THE MOST HOLY BODY AND BLOOD OF CHRIST

Today, the Church celebrates the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. This second Sunday after the Easter Season concludes is a reminder to us of the importance of the Eucharist in our lives.

I believe that the experience of the last several months during the pandemic, when we necessarily had to refrain from coming together to celebrate the Mass in person, awoke in us a 'holy hunger,' that is, a greater awareness and desire to unite with the Lord in Holy Communion. Participating in Mass via the media is not the same as it is in person, and even our Spiritual Communion – that born out of our desire – is still insufficient to satisfy the real hunger. Only the real and true presence of Jesus, present to us in His Body and Blood, satisfies the 'holy hunger.' Jesus gave us His Body and Blood as a lasting covenant for us to be one with Him and with His Church. As I look back on the last several months, I know how difficult it has been for so many people who "want Jesus" by physically receiving Holy Communion. At times, I have felt guilty as a priest, receiving Holy Communion as I offered Mass for you alone in the Chapel. I was moved to tears several times when a cantor who came to help in the livestreamed Mass would express such gratitude for the gift of Communion when they ministered. And I think back to celebrating Mass in a family's home the day before all this craziness started; the Mass was for a young second grader who is battling cancer and at the time was in grave condition.

The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ is truly a gift. Holy Communion sustains us, unites us, and shows us the unconditional, self-sacrifice of Jesus for us, not just at the Last Supper, but in feeding us today. It is a fervent hope and prayer, that as we reopen parish life, may we not lose sight of that deep longing, that 'holy hunger,' that we have for Jesus. Perhaps a silver lining from the cloud of the pandemic is a renewed appreciation of how Jesus gives us Himself in His Most Holy Body and Blood.

GRADUATION

Over the last couple of weeks, as the school year ended, albeit in an unexpected way, a number of folks graduated from their respective schools, colleges and universities. Congratulations to all graduates! Despite the oddness of virtual commencements and drive-by diploma handoffs, I hope you recognize the achievements you have made. Graduation always includes a moment of looking back and offering gratitude for the lessons learned, the support of family and teachers, and the relationships built. And, graduation is always an opportunity of looking ahead to the new possibilities which exist in entering the career world, moving on to a higher institution of learning and the potential for creating new bonds of friendship. The Class of 2020 will likely have the most unique experiences of finishing school. Nevertheless, the recognition of your graduating should not pass without offering you our heartiest Congrats! Kudos! Job Well Done!

Our parish school, Cardinal Joseph Bernardin will celebrate the Class of 2020 Graduates at a 'drive-by' handing out of diplomas on June 24, as well as several 'virtual' events. Congrats to CJB's 2020 Grads!

REOPENING

This weekend will be our second weekend of welcoming back parishioners for in-person Masses. Because of bulletin deadlines, I am writing this before we've had a thorough opportunity to evaluate the successes and challenges we discovered on our first weekend. Let this serve as a reminder to please check the website stjulie.org for the latest updates on reopening plans. As a reminder, we are following the guidance of the Archdiocese which is in support of the guidelines offered by the State of Illinois. My own sense was that we did a great job overall in our first steps. Hearing Confessions, celebrating Funerals, offering Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament and now Sunday Mass have begun to help people experience the grace of God that can only come from gathering in the Church. These successes are only made possible because of the generous volunteers who have stepped up to staff the Set-up Teams, Greeting Teams and Clean-up Teams. Each step in opening is dependent

GENEROSITY

REOPENING VOLUNTEERS NEEDED

As we reopen and prepare to increase Masses, additional volunteers are needed to assist with various aspects of our parish reopening plan. Importantly, leadership team members and volunteers must not be part of a “vulnerable population” (that is, not over the age of 65; no underlying medical condition such as diabetes; lung disease; undergoing cancer treatment, etc.). If you are younger than 65 and healthy with no underlying health conditions, consider assisting with one of the reopening teams:

- **Set-up team.** Sample duties include ensuring that all supplies needed for each sacramental celebration/gathering are ready for use, entrances and exits are marked and propped physically open prior to attendees’ arrival/departure, windows are opened, etc.
- **Greeting team.** Sample duties include assisting in managing the flow of congregants as they enter the church, making sure attendees use hand sanitizer upon entering, are wearing a mask, and are reminded not to enter if ill; directing people to appropriate seating/waiting areas, etc.
- **Cleaning team.** Sample duties include maintaining and cleaning essential and trafficked areas of the church before and after the church has been used. Masks and gloves will be provided, if you do not have your own, in addition to approved cleaning/disinfecting supplies.



Since I have seen many delicious pictures with smiling faces of families going out for meals at their favorite restaurant, I decided to “open” an outdoor restaurant myself. The dishes are exquisitely beautiful and tasty, I think. Why am I so confident? Well, the chef was praying constantly while cooking so that he would not burn his food. So, I don’t know if the food itself was tasty but at least I have the sweet holy smell from the chef’s prayers in those dishes. And with a nice breeze, I took my first bite after saying grace.

Then, I saw a similar face looking intently at me. At first, I thought, that bird wants to eat my food. But then, the next day I saw her gripping a worm in her tiny beak. “Well, bird, do you want to dine with me or do you want to exchange the food?” She flew away and came back the next day. I realized that she must be taking a meal to her little birds. Wow, what a love! From that observation, I think about the salangane, the bird that make their nests out of their saliva. St. Thomas Aquinas, a big theologian name, once said, “For on the altar of the Cross He immolated to the Father His own Body as victim for our reconciliation and shed His blood both for our ransom and for our regeneration. Moreover, in order that a

remembrance of so great benefits may always be with us, He has left us His Body as food and His Blood as drink under appearances of bread and wine.”

I hope that we have a great sense of reverence and appreciation receiving the Eucharist. And before that sacred time, I bring your attention to the moment when the priest pours water and wine or breaks the Host and lets it mingle with the wine in the chalice. We make a prayer asking God to let us mingle with the Divine so to see clearly our likeness in Him as His beloved Sons and Daughters.

Take and Eat

Many of us are little different from the Jewish crowds who cried out: "How can this man give us [his] flesh to eat?" (John 6:52). Jesus does not explain how the bread was really his flesh. What he did was underscore the importance of eating this bread, which was his flesh. He then goes on and insists that we must drink his blood as well. If these were hard sayings for the people of Israel, who in their ancient past might have shared the flesh and blood of a sacrificed animal, what are we "sophisticated" contemporary Christians to make of it?

The people of Jesus' time would have recognized several elements from their traditions in Jesus' discourse, but his reinterpretation of them would have startled them. Like the victim of an ancient holocaust offering, Jesus' blood is shed. However, it is not poured around the altar; it is to be consumed. Bread from heaven recalled the manna that fed their ancestors in the wilderness. However, the manna lasted for only a day; it then rotted. The bread Jesus gives is living bread that enables those who eat it to live forever. This is a lot to believe. But then, that is exactly what we are asked to do. We might have correct theological language to explain how this transformation takes place, but we still will not understand the mystery to which it points. So what are we to do? Very simply: take and eat!

BEFORE YOU ARRIVE



Check your temperature: if you have one, please do not come to church.




Stay home if you are ill.



Make sure you have a face covering to bring and wear.



Remember to bring your registration if you are not already on a list of attendees.



PARISHIONER REOPENING GUIDE Page 2

WHEN YOU ARRIVE



Enter only in marked doorways.



Wait patiently to be checked in by greeter.



Keep your face covering or mask on at all times except for receiving Communion.



Sanitize your hands as directed by greeter.



Observe social distancing at all times (look for marks on the floor).



Ushers will direct you to pews with markings showing where to sit.



Since there will be no passing of baskets for your offering please leave your offering in the boxes provided at the entrance and exit areas.

DURING THE SERVICE



Do not change seats during a service.



There will be no passing of offering baskets.



No physical sign of peace will be exchanged during Mass.



Follow instructions for Communion:

- Leave your seat only when directed by usher or greeter.
- Maintain six feet social distancing in the Communion line – look for marks on the floor.
- When 12 feet or two people away from the priest, sanitize your hands using the sanitizer from the usher. After sanitizing do not touch any surfaces.
- Approach the priest only after you are called forward. DO NOT remove your face covering.
- Extend a single hand to receive the Host.
- After moving six feet to the right or left, remove your mask and consume the Host.
- Replace your face covering or mask.
- Follow instructions to return to your pew.

AFTER THE SERVICE



Please take any worship aids you may have brought with you.



You will be dismissed by pew or seating area. Follow the instructions of the greeter or usher.



Use only the designated exit doors.



Do not congregate outside the church doors.



Continue to wear your face covering or mask until you leave the area where worshippers are.
