A MESSAGE FROM OUR PASTOR

This week I have two pieces of information to share. The first is in regards to Renew My Church and the second is a welcome back to an important couple.

Renew My Church began for us at the end of January, which I've previously shared. But, what I haven't shared with you are the three parishioners who are serving on what is called the Grouping Feedback and Discernment Team. Each Pastor in our grouping was to recruit three parishioners who would act as the representatives of their respective faith communities. They would bring not only their own thoughts, concerns, ideas, and input but also serve as a conduit for parishioners to convey input. You may know them by their involvement in the parish. As we go through the process of Renew My Church, I invite you to feel free to connect with them and share any thoughts or concerns you may have. Each of them were selected by me because they have the ability to share with a larger group the ideas and needs of our particular parish as well as listen to the thoughts of others. I had a difficult time trying to narrow the list down to just three people. Rest assured they are willing to receive your own input to share with the larger group from the other parishes. Here are the members of the Grouping Feedback and Discernment Team for St. Julie:

Kay Kempke - a member of our Finance Council, and as a member, Kay is fully aware of our financial status and needs. She will bring all of that information with her to the Renew My Church conversations. Kay and her husband joined St. Julie's in 1987 and have raised their two sons in our parish. At one point or another all four of them have been involved in our ministries. Kay is a part of the Music Ministry, being one of our wonderful cantors, and a part of the Adult Choir.




Danny Salgado - a member of the Parish Council. The Parish Council serves as an advisory board to me as the pastor. I've already consulted with the members of the Parish Council on several issues regarding the parish. Danny, along with the other members, has given me valuable insight and suggestions to ponder. He and his family have been a part of St. Julie's for about 15 years.



Joanne Tuzik - one of our sacristans and a Faith Formation Catechist and volunteer. Another area I wanted represented in the Renew My Church discussion is what I would call the "seasoned parishioners." That is, I wanted to make sure the team has a parishioner who has been with the parish as close to the beginning as possible. Joanne joined St. Julie's about 2 years after the parish was established. That would mean she has been an active part of the parish for the last 45 years or so.



Everyone on the Renew My Church Team want to make sure that every parishioner has the opportunity to share whatever input you feel is important and have the confidence to know that your input will be shared and your concerns voiced.

On a different note, I would like to share the news that we are welcoming Deacon Rich Miska and his wife Irene back to the parish community!



They joined St. Julie parish in 1974. Then after a brief time away from the Church, they returned to the practice of the faith and became very dedicated parishioners. They took to heart the call to put their faith into action so they dove into parish life getting involved with several ministries and their children were involved as well.

Deacon Rich was ordained a deacon of the Archdiocese of Chicago in 1990. Prior to his ordination, Deacon Rich had worked with various companies. He served as our Business Manager and also as a deacon at St. Julie's. In 2004, Deacon Rich was transferred to St. Terrence Parish in Alsip as a Deacon but remained as Business Manager at St. Julie's. 

THE SEED

A family reached out to me and asked if I wanted some radish sprouts...it's a nice way to tell me my chubbiness is becoming more evident. 😊 As you know, radish sprouts are very green tasting and go well with most dishes. It not only gives a 'radish' flavor to the food but also provides a crunch with a nice spicy kick.

I asked them how they're able to plant radish sprouts during winter. "Well, Father, stop looking at the books and look around the house! There might be some space near the window for your 'indoor' garden." Well, as you can see to the right I made the suggestion a reality.

People joke, "You are what you eat," developing a theory that I will become like radish sprout – giving spicy taste and crunchy joy to the plates that the chef prepare; and becoming greener daily in preparation for St. Patrick's Day. I like that thought!

However, to my surprise, having this indoor 'garden' helped me deepen my awareness of God's grace. In Catechism of the Catholic Church says, "Grace is *favor*, the free and undeserved help that God gives us to respond to his call to become children of God, adoptive sons, partakers of the divine nature and of eternal life. Grace is a *participation in the life of God*" CCC. 1997. Yes, grace is a free gift given by the Lord. In other words, it is not like we are worthy of receiving it or being rewarded based on our actions but it is simply a free gift from the Lord.

When I sow radish seeds, I am not expecting to have beautiful orchids or nice orange trees but radish sprouts. So, by God's grace, we are his adopted sons and daughters, clearly seen at the moment of our baptism (sanctifying grace). God plants/sows His images and likeness in us. Therefore, it would be unusual if we grow up becoming something else (children of worldly pleasure gods for instance).

And understanding this metaphor, it sheds more light to Jesus saying, "I no longer call you servants, ... Instead, I have called you friends" John 15:15. Why not servants but friends? Because the seed that



God has planted in us is the one growing to be like Him according to the likeness of the Blessed Trinity.

After our baptism, we continue to grow and be more like God – participating in the life of Himself. We are able to do so by the supernatural push or encouragement (actual grace). It ushers us to, like the sprouts, try to reach or lean toward the light, fix our gazes toward the Lord who is the light itself.



A Reading from the holy gospel according to Mark

On leaving the synagogue Jesus entered the house of Simon and Andrew with James and John. Simon's mother-in-law lay sick with a fever. They immediately told him about her. 


