## A MESSAGE FROM OUR PASTOR

September 30th (this coming Wednesday) is the feast of St. Jerome. He lived in the fourth century and has been attributed as the one who revised the Latin text of the Bible which is known as the Vulgate. To this day, the translation that was the fruit of thirty years of work by St. Jerome. He labored all of those years and, in the end, provided a universal translation which has become the foundation of the translations of the Bible in various languages. In fact, the Vulgate has been the base translation that has been used by Catholics and even by some Protestant denominations since the time of St. Jerome.

St. Jerome came from a rich pagan family. His youth was not always the epitome of what we might expect from a saint but he had a genuine conversion and eventually was baptized. He studied theology and lived for years as a hermit separated from the world in order to focus on spiritual matters of life. He eventually became a priest and it was during that time when he was commissioned by Pope Damasus I to revise the Latin text of the Bible. At the end of his life, St. Jerome returned to a life of seclusion as a hermit.

In symbols and images, St. Jerome is oftentimes depicted with a lion. Legend has it that the great Saint came to the aid of a lion by removing a thorn from its paw. Since then, the story goes that the lion never left the Saint's side for years.

One comment that has been attributed to St. Jerome is "ignorance of Scripture is ignorance of Christ." Whether or not he actually uttered this phrase, it still is a great testament to St. Jerome's work and the impact it has had on the faith life of every Catholic from his time until the present day. There is truth in those words attributed to St. Jerome. If a believer has no familiarity with the written Word of God, there can be no hope of ever fully knowing and

encountering the living Word of God who is Jesus himself.

And so, we must take it very seriously to have a familiarity with the Sacred Scriptures in order to have a real encounter with Jesus. That encounter with Jesus is the key element we all need in order to fulfill our mandate to teach the faith. It stands to reason that we will only effectively pass on the faith if we truly have come to know Jesus in a very real and personal way.

Of course, many of us might recall a time in our Church's history when the average Catholic was discouraged – perhaps even forbidden – from even reading any passage in Sacred Scripture. The reason for it then is rooted in something that is still the truth to this day. Namely, in interpreting Sacred Scripture, it is not so much a matter of "What does it mean for me?" Such an approach can develop very individualistic understandings of Sacred Scripture where what one person likes or agrees with in the Bible is just as acceptable as what another person might like. Then, it runs the risk of interpreting the Word of God according to personal preference which also can lead to the tendency to "pick and choose" which parts of Scripture a given person might take seriously and which one he/she might choose to disregard.

Instead, in our Church, there is the body known as the Magisterium. This is the official teaching body of the Church which has the authority to give authentic interpretations of Sacred Scripture whether in its written form or what has come to the Church's understanding through her lived Tradition. So, we should not understand the time long ago as a "prohibition" on Catholics reading the Bible so much as an emphasis that Sacred Scripture speaks to the life of the whole Church rather than just a particular individual.

Still, the life of St. Jerome and the words attributed to him – ignorance of Scripture is ignorance of Christ – point today to the reality and essentiality of a familiarity with Sacred

Scripture which oftentimes is so lacking among us as Catholics. It has sometimes been said that Catholics are not able to quote Scripture or remember the Bible by book, chapter, and verse. Yet, the words of Sacred Scripture permeate our entire lives as Catholics and is also at the heart of our prayer life. If, for example, we took an in-depth study at the Eucharistic liturgy from start to end, practically every word we use in the liturgy is rooted in the words of Sacred Scripture. But, that is a lesson for another day.

Suffice it to say that we ought to follow the spirit of St. Jerome and come to have a daily familiarity with Sacred Scripture. If Sacred Scripture truly is God's Word spoken for our benefit, how can we ever come to know what God means to say to us if we do not pray with Sacred Scripture? How can we come to know Jesus who is God's Word come in the flesh if we do not pray with the Scriptures that contain his very words?

Obviously, though, not all of us will have a theological background when we read Sacred Scripture. For that reason, we still must rely on the Magisterium for guidance in that effort. But, praying with Sacred Scripture is not necessarily the same as a theological study of it. Any one of us can still regularly pray with Sacred Scripture. I dare say as well that if our prayer life is not rooted in Sacred Scripture, we are sorely missing a great deal.

Again, it does not require a lifetime of study such as St. Jerome. It might just be a simple matter of reading a chapter from the Old Testament every morning and a chapter from the New Testament every evening. However way we may choose to do so, it is simply a regular time spent with the Word of God in order to come to know Jesus who is the Word Made Flesh.

As we continue to move forward through our reopening process, our needs evolve and we are able to fine-tune them. Many volunteers are needed for Masses, services and events.

### Weekend Masses

- Monday to Friday 8:00am

We have three main areas of focus:

1. **Greeters** - Typically for weekend Mass, we have two greeters at each entrance to welcome you. One will check folks in and the other will sanitize their hands. If you have time after Mass to assist with cleaning, we never turn anyone away!
2. **Ushers** - Our ushers seat parishioners in a safe manner using the blue markers on the pews for guides. They also usher them safely to receive Holy Communion and then again at dismissal. If you have time after Mass to assist with cleaning, we never turn anyone away!
3. **Cleaning Team** - Our cleaning team takes care of the restroom during Mass and then cleanup of the worship space after Mass. It takes about 20-30 minutes after Mass is over.

St. Julie has been blessed by wonderful people who graciously give of themselves as the need arises. If you are feeling called to ministry, this could be for you! Thank you for your consideration.

## CATECHISM ON THE HOLY SACRIFICE OF THE MASS

Finding a good book is like finding a treasure! I am reading and chewing the

sweetness of *The Little Catechism of The Cure of Ars*. It is a short good read. In these following weeks, I will continue to share St. John Vianney writing, I hope we all will be inspired by his way of living and praying.

“All good works together are not of equal value with the Sacrifice of the Mass, because they are the works of men, and the holy Mass is the work of God. Martyrdom is nothing in comparison; it is the sacrifice that man makes of his life to God; the Mass is the sacrifice that God makes to man of His Body and of His Blood. Oh, how great is a priest! if he understood himself he would die... God obeys him; he speaks two words, and Our Lord comes down from Heaven at his voice, and shuts Himself up in a little Host. God looks upon the altar. “That is My well-beloved Son,” He says, “in whom I am well-pleased.” He can refuse nothing to the merits of the offering of this Victim. If we had faith, we should see God hidden in the priest like a light behind a glass, like wine mingled with water.

After the Consecration, when I hold in my hands the most holy Body of Our Lord, and when I am in discouragement, seeing myself worthy of nothing but Hell, I say to

myself, ‘ah, if I could at least take Him with me! Hell would be sweet with Him; I could be content to remain suffering there for all eternity, if we were together, but then there would be no more Hell; the flames of love would extinguish those of justice.’ How beautiful it is. After the Consecration, the good God is there as He is in Heaven. If man understood this mystery, he would die of love. God spares us because of our weakness. A Priest once, after the Consecration, had some little doubt whether his few words could have made Our Lord descend upon the Altar; at the same moment he saw the Host all red, and the corporal tinged with blood.

If someone said to us, ‘at such an hour a dead person is to be raised to life,’ we should run very quickly to see it. But is not the Consecration, which changes bread and wine into the Body and Blood of God, a much greater miracle than to raise a dead person to life? We ought always to devote at least a quarter of an hour to preparing ourselves to hear Mass well; we ought to annihilate ourselves before God, after the example of His profound annihilation in the Sacrament of the Eucharist and we should make our examination of conscience, for we must be in a state of grace to be able to assist properly at Mass. If we knew the value of the holy Sacrifice of the Mass, or rather if we had faith, we should be much more zealous to assist at it.

My children, you remember the story I have told you already of

that holy priest who was praying for his friend; God had, it appears, made known to him that he was in Purgatory; it came into his mind that he could do nothing better than to offer the holy Sacrifice of the Mass for his soul. When he came to the moment of Consecration, he took the Host in his hands and said, ‘O Holy and Eternal Father, let us make an exchange. Thou has the soul of my friend who is in Purgatory, and I have the Body of Thy Son, Who is in my hands; well, do Thou deliver my friend, and I offer Thee Thy Son, with all the merits of His death and Passion.’ In fact, at the moment of the elevation, he saw the soul of his friend rising to Heaven, all radiant with glory. Well, my children, when we want to obtain anything from the good God, let us do the same; after Holy Communion, let us offer Him His well-beloved Son, with all the merits of His death and His Passion. He will not be able to refuse anything.” (page 37-39, *The Little Catechism of The Cure of Ars*.)

Wow! Yes, It is pretty cool, isn't it? So let us approach to receive the Lord with a sense of AWE.
