# BEING DISCIPLES OF THE LORD JESUS

So, this has now been my first full week at the parish. I would like to express my gratitude to everyone who greeted me and made me feel right at home over my first full weekend here at the parish. It was a great start to, what I am sure will be, a great future for all of us.

As the saying goes, the honeymoon is over. Real life is now beginning. At this point, people might be wondering what my plan is for my time here at St. Julie Billiart. What is my vision? What is my goal? The simple answer to that is rooted in our common call and vocation given to us by Jesus. Namely, he told us as his disciples to go into the world and proclaim the Good News. Further, Jesus mandated us to go and make disciples. As a priest and pastor, that has always been my goal and continues to be so.

I have oftentimes said that the mission of every Catholic parish comprises of two essential and non-negotiable aspects. The first is to pray well and the second is to teach the faith. As far as I am concerned, if any Catholic faith community is not focused on these two imperatives, that community needs to rethink the purpose of its own existence. But, if a Catholic faith community such as ourselves does both of these well and does them as the Church teaches, we will all succeed in accomplishing that goal of making disciples.

Our common task is not only to strengthen our own discipleship but to lead others into being disciples themselves. If we are not concerned with increasing the number of followers of Jesus, then we are completely missing the point as to who we are called to be and what we are called to do. Focusing on praying well and teaching the faith are again the two essential components to every Catholic parish. This will definitely be my goal here at the parish.

Having gone through my first full weekend here at the parish, I can already sense that there has been a practice of praying well. Obviously, we were nowhere near our pre-pandemic Mass attendance but I could already sense that the Spirit is moving in the parish community. It is a clear indication that the parish does indeed pray well. We can only build on what we already have been doing.

I also know for a fact that evangelization had been a key focus of my predecessor and classmate, Bishop-elect Lou. Evangelization is the way we, as a parish community, will fulfill that second mandate I mentioned. The work of teaching the faith involves catechesis – passing on the basic tenets of the faith – but also evangelization – the proclamation of the Word that leads to a conversion of heart. The work of teaching the faith is not something that is just the duty of priests and religious or even those on staff. This has been entrusted to all of us as Jesus' followers so we need to be doing this together.

If we concentrate on these two things – praying well and teaching the faith – we will not only fulfill our vocation as disciples but we will see our parish community continue to thrive and grow. This is my vision for the parish and this is my personal goal for my time here. I hope and pray that in the years to come, we will all be able to reap the fruits of our common effort.

As we continue to move forward through our reopening process, our needs evolve and we are able to fine-tune them.

**Greeters** – Typically for weekend Mass, we have two greeters at each entrance to welcome you. One will check folks in and the other will sanitize their hands. If you have time after Mass to assist with cleaning, we never turn anyone away!

**Ushers** – Our ushers seat parishioners in a safe manner using the blue markers on the pews for guides. They also usher them safely to receive Holy Communion and then again at dismissal. If you have time after Mass to assist with cleaning, we never turn anyone away!

**Cleaning Team** – Our cleaning team takes care of the restroom during Mass and then cleanup of the worship space after Mass. It takes about 20-30 minutes after Mass is over.

### Sacramental Services

*Weekend Mass is the main area that we look for volunteers. However, if you would like to offer your time at a less populated event, we also need folks for Funerals, Baptisms, Weddings, Adoration and Reconciliation.*

St. Julie has been blessed by wonderful people who graciously give of themselves as the need arises. If you are feeling called to ministry, this could be for you! Thank you for your consideration.

## OUR SHARING PARISH RECIPIENT CEASED ON JULY 1

A number of years ago a program known as Sharing Parish was established in the Archdiocese of Chicago. The idea was to connect parish communities together to share faith experiences and offer support to each other. In many of those pairings, things such as pulpit exchanges, choir visits for Mass, shared ministries and financial support were hallmarks of the relationships fostered. Over the years, many of these connections dwindled to simply parishes offering financial support to the Sharing Parish that was more economically challenged.

In this time of *Renew My Church* there is much discussion about the “remnants” of the program, especially as parishes are merged or closed. Our sharing parish, *Our Lady of Peace*, is one of the parishes that ceased to exist as it was merged on July 1, 2020. For many years, the people of St. Julie Billiart have been generous in their support.

For online givers, the option to contribute to Sharing Parish has been removed. In the recent batch of donation envelopes for July/ August, there is no longer a Sharing Parish envelope.







## Gospel

### A Reading from the holy gospel according to Matthew

On that day, Jesus went out of the house and sat down by the sea. Such large crowds gathered around him that he got into a boat and sat down, and the whole crowd stood along the shore. And he spoke to them at length in parables, saying:

“A sower went out to sow. And as he sowed, some seed fell on the path, and birds came and ate it up. Some fell on rocky ground, where it had little soil. It sprang up at once because the soil was not deep, and when the sun rose it was scorched, and it withered for lack of roots. Some seed fell among thorns, and the thorns grew up and choked it. But some seed fell on rich soil, and produced fruit, a hundred or sixty or thirtyfold. Whoever has ears ought to hear.”

The disciples approached him and said, “Why do you speak to them in parables?”

He said to them in reply,

“Because knowledge of the mysteries of the kingdom of heaven has been granted to you, but to them it has not been granted. To anyone who has, more will be given and he will grow rich; from anyone who has not, even what he has will be taken away. This is why I speak to them in parables, because *they look but do not see and hear but do not listen or understand*. Isaiah’s prophecy is fulfilled in them, which says: *You shall indeed hear but not understand, you shall indeed look but never see. Gross is the heart of this people, they will hardly hear with their ears, they have closed their eyes, lest they see with their eyes and hear with their ears and understand with their hearts and be converted, and I heal them.*

“But blessed are your eyes, because they see, and your ears, because they hear. Amen, I say to you, many prophets and righteous people longed to see what you see but did not see it, and to hear what you hear but did not hear it.

“Hear then the parable of the sower. The seed sown on the path is the one who hears the word of the kingdom without understanding it, and the evil one comes and steals away what was sown in his heart. The seed sown on rocky ground is the one who hears the word and receives it at once with joy. But he has no root and lasts only for a time. When some tribulation or persecution comes because of the word, he immediately falls away. The seed sown among thorns is the one who hears the word, but then worldly anxiety and the lure of riches choke the word and it bears no fruit. But the seed sown on rich soil is the one who hears the word and understands it, who indeed bears fruit and yields a hundred or sixty or thirtyfold.”





## A GOLDEN OPPORTUNITY

Taking thirty days of Silence? Wow, wow! What is going on? No worries, there is nothing serious. My friend is taking a 30 day retreat following the spiritual exercise of St. Ignatius Loyola. I have a holy jealousy toward his decision and wish I had time to do that. Basically, it is an intense spiritual exercise when one enters into a period of silence for prayer with a total trust in the Lord. He will open his mind and heart going through his joy, struggles, and attachments in prayer, meditating along with Scripture. Then, he will have an hour daily to speak with a spiritual director (who will accompany him through the 30 days) about what is going on during his prayer. After that, with the Lord's help, if there is any poor self-image, any fear, any guilt, or anything that needs healing, the Lord will perform healing miracles on him. Why do I know the process? I have done the short version – 8 days.

Not everyone can have that golden opportunity to do the 30 day retreat, yet we have many other golden opportunities for deepening our love of the Lord. For example, why did God create the world? You might say because He loves us – which is true. But the ultimate purpose of God's work is for our sanctification and for His glorification. Does it make God a selfish god? No, not at all! Do you want to know more about this cool stuff? There is a free online course named *An Introduction to the Sacred Liturgy* offered by Mr. Carstens. He is a wonderful professor at Mundelein who will blow your mind about the rich meaning of the Sacred Liturgy. ## THINGS I HAVE LEARNED WHILE SHELTERING IN PLACE

The last time I spent this much time with my family was 1979 when my twins were born. But even then, with my husband working and my older ones in school, I still managed to find some time to myself during the day. However, since March 15, I have been in daily – nay, minute by minute – contact with my retired husband and my elderly mother who lives with us. To say this is a unique experience would be so insufficient.

But, I have learned many things. First, even though I was not going into the office, my body clock continued in Morning Rush Hour Time. Never knowing what traffic tie-up might lurk about during my morning drive to work, I always left early in case an alternate route needed to be found. My inner alarm clock faithfully followed its early morning setting.

## CLIMATE CHANGE: A MATTER OF FAITH? YES!

Pope Francis follows Popes John Paul II and Benedict in recognizing the scientific consensus that climate change is caused by human activity. Deforestation and burning fossil fuels are major causes. While some have wrongly turned it into a political issue, Pope Francis recognizes it as a social justice and a moral issue. This is because those who will suffer most from the resulting environmental damage are the poor and future generations.

Pope Francis calls upon individuals, governments and corporations to make changes to mitigate the problem. He has met with top Energy company executives and they have agreed to support a price on carbon emissions.

The US Conference of Catholic Bishops also has issued a statement of support for legislation (H.R.763) that puts a price on carbon emissions to encourage a switch to clean energy, without economically harming the poor or middle class. The severe human costs, that will be a consequence of doing nothing, make this a moral issue and a matter of concern and action as part of our faith.

## United States Conference of Catholic Bishops/Justice for Immigrants' Action Alert to the U.S. Senate:

# PLEASE PROTECT DACA RECIPIENTS

The U.S. Supreme Court (SCOTUS) has ruled on the Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (DACA) program. While SCOTUS allowed DACA to continue, the Administration can still attempt to end DACA at a later date. As a result, DACA immigrant youth are safe for now, but could be at risk for deportation in the future. We must not allow this to happen.

Most DACA recipients have spent the majority of their lives in the U.S., many have families, and all of them contribute to American society as taxpayers, consumers, and community members. Additionally, there are 62,000 DACA-eligible healthcare workers involved in the COVID-19 response.

The U.S. House of Representatives passed the American Dream and Promise Act, H.R. 6, one year ago. H.R. 6 would give a path to citizenship for Dreamers. Now, in the wake of SCOTUS' ruling, the U.S. Senate must act in order to protect Dreamers from the risk of deportation and family separation. The USCCB supports the DREAM Act, which includes a path to citizenship, and sent a letter to each Senator asking that they support S. 874, the DREAM Act of 2019. Additionally, USCCB supports efforts to introduce a Senate companion to H.R. 6.

As Catholics, we affirm the inherent dignity of every person. The U.S. Catholic Bishops urge you to express solidarity with Dreamers and ask you to contact your Senators requesting that they support the bipartisan DREAM Act of 2019 and encourage the Senate to introduce a companion bill to H.R. 6, the American Dream and Promise Act.

### TAKE ACTION

Urge your U.S. Senators to co-sponsor and support S. 874, the DREAM Act, which would protect Dreamers and provide a path to U.S. citizenship. Also urge your Senators to introduce and co-sponsor a companion bill to H.R. 6, the American Dream and Promise Act.

Please send the following message to your Senators:

*Dear Senator,*

*As a member of the Justice for Immigrants (JFI) coalition of the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops, I urge you to co-sponsor and support S. 874, the DREAM Act, a bipartisan bill that would protect Dreamers and provide these immigrants with a path to citizenship. I also ask that you introduce and co-sponsor a companion bill to H.R. 6, the American Dream and Promise Act.*

*The Catholic Church strongly supports Dreamers and their families. Dreamers are working and contribute \$52 billion annually to our economy. They are a part of our Church and valuable parts of our communities.*


## FAMILY FAITH SHARING

#### BEFORE YOU ARRIVE



Check your temperature: if you have one, please do not come to church.



Stay home if you are ill.



Make sure you have a face covering to bring and wear.

#### WHEN YOU ARRIVE



Enter only in marked doorways.



Wait patiently to be checked in by greeter.

Ushers will direct you to pews with markings showing where to sit.

## DURING THE SERVICE



Do not change seats during a service.



There will be no passing of offering baskets.



No physical sign of peace will be exchanged during Mass.



Follow instructions for Communion:

- Leave your seat only when directed by usher or greeter.
- Maintain six feet social distancing in the Communion line – look for marks on the floor.
- When 12 feet or two people away from the priest, sanitize your hands using the sanitizer from the usher. After sanitizing do not touch any surfaces.
- Approach the priest only after you are called forward. DO NOT remove your face covering.
- Extend a single hand to receive the Host.
- After moving six feet to the right or left, remove your mask and consume the Host.
- Replace your face covering or mask.
- Follow instructions to return to your pew.
