FROM OUR PASTOR

Happy Father's Day!!!

To everyone who is a father, grandfather, godfather, or have been a father figure to anyone, may you continue to feel God's blessings in your life through your families. To those single mothers who may have had to be

both mother and father to your children, may you also know the peace and love of God through the gift that you have given your family.

In the baptism rite of the Catholic Church, a blessing is given to the father of the child who was baptized. In the prayer of blessing, we address God as the giver of all life human and divine. This acknowledges the truth that God is the real author of the human life that received baptism. It also confirms the fact that God's divinity is the only one that we recognize and affirm as Christian disciples. The prayer of blessing over the father included in the rite of baptism implies the undeniable truth that God's fatherhood must always be reflected in human fatherhood. If that is the case, then what are we to understand about God and human fathers?

For one, we address God as Father. We do so first of all because that is what Jesus himself did. Jesus addressed God as "abba" which was how children of his time addressed their own fathers. It was a familiar title similar to how we might use the word "daddy" in contemporary time. When using that word "abba," Jesus implies that there is a personal, deep, and intimate relationship between God and his children. In other words, God does not stand as a "distant father" who has no interest or involvement with His children. On the contrary, God is very much involved in the lives of His children. God very much desires to be in close relationship with His children.

Furthermore, we address God as Father because God is the author of all life—both human and divine. Biologically speaking, life comes from the father. A woman cannot create life in her womb on her own. She needs a male partner to place the seed of life in her. Except in the case of the Virgin Mary, of course, there is no virgin birth for anyone. New life in a

mother's womb is only possible when both the father and mother are involved. But, nonetheless, the father is very much important and plays a crucial role. Without the father, new life cannot be conceived in the mother's womb.

In both of these aspects, we understand the Fatherhood of God and what human fatherhood must also be. If God seeks a very personal and close relationship with His children, then human fathers must also do the same with their earthly children. There ought not to be any such thing as a "deadbeat dad" or "distant father." A father's role is to have a very central part to play in the life of his children. He cannot leave it all to the mother. The father has a role that he must embrace wholeheartedly. This was true even in Jesus' time.

In the day and culture of Jesus as it still is in the homes of our Jewish brothers and sisters to this day, it is actually the father who has a more active role in the religious formation of the children. The mothers have an essential part to play as well, of course. But, when it comes to the education and formation of the children—most especially the sons—into religious and good human beings, that is the responsibility of the father. No matter how we might look at it, the culture from which Jesus came teaches that fathers must have an active part to play in the lives of the children. Again, if God desires a close and intimate relationship with His children, earthly fathers are to imitate God in the very same way. Human fathers cannot afford to be distant from their children. Their health and wellbeing depend on the father taking very seriously his role.

Also, if the Fatherhood of God is the source of life—human and divine—and human life is not possible without the father's active role, then it stands to reason that earthly fathers must reflect God in being a source of life for their children. The father does not only have the essential role of planting the seed of life in the mother's womb. He also has the part of helping to raise the children that they also might have life and have it to the fullest.

Anything that destroys life or takes it away must never be a part of the ministry of earthly fatherhood because God is only about bringing life to His

children and giving them life to the fullest. For this very reason, earthly fathers ought not be abusive in words or actions. We know that such an approach robs children of the fullness of life. Fathers ought not do anything that might destroy the self-esteem of their children. It is not in God's nature to be that way so neither should it be in the nature of any human father to act in that way.

To repeat something I already pointed out, a father's role in the lives of his children is not to be distant, uninvolved, or disinterested. God made it a point to restore the broken relationship between humanity and Him precisely so that God might have a close relationship with His children. God did not abandon His children but gave his own life for their sake. So should it be with a human father and his own children. God's will is that His children might have life and have it to the fullest. This ought to be the goal and aim of every human father.

On this Father's Day weekend, let us pray once again for all those who have the role of a father. It is a special vocation to be a father and one that oftentimes has a good amount of challenges. For those fathers who are trying the best they can to model the life of God our Father, may the Lord who has begun the good work in you bring it to fulfillment. For those fathers who struggle in making a committed effort to be a part of their children's lives, may God give you the strength you need. For those fathers who neglect their duties in the lives of their children, may God's Fatherhood inspire you to a strive for the higher goal.

ST. JULIE BILLIART PARISH HAS REOPENED

Fr. Tirso and the parish staff are happy to announce these preliminary steps in the process of full reopening, and will continue to take the steps necessary to apply the relaxation of restrictions to all parish activities. Please watch your email, our parish website (www.stjulie.org) and our parish Facebook page for updated information.

Here are the details from the **Archdiocese of Chicago** regarding welcome changes to the safety protocols that have been in place for more than a year now. As we more fully reopen, parishioners and visitors to St. Julie may be assured that we will continue to encourage practical precautions to keep everyone safe.

Protocol changes include the following:

Capacity - All capacity restrictions are lifted. We are free to resume 100% capacity for Masses and other events.

Registration - No longer required!

Hand Sanitizer - Will continue to be available and will continue to be encouraged to keep using it.

Masks - Those who are fully vaccinated no longer need to wear a mask, but we will be respectful of those who may want to continue wearing one. We will not be requiring proof of vaccination; however, public health authorities recommend that those who are unvaccinated continue to wear a mask indoors, particularly in crowded venues.

Physical Distancing - Congregants are able to sit in any pew. Physical distancing is no longer required, but is recommended by public health authorities for those who are unvaccinated. Seating in Sections 1 North and 1 South (east side, both by the choir) will still have the blue tape and be designated every other pew seating for those who would like the option of safety distance in Mass. We will reassess the need for this each month.

Congregational Singing - May resume immediately!

9:30am Sunday Mass livestream will continue - Those not feeling well will be asked to stay at home to participate with the livestream.

Mass Dispensation - Dispensation from attendance at Sunday Mass is still in effect for the Archdiocese of Chicago for those who are unable to attend in person.

God has given me the grace to recognize that the big obstacle to my acquiring a peaceful and fruitful interior life is my natural activity, and my tendency to be carried away by my work. And I have recognized, besides, that this lack of interior life is the

source of all my faults, all my troubles, my dryness, my fits of disgust, and my bad health."

Then, the author gave two suggestions to himself and I think we can benefit learning from him.



- (1) I will always take more time than is necessary, to do everything. This is the way to avoid being in a hurry and getting excited.
- (2) Since I invariably have more things to do than time in which to do them, and this prospect preoccupies me and gets me worked up, I will cease to think about all that I have to do, and only consider the time I have at my disposal. I will make use of that time, without losing a moment of it, beginning with the most important duties; and as regards those that may or may not get done, I shall not worry about them.

As the state is fully re-opening its activities, I hope and pray that we are not overwhelming ourselves with activities and forgetting to pay attention to our interior desire, our main focus in life – to give God's praise and thanks for the marvelous works that He has done in our lives. And where/what is a perfect place/thing to praise God and giving thanks? It is the Mass.

FAMILY FAITH SHARING

Today's Gospel describes the end of a day of teaching in Jesus' ministry. He calms the storm and admonishes the disciples for their lack of Faith. Jesus taught the crowd in parables and then offered explanations of these parables to His followers. As is typical in Mark's Gospel, Jesus' disciples are frightened by the sudden storm.

This Gospel can be a metaphor for our lives. We are in a boat, the storms of life are raging around us and, like the disciples, we may believe that

Jesus is unconcerned because he is sleeping peacefully. When we bring our worries to God in prayer, we might just begin to see things from God's perspective. Worries and concerns are part of human life and Jesus teaches us that we ought not let worries consume us. Our faith teaches us that we should try to trust in God's protection and love, no matter how strong the whirlwind going on around us. When you gather as a family, talk about the importance of sharing our concerns and praying through them.


