

FROM OUR PASTOR

Wow! Can you believe that I have been here at the parish a full year? As the saying goes, time flies when you are having fun.

This has been a very interesting year. I mean that because of the pandemic, I really could not spend my first year here getting

to know the rhythm of parish life. It is usually recommended that pastors not make too many major changes in their first year at a new assignment. Instead, the first six to twelve months are meant to learn and observe. Then, after getting a better feel for the parish a pastor can get a better sense of the needs and what direction he might want to take the parish. Unfortunately, I did not have that nor did any pastor that started a new assignment during the height of the pandemic shut down. Still, I have confidence that I have come to know several things about our parish.

For one, we have a welcoming atmosphere. I felt it right from the very start. A welcoming community is so crucial especially in this day and age. It has been said that people visiting a parish community for the first time will determine whether or not they will be a part of the parish based on the reception they experience as soon as they enter the doors of church.

We can experience it in all areas of life. Take, for example, the experience of walking into a restaurant. How long does it take for the greeter to acknowledge as we are waiting to be seated? Does that person have a smile on their face or give the impression that we are more of an inconvenience than anything else? Then, how long does it take for our waiter/server to tend to our needs? Likewise, what is the demeanor of the wait/serving staff? In short, are we made to feel welcomed or not? If not, no matter how good the food might have tasted, we more than likely will make the choice not to return to that particular establishment. The same is true with a parish community. The welcome that people experience even at the moment of walking through the doors greatly determines the desire to be a part of the parish or search elsewhere for a spiritual home. A lot of times, Catholics have had the reputation of just coming in to Mass to receive Jesus in Communion

and to get out as quickly as possible without interacting with anyone along the way.

Fortunately, I have learned very early on that our parish is not that way. People do come to receive Jesus in Communion since that is the primary reason why any of us come to Mass. But, we do seek interaction with one another. After all, how can we see Jesus' presence in the Eucharist if we cannot even see His presence in the people around us? I am very happy to see that in our community. In fact, I have not yet officially announced it yet, but our parish has recently been awarded the **2021 Best of Tinley Park Awards in the area of Places of Worship**. I received notification of this several weeks ago. I do not know how we got nominated or selected but I am confident that our welcoming atmosphere has a great deal to do with how we got that award.

As in all things, we are great at the welcoming but we always need to do more. We can only improve on what we are already doing. Creating a community that is welcoming and hospitable is all about building relationships. We all know attitudes and actions that do not help to build relationship – making judgments about others, refusal to let others into our lives, and an unwillingness to get to know people just to name a few. This is all our spiritual home where we are reminded that we are all part of one big family. We need to be a family in the best ways of what that means. Again, in my first year here even though we were in the grips of a pandemic for the big part of it, I am glad to be the pastor of a parish that already does this so well.

What I would like to see in this area is a new ministry developed. Namely, a Ministry of Hospitality would be a good addition to our community. It would formalize what we already do well. Our volunteers with the Reopening Team have already done such a great job with making everyone feel welcomed just as much as they can feel safe. This might be a good way to build on what we already have. I do want to take this opportunity to thank them for ALL they have done and hope that they will continue to model for all of us the spirit of hospitality and welcome.

In this past year, I have also been amazed at how generous parishioners have been. Generosity is not

expressed only in monetary terms but also in the desire to be a part of the life and mission of the parish. At times, I have found myself sharing ideas with parishioners and no sooner than I finish expressing my idea someone already comes forward telling me, "Father, I would like to get in on that." I can tell you that having come from experiences where parishioners were quick to share their ideas with me but just as quick to walk away without getting involved, the spirit here at St. Julie's has been a refreshing change.

God knows that we have many projects ahead of us. Our church roof continues to leak and be a nuisance whenever it rains. Our parking lot surface is badly in need of replacement. We still have financial issues that we need to get in balance. That, of course, is not to mention the need to fulfill our essential mandate to go and make disciples.

Still, as I mark the start of my second year here at the parish, I want to take this time to thank EVERY parishioner for being dedicated to your spiritual home and to our mission as part of the Catholic Church. It would be very difficult to be a pastor without a flock that is dedicated to fulfilling the common mission of continuing the work of Jesus. Likewise, it would be hard for a parish community to live the life of discipleship without a pastor to serve as guide. I simply ask that everyone pray that I might be a good guide that will help all of us find the way to Jesus and see God's good work be completed in each of us.

I hope we all enjoy this holiday weekend as we celebrate the independence for which so many people fought and died to bring us. Let us never forget as well our responsibility to one another to bring the best out of one another and be the best disciples of Jesus that we can be.

if I, who make it what it is,


am filled with these same things.







FAMILY FAITH SHARING

Today's Gospel (*Mark 6:1-6*), describes what many believe to have been the typical pattern of Jesus' ministry: teaching in the synagogue followed by acts of healing. In His hometown of Nazareth, the people are amazed at what they hear, but they also cannot understand how someone they know so well might move them so powerfully. In this Gospel, we learn some interesting details about Jesus and His early life.

Our family plays an important role in shaping and forming our self-identity. In family life, we find a safe place to discover who we are and who God calls us to be. When you gather as a family, talk about the people and events that are influencing members of your family. Point out that many of these people and events are positive influences helping us become better people and leading us to a deeper relationship with God. However, point out that there are negative influences out there who pull us away from God. Pray together that our families will help us to continue to follow God in our own lives.

2021—2022 REGISTRATION!

REOPENING UPDATES:

Communion Reception on the Tongue

Beginning the weekend of **July 10/11** we will be set up to offer Communion on the tongue for those who wish to receive this way. The priests and deacons will be the only sections that will offer both methods at this time. They will have a sanitation hand wipe with them to wipe their hands/fingers immediately after distributing by tongue. The process will be evaluated after a period of time and adjustments made if needed. Thank you for your continued patience as we provide the safest worship space for all. The priests and deacons will continue to minister to sections 3 and 4 and 5. If you would like to receive Holy Communion on the tongue, we ask that you sit in sections 3 or 4 or 5 on the North or South side of church.

The South side of the church is where the statue of St. Julie is located and the North side is where you will find the Holy Family statue. If you look at the choir, the first section on either side is #1, then counting going towards entrance...1-2-3-4-5. Depending on which side you sit, it will be 1 North, 2 North, 3 North, 4 North, 5 North, or 1 South, 2 South, 3 South, 4 South, 5 South. The smallest sections closest to the baptismal font/entrance are 5 North and 5 South.

Eucharistic Ministers

The addition of the 7:30am Sunday Mass to our schedule will open opportunities for our trained Eucharistic Ministers to return to active ministry. It also presents an invitation to those of you who would like to become a Eucharistic Minister. Marianne@stjulie.org can answer all of your questions!

Ushers

Fr. Tirso's goal is to keep ALL of our present ushers and invite back ushers who have not yet returned to ministry. There will be a short meeting after each Mass coming soon. Watch the bulletin and our website and the Midweek Moment for more details. Returning to the normal collection method is in the works after first meeting with ushers.




