A MESSAGE FROM OUR PASTOR

If I were still in my last parish assignment, I would be in the midst of a novena leading up to the celebration of the patronal feast day of St. Margaret Mary Alacoque which is on October 16. This weekend, I would like to share with my new parishioners the life and influence of the patroness of my last assignment.

St. Margaret Mary was born on July 22, 1647 in the region of Burgundy, France. At the age of about nine, she was struck with rheumatic fever and remained bedridden until about the age of fifteen. At that point, she had made a promise to the Blessed Virgin Mary to consecrate herself to the religious life. Once she had made this vow, St. Margaret Mary was healed. In gratitude for the healing, she added the name of Mary to her baptismal name and was further known as Margaret Mary.

At a young age, St. Margaret Mary lost her father and the family's assets were controlled by a relative which virtually plunged the family into poverty. At about the age of seventeen, the family's wealth was restored and Margaret Mary's mother encouraged her to go into society in the hopes that she would find a suitable husband. In obedience to her mother, this became her intention with every formal dance and ball that she attended feeling that her promise to the Virgin was no longer binding.

One night, after coming home from a carnival, St. Margaret Mary received a vision of Jesus beaten and bloody. In the vision, Jesus reprimanded her for forgetting her promise to consecrate herself to the religious life but assured her as well that his love for her would never end. Thus, at age twenty-four, she entered the Visitation order of religious sisters and lived in the convent at Paray Le Monial. After many trials, she was finally allowed to become a nun on November 6, 1672 at the age of twenty-five.

Even at the age of twenty, St. Margaret Mary had received personal and private visions from the Sacred Heart of Jesus. But, the visions became more frequent when she entered the convent. Starting on

December 27, 1673, she was visited by Jesus himself on several occasions with the last vision taking place about eighteen months later. In these visions, Jesus informed the saint that she was to be the chosen instrument through which devotion to his Sacred Heart would spread.

For the longest time, no one would believe the credibility of the visions. Her own Mother Superior rebuffed her. Eventually, she gained the support of her superior but still had a difficult time convincing others. Finally, her confessor Blessed Claude La Colombiere affirmed the genuineness of her visions and the devotion to the Sacred Heart began to spread.

Through St. Margaret Mary, the image of the Sacred Heart of Jesus was made known not only to the Catholic Church but to the whole world. Through this saintly woman, Jesus has reminded us of his ultimate mission – to share the love of God with all people. This is perhaps a message that the entire world still needs to hear.

At the heart of Jesus' message was the command to love God above all others and to love one another as we would love ourselves. This is a message that must be repeated often to every follower of Christ in every time and age. Jesus revealed his Sacred Heart to St. Margaret Mary as a reminder to all humankind of his basic command to love God above everyone else and to love one another as we would love ourselves. Love of God is easy enough for anyone to profess. Yet, loving neighbor as we would love ourselves is oftentimes easier said than done.

Still, the message of the Sacred Heart of Jesus is the same for us today as when he first appeared to St. Margaret Mary in the 17th century and even when Jesus first walked the earth over 2,000 years ago. Namely, if we want to love God, we must love the human being next to us. If we want to see the face of God, we must see God's face in every human being we encounter. The Heart of Jesus is a clear reminder to believer and non-believer alike that to look at another human being is to be in the presence of God for humankind was created in the image and likeness of God. When we are unable or refuse to see the face of God in the face of another human

being, it then becomes easy to fall into the trap of believing that the immigrant, the addict, or the unborn are nothing but unwanted entities. When we cannot see that every human face is an instance of God's presence among us, we will lead ourselves to believe that the poor and the homeless are nothing else but sad statistics. The Heart of Jesus as revealed to St. Margaret Mary teaches all of humanity that loving God and loving neighbor must be more than mere words that we utter. It must be a commitment.

The Sacred Heart of Jesus – as taught by the life of St. Margaret Mary – also calls us to make reparation for sin. In other words, we each must take it upon ourselves to invoke the mercy of God on behalf of everyone who sins. The wound in the Sacred Heart and the crown of thorns that surrounds it are clear reminders of the consequences of sin that pierced the very heart of God himself. We are called to take responsibility not only for our own sins but also for those of others. It is not that we ourselves will be punished on account of the sins of others but we are to call one another to be the best and holiest versions of ourselves. Otherwise, we might just be the cause of other peoples' sins which would make matters worse.

Our patroness has something in common with St. Margaret Mary and that is St. Julie's devotion to the Sacred Heart. After all, it was during a novena to the Sacred Heart of Jesus that St. Julie was healed of her paralysis and regained the ability to walk. As the Church celebrates St. Margaret Mary on our patronal feast day, may the Sacred Heart of Jesus who reminded her of his love make clear once again that love of God and love of neighbor remains at the heart of our calling as human beings and as Christians.



As we continue to move forward through our reopening process, our needs evolve and we are able to fine-tune them. Many volunteers are needed for Masses, services and events.

Weekend Masses

- Saturday 4:30pm
- Sunday 9:30am, 11:30am, 6:00pm

Weekday Masses

- Monday to Friday 8:00am

We have three main areas of focus:

1. **Greeters** – Typically for weekend Mass, we have two greeters at each entrance to welcome you. One will check folks in and the other will sanitize their hands. If you have time after Mass to assist with cleaning, we never turn anyone away!
2. **Ushers** – Our ushers seat parishioners in a safe manner using the blue markers on the pews for guides. They also usher them safely to receive Holy Communion and then again at dismissal. If you have time after Mass to assist with cleaning, we never turn anyone away!
3. **Cleaning Team** – Our cleaning team takes care of the restroom during Mass and then cleanup of the worship space after Mass. It takes about 20-30 minutes after Mass is over.

St. Julie has been blessed by wonderful people who graciously give of themselves as the need arises. If you are feeling called to ministry, this could be for you! Thank you for your consideration.





A Reading from the holy gospel according to Matthew

Jesus said to the chief priests and the elders of the people: Jesus again in reply spoke to the chief priests and elders of the people in parables, saying,

"The kingdom of heaven may be likened to a king who gave a wedding feast for his son. He dispatched his servants to summon the invited guests to the feast, but they refused to come. A second time he sent other servants, saying, 'Tell those invited: "Behold, I have prepared my banquet, my calves and fattened cattle are killed, and everything is ready; come to the feast."' Some ignored the invitation and went away, one to his farm, another to his business. The rest laid hold of his servants, mistreated them, and killed them. The king was enraged and sent his troops, destroyed those murderers, and burned their city. Then he said to his servants, 'The feast is ready, but those who were invited were not worthy to come. Go out, therefore, into the main roads and invite to the feast whomever you find.' The servants went out into the streets and gathered all they found, bad and good alike, and the hall was filled with guests. But when the king came in to meet the guests, he saw a man there not dressed in a wedding garment. The king said to him, 'My friend, how is it that you came in here without a wedding garment?' But he was reduced to silence. Then the king said to his attendants, 'Bind his hands and feet, and cast him into the darkness outside, where there will be wailing and grinding of teeth.' Many are invited, but few are chosen."






LIGHT A CANDLE

If you happen to travel to different parishes and look around, you will probably see a set of small candles burning with the option of light one yourself. At St. Julie, we have them in the Marian Chapel. The use of prayer or votive candles has become very popular and they are usually lit in front of a religious statue for a particular intention. For example, when I traveled to visit St. Joseph's Oratory of Mount Royal in Montreal, I lit many candles to pray for my family and people who asked me to pray for. It helps to enhance the act of praying.

This practice of lighting a candle for a need or request is not new. It was a custom to burn oil lamps at the tombs of the early martyrs in the catacombs. This showed solidarity with those who died in the name of Christ. We further this practice and light a candle in memory of our loved one who passed away with the hope to convey the Lord's message. *"I am the light of the world. Whoever follows me will not walk in darkness, but will have the light of life"* John 8:12. The Catechism of the Catholic Church also encourages the faithful to do so, *"From the beginning the Church has honored the memory of the dead and offered prayers in suffrage for them, above all the Eucharistic sacrifice, so that, thus purified, they may attain the beatific vision of God."* (CCC 1032).

In anticipation of **All Soul's Day** (November 2), you are invited to virtually light a candle in memory of your loved ones. We are accustomed to lighting a real candle, but are unable right now due to pandemic restrictions. Therefore, we will receive your intention, good memory of your loved one and post on the Facebook for everyone to pray for you and your loved one. 40 DAYS FOR LIFE

Dear Respect Life Friends,

I stood outside the Flossmoor Planned Parenthood building on Friday afternoon. It was the busiest I can remember for as long as I have been praying with **40 Days For Life**. Cars were constantly coming and going.

I watched as two men dressed in full suits and satchels entered and exited the clinic. Were they corporate folks? Their cars had out-of-state license plates (PA and GA). Maybe they were rental cars? My thoughts were racing as to the possibility of sex traffickers?

From 2-3pm several women left the building into waiting cars. Dr. Rich Mantoan and I were talking toward the end of my hour and we noticed a male driving a car slowly out of the parking lot. There was a woman in the passenger front seat holding her hands to her face looking very much in discomfort. Our eyes met. She did not lower her window to talk with us. I turned to Dr. Rich and said, "This is a very sobering moment". He agreed. To myself I said, "This is what abortion looks like".

What could any of us have done before she entered PP? I was not standing there in the morning when she arrived. Could we have convinced her to leave? I pray for her and I ask you to pray for her also.

After my shift, I stopped into the Aid For Women Center. It did me a world of good to meet Connie and Tessa who *serve* women who are abortion-minded. Goodness and hospitality is such a stark contrast from their Planned Parenthood Neighboring facility.

I hope the face of the woman I encountered will not fade from my memory. At the very least, she will motivate me to keep a shift during **40 Days For Life**.

Please pray and educate others about **40 Days for Life**. Encourage others to pray outside the Planned Parenthood building. St. Julie Billiart parishioners are normally present on Fridays from 12-1p.
