## A MESSAGE FROM OUR PASTOR

HAPPY  
VALENTINE'S  
DAY!



February 14, of course, is known as the “Day of Love.” Today his feast day is no longer on the official calendar of Saints. But, local communities observe it

especially if there is a special connection to him.

What we can be certain of, though, is that there was an actual St. Valentine. He was most likely a priest or a bishop in the 3rd century. He was martyred and February 14 was the day of his martyrdom. He became associated with love and courtship more by accident since there had been a custom of boys and girls exchanging tokens of love around the middle of February. However, St. Valentine’s martyrdom reminds us of our call to love God who is Love Itself. Our lives as disciples must be rooted in that love.

Speaking of our love for God, have you had the chance yet to read your gift from Christmas? All the parishioners are on our mailing list received a copy of Matthew Kelly’s book, [I Heard God Laugh](#). I just finished reading it myself. I encourage you to read it. Our love for God must be centered and rooted in a healthy prayer life which is what Matthew Kelly’s book challenges us to do.

Before I share a summary of the prayer process found in [I Heard God Laugh](#), I share another point that Matthew Kelly makes in the book. Actually, it is a distinction between learning prayers and learning *how* to pray.

For the most of us – if not all – there was someone in our lives who taught us the prayers we ought to know. It might have been a parent, an older sibling, an aunt or uncle, grandparent, babysitter or even a mentor. Whoever it might have been for any one of us, someone in our lives taught us the basic prayers that we ought to know as Catholics. Those same people may have taught us even more prayers – devotions, novenas, the rosary and the like.

However, as Matthew Kelly points out and I share with you, has anyone taught you *how* to pray?

I cannot begin to tell you how often people come to me as a priest and share how their prayer life seems dry and empty. They end up distressed, stressed out, or maybe even give it up altogether. The reason for this – as Matthew Kelly points out and I find myself agreeing with him – is that we focus too much on just saying prayers and we’re really not entering into prayer; or, what we end up doing is simply asking God for one thing or another and our prayer becomes very one-sided.

Prayer - as an expression of and foundation for our love for God – must truly be about developing a relationship with God. So, as the book makes it clear, we have to retrain ourselves and learn *how* to pray...more challenging than just learning prayers.

Fortunately, Matthew Kelly offers us a simple prayer process where we can focus more on “*how*” to pray rather than just reciting prayers from memory. Now, do not misinterpret things. There is nothing inherently wrong with reciting prayers like the rosary, novenas, etc. The problem comes when our prayer becomes one-sided. If prayer is a relationship with God, what are we doing to listen to what God wants of us?

Here is a summary of the prayer process from Matthew Kelly’s book [I Heard God Laugh](#). In the book, he challenges his readers to use this prayer process for 21 days. It can become the basis of a stronger relationship with God.

1. **Gratitude** - There are times when we find ourselves beginning our prayer simply by telling God what we or others need. Sometimes, we begin our prayer with whatever gripes we might have about other people in our lives. But, have we ever begun our prayer time with a sense of gratitude? Begin by thanking God for all the good moments in a day.
2. **Awareness** - We each need to do an examination of conscience every day. This examination is a review of the ways we have not lived up to being a good disciple of Jesus. It is not meant to make us feel guilty. Rather, it is meant to be a reminder that we have so much more work to do in becoming the best disciples we can be and we cannot do it without God’s help. We all make mistakes. The key is whether we will allow

ourselves to learn from failure just as much as we learn from success.

3. **Significant Moments** - In addition to an examination of conscience, we need to take a critical look at every experience of our lives and ask "What might God be trying to say to me through that experience?" Every moment can be a learning moment. We need to develop in us a willingness to grow which requires an openness to the process of conversion.
4. **Peace** - When we realize the moments we have failed and even embrace those moments of failure, we find that we have the peace needed to ask God for forgiveness and strength. However, this cannot happen unless we truly take ownership of the failures again not to put us down but to realize how great God is?
5. **Freedom** - Contrary to what we might think, freedom is not the ability to do as we please. Rather, freedom is the ability to be the best disciple we can be to the point where it becomes second nature to us. We need to converse with God in regard to the ways He is shaping us to be the best disciple we can be.
6. **Others** - It is only after we take the first five steps in the prayer process that we should make our list of petitions known to God. If our prayer is simply focused on rattling off our list of wants or needs, our prayer will end up feeling dry.
7. **Finish** - At the end of this process, pray an Our Father. It is the Lord's Prayer after all.



# THE STUMP OF JESSE

## MY MOTHER'S LIFE AND PASSING

My mom and dad raised 11 children. Throughout her life Mom practiced her faith and demonstrated it in her simple words and actions. During development years with Mom she led us to



Mass on Sundays and prayers before dinner and bedtime. This was common in the 1960's, but she was also a mother who treated her children with respect. She was determined to never yell down the street for us to come home for a meal or because it was getting dark. Also, she never yelled at us when we did something wrong. She was very good at bringing up the issue, listening to our side of the story, setting up the teaching moment, and of course the disciplinary action to go along with the offense. For example, when we fought with each other in our early years, we (usually the girls) were told to go up to our room, where there were no toys, TV or other distractions. She said to the offenders, "You sit here, you sit there, look at each other, and don't come downstairs until your figure out how to get along." After a few minutes we would collaborate to figure if enough time had passed to go downstairs. Physical fighting (usually the boys) would result in "Take it outside," no matter what the weather, but you could come in quicker when it was cold. In addition weren't allowed to pout. If we were upset we could cry it out, but if we stayed sad, the instruction was "Enough pouting, now go and play." She was positive in her life and expected the same in us. As a teenager and adult, if I told her of an issue at work or school, she would listen and simply tell me to pray to the Holy Spirit to guide my words or actions. In her later years I took my turn "driving Miss Daisy" to hair appointments, the grocery store, and bridge games. She always thanked me and reminded me that I'm earning good graces with each task. God was a part of her daily life!

At age 93, Mom had a fall, was in the hospital for nearly a week, in rehab for 2 weeks with Covid lockdown, and finally was on hospice at home. All of her children managed to come in to be with her one last time. During her final 5 days she slept a lot, was miserable at times, or was alert. Mom made a few of her alert times very special. One time she awoke and So we prayed the rosary. Another time one of my

siblings mentioned our long car rides on camping vacations and how we sang in the car. That started Mom singing while laying in hospice and leading all of us in some of the old songs for a while until she tired. At another alert time Mom told us, "I'm just so happy you're all together and that you know that I love you the most that anybody could love their children. Dad and I were so proud of each and every one. No matter what you did, you wanted to do it, and we gave you a little push to make sure what you had in your heart, and you did it all. You did everything that God let you do." (*Philippians 2:13 "For God is at work in you, both to will and to work for his good pleasure."*)

We were blessed to have her with us until she was 93 and extra blessed to be able to enjoy moments of her final days in prayer, chatting and singing. She said she looked forward to joining my Dad, her parents and brothers, and her friends. I have great faith that she is doing just that.

Of course each person that loses a loved one has to endure different circumstances and responds to the changes differently. For me, I shed tears when Mom was in the hospital and rehab due to her suffering, but I did not cry at her passing which sounds weird. I do miss her but I couldn't help being happy at her passing, knowing of her joy connecting with God and her loved ones. My feeling of her joy is based on a spiritual experience I will share here. Recently I was attending a funeral Mass for a friend's father and walked up to receive communion as usual. As I passed his casket I said goodbye and told him in thought that I would miss his mischievous smile and the sparkle in his eyes. I also told him he was surely with his wife again now and pictured them hugging. Then I corrected myself, thinking no, your bodies are not together yet but your spirits are, and pictured their spirits "hugging." At that moment and for about six seconds a feeling of overwhelming joy starting at my head, moved downward. It was a feeling of joy that I have never felt in my life. At that moment I thought this must be how it is when you meet in heaven. This is why I could only be happy at my mother's passing.





Also, keep track of the date and time you tried to use the card. Save the receipt to prove you did not get credit for using the card. Most businesses can search their register records so any information you can provide will make it easier for us to correct the problem quickly.

### Introducing CJB Virtual Winter Games

With Covid-19 restrictions, we have started to think outside the box on continuing to raise funds to benefit the school. The CJB Development Committee has started a new virtual fundraiser via Facebook and your family and friends can join in the fun too!

# HUMAN CONCERNS

## CARE FOR CREATION FOR LENT

Why not use this Lent to make your lifestyle greener, to shrink your carbon footprint? Or, use it to focus on improving your well-being and health in other ways, such as a digital detox or creating a fixed morning routine? Below is a list of ideas for observing an alternative kind of Lent....besides prayer of course!

1. **Go vegetarian or vegan**— This may seem easy-peasy to those who avoid animal products all the time, but for people who are in the transition phase - learning about the environmental effects - Lent might be the perfect time to dive into meat-free eating.
2. **Go zero-waste or plastic-free**— See how little garbage (including recycling!) you can generate between now and Easter. If that's too much, focus simply on eliminating plastic as much as possible. Pledge to take your own coffee cup to work each day.
3. **Reduce food waste**— Strive to use all the food you buy before any goes bad. Try to cook through the contents of your pantry and freezer, places where food items often get forgotten.
4. **Cook from scratch for all of Lent**— See if you can make all your meals at home until Easter. Not only will you cut down on food waste, but you'll probably save some money while you're at it.
5. **Try the 100-mile diet**— For Lent, source only ingredients that come from within a 100-mile radius of your home. An added challenge is expanding that criterion to your clothes, household accessories, etc.
6. **Fast from excess water use**— Pay close attention to your water footprint and try to eliminate it as much as possible through conservation, collecting rainwater, and reusing grey water.
7. **Try a buy-nothing challenge**— Become a conscious consumer, asking yourself, "Do I really need this?" Finance guru Cait Flanders has written the Ultimate Shopping Ban Guide.
8. **Be a minimalist**— Purge your house and get rid of excess clutter, either by playing the Minimalism Game or doing the 40 bags in 40 days challenge.
9. **Change your mode of transportation**— Instead of jumping in the car to go to work, allocate time each day for walking, biking, rollerblading, or carpooling.
10. **Establish a strong morning routine**— There's something wonderfully satisfying and efficient about having a predictable morning routine. Be strict with yourself for 40 days and see how much easier it is to maintain after Easter.
11. **Do a digital detox**— Set strict parameters for use of personal devices, i.e. phone off during the workday or during evenings when you're with family, no TV except on weekends, checking email and social media at designated times each day, etc.


