

FROM OUR PASTOR

Just in case you missed it in this past week's Midweek Moment, I wanted to also share the information in the bulletin.

Several months ago, I shared instructions given to me by the Archdiocese requiring me to make another series of changes with the staff. As a result of the

challenges with the pandemic, that has greatly affected our already difficult financial situation, I was told that a reduction in staff and/or hours would be needed before the end of the current fiscal year which would be June 30. For several months now I had been considering what changes might be needed.

In consulting with the Parish Council, one message came through loud and clear in the advice from the Council members. Everyone on the Parish Council understands very well the financial challenges facing the parish. However, despite the clear challenges, none of the members wanted to see the priests of the parish so overburdened by added responsibilities that we would not be able to fulfill our primary roles as those chosen to shepherd the community. I took this advice into deep consideration.

Then, as the State of Illinois recently reached Phase 4 of the pandemic reopening, that meant that more people could attend Mass in person as well as other parish activities. When that announcement was made, I almost immediately received numerous questions about resuming Bingo, Young At Heart, the picnic, and any number of other ministry activities. Shortly after Phase 4 began, it became clear that there was a good amount of excitement and we were "getting back to normal."

It was only a matter of time before we would reach Phase 5—the complete reopening of the state and lifting of virtually all of the restrictions. Of course, we now know that Phase 5 began just a little over a week ago. I have already seen a good amount of parishioners coming back to the parish, as well as the growing excitement of resuming more parish activities/ministries began to get stronger.

Even at the start of Phase 4 and the recent announcement of Phase 5, I began to see that if I

made changes to the staff now, it would leave me in a bit of a conundrum. Namely, what dawned on me was that I really had no idea of what normal life is like here at the parish. Usually during the first year as a pastor of a new community a pastor spends time getting to know the rhythm of the parish. This is a crucial time because it allows a new pastor the opportunity to meet parishioners as well as get a feel for the parish life. This helps a pastor with the ability to make better decisions as to what direction the parish might need to go.

I have been here for about a year, but I arrived in the middle of the pandemic when parish life remained virtually at a standstill. In reality, it will only be in my second year as pastor of this parish when I will finally begin to meet more and more parishioners as well as get a feel for what normal life might be like here.

In considering the Archdiocesan mandate to make staff changes for the end of the current fiscal year, I began to be greatly concerned that I would compromise myself if I did not have adequate staff as we entered into Phase 5. I was concerned that a good amount of burden would be added onto my shoulders. The words of the Parish Council members began to repeat themselves in my ear.

So, I asked our Business Manager to do some number crunching for me. In the end, I discovered that even with maintaining the current staff as it is and adding a few more fundraising efforts for the next fiscal year, I would manage to have a budget proposal that created a small but positive cash flow. This means that the parish would still be able make all of our financial commitment. But, with the very small positive cash flow, it would mean that the next fiscal year would involve a good amount of risk especially if there were to be any unexpected expenses to arise. Knowing the risks, I still felt that this route was the better pastoral direction to take. I presented this all to the Archdiocese a couple of weeks before I left for vacation. While on vacation still, I received word that the parish budget has been approved with my proposal. I know that parishioners might consider this to be great news. However, I must make it clear that the parish is not "out of the woods." All this has accomplished was to buy us a little more time. The financial situation of the parish still has not changed.

It will still be necessary for me to create a larger savings in the area of salaries and benefits all the while finding ways to decrease expenses. In short, I only managed to delay any needed changes in staff until July 2022. It will only be then when I am hoping that we can collectively breathe a sigh of relief.

Again, this decision presents a good amount of risks. But, I just felt that it would add to an already difficult task of reopening if I ended up with an inadequate staff situation. Given the fact that the current staff knows our parish life better than I do, pastorally it seemed to be of greater benefit to maintain things as they are for the current moment. One more time, I emphasize that I will still be faced with a major decision that will need to be made before the end of the coming Fiscal Year which ends June 30, 2022.

This will require me to come up with a plan during the next six months or so to be prepared for whatever changes might be needed. At this time, I continue to ask parishioners to keep praying that the Holy Spirit will enlighten me in this endeavor.

On a different note, I wanted to share an update on the 159th Entrance Beautification Project. I requested an estimate from our current landscaper. However, they're so backlogged that they could not get me an estimate right away, but assured me that an estimate will be coming soon. In the meantime, I also requested our Facilities Engineer to begin exploring options if we were to do the project ourselves. I'm hopeful the project will be done soon!





Gospel

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Mark

When Jesus had crossed again in the boat to the other side, a large crowd gathered around him, and he stayed close to the sea. One of the synagogue officials, named Jairus, came forward. Seeing him he fell at his feet and pleaded earnestly with him, saying, "My daughter is at the point of death. Please, come lay your hands on her that she may get well and live." He went off with him, and a large crowd followed him and pressed upon him. There was a woman afflicted with hemorrhages for twelve years. She had suffered greatly at the hands of many doctors and had spent all that she had. Yet she was not helped but only grew worse. She had heard about Jesus and came up behind him in the crowd and touched his cloak. She said, "If I but touch his clothes, I shall be cured." Immediately her flow of blood dried up. She felt in her body that she was healed of her affliction. Jesus, aware at once that power had gone out from him, turned around in the crowd and asked, "Who has touched my clothes?" But his disciples said to Jesus, "You see how the crowd is pressing upon you, and yet you ask, 'Who touched me?'" And he looked around to see who had done it. The woman, realizing what had happened to her, approached in fear and trembling. She fell down before Jesus and told him the whole truth. He said to her, "Daughter, your faith has saved you. Go in peace and be cured of your affliction." While he was still speaking, people from the synagogue official's house arrived and said, "Your daughter has died; why trouble the teacher any longer?" Disregarding the message that was reported, Jesus said to the synagogue official, "Do not be afraid; just have faith." He did not allow anyone to accompany him inside except Peter, James, and John, the brother of James. When they arrived at the house of the synagogue official, he caught sight of a commotion, people weeping and wailing loudly. So he went in and said to them, "Why this commotion and weeping? The child is not dead but asleep." And they ridiculed him. Then he put them all out. He took along the child's father and mother and those who were with him and entered the room where the child was. He took the child by the hand and said to her, "*Talitha koum*," which means, "Little girl, I say to you, arise!" The girl, a child of twelve, arose immediately and walked around. At that they were utterly astounded. He gave strict orders that no one should know this and said that she should be given something to eat.

FAMILY FAITH SHARING

Today's Gospel (*Mark 5:21-43*) reports two stories of healing. One story tells about a father's great love for his dying daughter. The other story tells us about a desperate woman who risks much as she seeks healing from Jesus. In our prayers, we intercede for other's needs, and we also courageously express our own needs to God. Talk about the similarities and differences between the two people who presented their needs to Jesus in this Gospel. Notice that both people received the healing they sought from Jesus. We want to pray for our own needs and the needs of others with as much faith and hope as Jairus and the woman with hemorrhage did. Pray together in thanks and praise to God who hears our needs and responds to them. Caring for the sick is an important way that we follow Jesus' example. With faith in Jesus' power to heal, we pray for those who are sick in mind, soul, and body and for all those who care for them.

Also, fresh foods require significantly less energy than frozen foods (but watch out for spoilage which contributes to food waste!). Organics benefit the environment by not relying on synthetic pesticides or fertilizers which can contaminate soil and water. Other benefits of fresh, local and organic can be healthier foods with better taste. Farmers markets and Community Supported Agriculture (CSAs) are both great ways to support a local food system.


