision to stay with Jesus.

Equal Partners.....

When we were first married, my husband and I decided that it was better for our family if I stayed home with the children while he worked. That was an economically smart decision because at that time he made enough that we were comfortable, but not really enough that we could afford day care centers for them. So we mirrored the typical family unit of the day, working dad, stay at home mom, some kids in school, some kids still at home. Thus it was my 'job' to be the cook, laundress, housekeeper, chauffeur, tutor and all around Jill-of-all-trades. Dad's 'job' was to work during the week, cut grass, maintain the cars, do minor repair work around the house—and never, ever turn down overtime.

I think that while there are still families of that sort of make-up, they are no longer typical. Families today come in all sorts of sizes and packages. What **has** held true is that they continue to be people who love one another very much and try to make the best decisions they can for the welfare of the whole family. If that means mom works and dad stays at home, so be it. If that means a single working mom (or dad) who shares home duties with the children, so be it. If that means grandparents raising grandchildren, so be it. We are all, as a society, committed to bringing up God-loving, socially conscious, kind and generous children.

So even in this mix of many different kinds of families, there is still a commonality. The members have to work together as a team, as equals, in order for life to run smoothly. One person cannot have a puffed image of their contribution to the family unit because that would be detrimental to the delicate balance of give and take that is sorely needed when more than two

people try to co-exist peacefully. Each person gives the very best that they can offer for the benefit of all; and everyone acknowledges and validates the value of that. If they didn't, creativity would be squashed and the faith and trust in the value of being part of that family would be undermined.

I thought of all this while reading over today's second reading. Many people who hear this reading look at it as God's blueprint for man being the 'King' and woman being the servant. (my husband used to be one of those people, but, in the interest of that peaceful co-existence I mentioned, he has "seen the light.")

However, that isn't what the scripture says. A close reading of the whole passage shows that husbands and wives are to be subordinate to one another. That is at the very beginning of the passage, "be subordinate to one another out of reverence for Christ." Only after that does Paul qualify the statement in terms of the existing culture of the day so that his message would be understood. Then, after doing that, he ends the passage by saying the husband and wife become *one flesh*. So the beginning and the end alerts the reader to the fact that they are equal partners in their relationship and they are to act accordingly, nourishing and cherishing one another. While each may have different jobs, in the end, those jobs begin and end in love and respect for one another.

My Ruminations on the Good, the True, and the Beautiful


Something is “beautiful only because the delight that it arouses in us is founded upon the fact that, in it, the truth and goodness of the depths of reality itself are manifested and bestowed, and this manifestation and bestowal reveal themselves to us as being something infinitely and inexhaustibly valuable and fascinating.” (Hans Urs von Balthasar)

True beauty draws us out of ourselves toward the transcendent. The more beautiful an encounter is, the more the divine presence is made manifest to us. Thus, there is none more beautiful than that of the Incarnation of Christ. My hope with my drawings is to point to that fundamental importance of beauty as a vehicle to journey into the mind of God.

Twice a month I will share a drawing along with a description of the theological reflection that went into it so as to hopefully provoke theological reflection of our own.

St. Teresa's Loving Exchange

This drawing is based on St. Teresa of Avila's mystical encounter from The Book of Her Life, Chapter 29: “I saw an angel near me, on the left side, in bodily form.... He was not tall, but short, marvelously beautiful, with a face which shone as though he were one of the highest of the angels, who seem to be all of fire: they must be those whom we call Seraphim.... I saw in his hands a long golden spear, and at the point of the iron there seemed to be a little fire. This I thought that he thrust several times into my heart, and that it penetrated to my entrails. When he drew out the spear he seemed to be drawing them with it, leaving me all on fire with a wondrous love for God. The pain was so great.... and yet so exceeding sweet is this greatest of pains that it is impossible to desire to be rid of it, or for the soul to be content with less than God.”



I also wanted to use as a reference the sculptor, Gian Lorenzo Bernini's masterpiece, The Ecstasy of Teresa, which was based also on the same excerpt from Teresa's life. Using his statue I drew her in ink to show the outer physical reality of her experience. On the other side in colored pencil, I wanted to draw the inner spiritual reality of that same experience of the angel with its face aflame piercing her heart with a golden dart. In drawing the anatomical heart I wanted to portray the visceral nature but also to show how the spiritual reality was so intense that it penetrated into her physical reality. This is actually what happened. What sparked Bernini's interest in the first place was the fact that after Teresa's death her heart remained incorrupt with a wound in it reflecting the mystical encounter with the dart piercing her heart. This encounter is called the “transverberation of the heart”.

What drew me to Teresa's encounter was how this mystical exchange describes a genuine experience of love. What I mean is that it dismisses the idea that love is simply a lovely feeling we have toward another person but it is a self-sacrificial love that draws us through suffering for the sake of the other. It is not that she is taking pleasure in the painful experience itself but rather that she is overjoyed by Christ allowing her to participate in his suffering act of salvation on the cross. The joy of her experience is God Himself as indicated by the last line described in her experience. To love is to allow the divine life to enter into you and flow through you. That was precisely what happened when that angel pierced her heart over and over again.

St. Teresa has also been acknowledged as a Doctor of the Church because of her important contributions to prayer and mysticism. This does not mean she spent her whole life locked up in a room seeking mystical encounters. Encounters such as this were gifts given to her by God. She herself said, “it is not length of time spent in prayer that brings the soul benefit: when we spend our time in good works, it is a great help to us and a better and quicker preparation for the enkindling of our love than many hours of meditation.” We can see the mark of her enkindled love and pierced heart not only through her important and insightful contribution to mystical theology but also through the great reform she had established in the Carmelite order, the Discalced Carmelites she had co-founded, and the many convents she worked to erect as well.

Am I eligible to attend Cardinal Bernardin School? Where is it located?

CJB is a “regional” Catholic school (sponsored by St. Elizabeth Seton, St. Francis of Assisi, St. Julie Billiart and St. Stephen Deacon & Martyr). CJB also welcomes children from other parishes and Christian households whose parents are seeking a Christ-centered educational environment. Please share this news with your neighbors and friends! CJB is located at 9250 W. 167th Street in Orland Hills, adjacent to St. Elizabeth Seton Parish.

Do you offer Pre-K & Kindergarten?

Yes! We offer half-day and full-day 3-year-old and 4-year-old Pre-K! Kindergarten is full-day. The half-day 3PK program is Monday-Thursday. You would select either 7:40a-10:40a (AM) or 11a-2p (PM). Half-day 4PK is Monday-Friday (select AM or PM). Full-day PK and K are Monday-Friday. Full-day hours are 7:40a-2p.

Where and when may I get registration materials? How do I register?

Registration opened in January. We will continue to accept applications until all spaces are filled. To register, complete the online application at www.cjbschool.org and then mail or drop off *original* birth and baptismal certificates (*originals will be returned*) and a one-time family registration fee of \$250. For Grades 1-8, include a copy of the 2017-18 first semester report card and standardized test scores.

What is the tuition & how do I pay?

Tuition for 2018-19 is as follows. Full-day (Kindergarten-8) in-parish tuition is \$5,195. Full-day tuition for 3PK and 4PK is \$5,510. Half-day 3PK tuition is \$2,970. Half-day 4PK tuition is \$3,525. (Non-parishioner tuition is \$6,075 for Grades K-8). Tuition payment plans are available.

What about Financial Assistance?

When you complete the online registration, you will have an oppor-

tunity to complete an application for financial aid. Financial aid is available for in-parish families (K-8). Applications must be submitted by mid-March.

Is there a “Before and After School” Program?

Yes! The Extended Day Program opens at 6:30a and closes when the school day begins. Extended Day re-opens at 2p and closes at 6p. The hourly-rate (\$8/hr for one child; \$10/hr for two or more children) is invoiced monthly. All registered students may attend the Extended Day Program.

When may I register?

Registration is happening NOW. We will continue to accept registrations until all spaces are filled.
