## SUNDAY OF THE WORD OF GOD

On September 30, 2019, Pope Francis issued a directive that the Third Sunday of Ordinary Time would be celebrated as a Sunday for the Word of God. September 30 is the Feast of St. Jerome who is responsible for translating the Bible. The Holy

Father's intention is for all Christians to engage more fully with God's Word found in the Sacred Scriptures. And while we certainly 'break open' the Scriptures each Sunday in the midst of the assembly gathered for worship, the celebration of a Sunday dedicated to the Word of God is an opportunity to reflect more deeply on what place the Sacred Scriptures are a part of in our daily lives. Does the Bible simply sit on a book shelf as a book among other books; or does our Bible show the 'wear and tear' of having been prayed with, studied and engaged by regular use? We short-change ourselves if the only time we encounter the Word of God is when we come to Mass. The Good News of Sacred Scripture has so much to offer us on a daily basis. I suppose one way to look at the Popes invitation to us with a *Word of God Sunday*, is to recognize that just as Thanksgiving should not be "one day a year" of gratitude, similarly, the Word of God should not be a "one day a week" experience, rather, it should be a way of life. Our lives are so much richer when we encounter the wisdom of God speaking to us – let us renew our desire to be touched by the Word of God through frequent reading of our Sacred Scriptures.

## HAPPY NEWS

Recently, we received word that John Benz, our candidate for the diaconate, has received the endorsement of the formation faculty to be ordained a deacon this May! John and his wife Kathy have been in formation for the last four years and the date of his ordination is Saturday, May 9. He is finishing his courses, as well as learning the rites which he will participate in as a deacon. In the bulletin over the next few weeks, there will be a formal 'bann' announcing his ordination; I look forward to celebrating this wonderful day with John and Kathy and their family.

We, of course, will have a parish celebration of John's ordination to welcome him as a deacon serving our community.

## CATHOLIC SCHOOLS WEEK - ANGEL FUND

Today begins Catholic Schools Week, an opportunity for us to celebrate and promote Catholic Education. We are very blessed to sponsor Cardinal Joseph Bernardin as our parish school. There will be an open house today for prospective families from 1:00-3:00pm, all are invited.

Several years ago, we began taking up a second collection to provide financial assistance to families in need of some support in sending their child/children to CJB. We call this collection the Angel Fund. It is important to know that the money collected through the Angel Fund, which is taken up at all four sponsoring parishes, does not go into the ordinary operating account of the school's budget; rather, it is reserved and used solely for offering scholarship assistance when there is a need by a family. Thank you for your generous support of the Angel Fund.

## CENSUS 2020

A letter of support for the 2020 Census was recently sent by Cardinal Cupich to all the parishes. The census is a very important undertaking by the government and the Cardinal wishes to encourage our participation in this effort. Critical decisions about representation in government, about allocation of resources and long-term planning for the betterment of our communities are all results of a complete and accurate census which only occurs every ten years. The results of the census not only have a direct impact on the workings of government, but as well the ability of other organizations, such as the Church, who are impacted based upon decisions of government, as we carry on our mission to serve our communities, especially the poor and marginalized. Census Day is April 1, 2020 and the census questionnaires will arrive in March for households to fill out. On behalf of the Cardinal and our own local government leaders, I encourage your participation in the upcoming census to ensure its success.

# Good News!

January 26, 2020

Third Sunday in Ordinary Time (A) • Is 8:23–9:3; 1 Cor 1:10-13; Mt 4:12-23 or 4:12-1

**“You’re breaking the back of the body of Christ!”** Saint Paul might have said this to members of the Corinthian community who rival each other, claiming that the leader who baptized them is greater than the one who baptized others: “I belong to Paul...I belong to Apollos...I belong to Cephas” (1 Corinthians 1:12). This suggests that, based on their baptizer, the members themselves are superior. Such rivalry sounds so petty. We should be careful here, because some of this rivalry still exists in the Church.

In any healthy group there will be diverse opinions. We all have our own tastes, preferences, cultural habits, and so on. This is true in church music, preaching style, and religious devotion. The uniformity of the Church prior to the Second Vatican Council has given way to great diversity. What is different is not necessarily bad. Nor is our preference necessarily superior. Such diversity need not pit us against each other, but sometimes it does. Is Christ divided over points of preference?

We are all part of the body of Christ; we are all God’s beloved. The diversity among us challenges us to work toward the common good, to “be united in the same mind and in the same purpose” (1 Corinthians 1:10). Let us not divide Christ.

## CHRISTIANIZE THE CULTURE

Lunar New Year is the most important festival and family celebration in many Asian countries, lasting from seven days to a month. Family members gather in their hometowns, travel far across the country (or the world) to spend the Lunar New Year in each other's company - it is similar to the Thanksgiving or Christmas celebrations in the West. For the young, we share good wishes of health and prosperity; and for the elderly, we share blessings for longevity and health. Older siblings and parents give red envelopes with money to the young. There's lots of eating with big tables of festive foods that are only made for the Lunar New Year. This weekend is the celebration, the year of the Rat. When the missionaries came to Vietnam and observed this culture, they didn't want people to merely enjoy the pleasures of the world, so they decided to "Christianize" the culture. They encouraged families get together to go to Church, to get the Bible verses for the year, and to wish each other well, followed by food and drink.

It soon became a custom that there is a sequence of four Masses that people usually attend during new year: 1) The Lunar New Year's Eve Mass - people give thanks to God for the many blessings in their lives and ask God to console them in their sorrows; 2) The First Day of the New Year Mass - we give praise to God for a fresh start; 3) The Second Day of

the New Year Mass - we remember and pray for the ancestors, and 4) The Third Day of the New Year Mass - we pray for parents and friends, and ask God to bless everyone for a successful year.


I hope that we can continue to "Christianize" our culture at work, and in our relationships, using our words and actions to spread the love of God far and wide. Family is a good place to start!




There are no refunds or exchanges for Scrip card purchases. Be sure to double check your selections BEFORE leaving Cash & Carry sales or placing your Scrip Manager on line order.





*Born a Crime* by Trevor Noah
