FROM OUR PASTOR

In about a month's time, we will be celebrating our Parish Picnic which we have renamed as the Taste of St. Julie. Like the Taste of Chicago, the idea was to give parishioners not only an opportunity to come together but also to sample the goodness that is a part of our community.

Events such as these are good ways to strengthen the sense of community. That is the primary purpose of the Taste of St. Julie. It comes at an opportune time as well since we had to spend over a year with very minimal activity in the parish. I know that the pandemic is still not completely resolved but the Taste of St. Julie will be a way to fulfill a basic human need – interaction with other human beings that is real and personal rather than on a computer screen.

With that in mind, I again ask that we save the date of Saturday, August 21. The Taste will be from 12noon until 9pm. We will have food booths, live entertainment, games for both young and old. Most importantly, it will be a fun day to come together after such a long period of having to stay apart from one another.

Growing up, my family and I lived in the Albany Park neighborhood of Chicago. As you may remember, I attended the Chicago Public Schools for elementary and high school. One of the things I have always been grateful for was the fact that both in the neighborhood and the schools I attended, there was such a gift of diversity. I would walk down the street from our house and I would see all sorts of faces. There would be stores owned by people from various ethnic groups – Hispanic, Indian, Korean, Middle Eastern, and any other place you can imagine. The same would be true with the schools I attended. Among my classmates, there were children from immigrant families from China, Philippines, Vietnam, Middle East just to mention a few. Of course, there were also those who were born and raised in Chicago.

My point is that I learned to appreciate the differences in people because of that experience. Despite the differences, I always searched for what people may also have held in common. Whether it was a common

religion or even just similar cultural values, I grew up learning to appreciate and celebrate what makes each person unique. I came to recognize that those things are not hindrances but real gifts that, if we allow them, enrich and bless us in ways we may never have imagined.

I guess it was for that very reason that I never liked the image of a "Melting Pot." In a melting pot, it is implied that everything that makes an individual unique and special gets lost because they get blended into one thing. Those differences no longer become distinguishable. Yet, the uniqueness of each one is what truly becomes a celebration. For example, in cooking, a good chef will meticulously use different flavors in such a way that none of them get lost. Rather, a good chef will make sure that every spice, every flavor of a dish can still be detected complementing one another rather than fighting for attention. That is the image I prefer to use whenever we are talking about a community such as ours that is made up of people from all sorts of ethnic and cultural backgrounds. It is not our differences that divide us. Our differences can complement one another and make what is already good about us even better.

Speaking of food, it is actually one of the best ways to experience the gift of diversity. Again, growing up in such a diverse area of Chicago, I learned to appreciate the value of tasting food from all sorts of places all over the world. Yes, I have my "go to" cuisines but I still look forward to trying food from other ethnic backgrounds. In fact, whenever I go to a different country, I am not one of those who look for the familiar fast food chains so that I can feel like I am at home. The very reason why I visit a different country is precisely to experience the flavor that makes that place unique.

More importantly, whenever we are able to share food with one another, it becomes a valuable tool not only to build community but also to spread the Good News. Sharing a meal with strangers or even family and friends is a powerful way of sharing in one another's lives. It breaks down barriers and builds bridges. That is one of the points to the Taste of St. Julie and I hope that we all take advantage of this opportunity.


Of course, the Taste of St. Julie is not only about food. It is about sharing our gifts with one another. The entire event is being planned in such a way where our unique gifts and talents will bring us together. Our very own parishioners will be showing off some of their culinary skills. More parishioners will be providing the live entertainment. Young parishioners will lead the games for those younger than them. In short, the Taste of St. Julie will be an event to celebrate what makes each of us unique allowing those gifts to unite us rather than keep us apart.

Again, please save the date of Saturday, August 21. Primarily, the Taste of St. Julie will be a community building event. However, if we happen to be able to raise money for the parish because of the event, the parish will be all the better for it. This will be our first major event after the year long COVID period. On a different note, I would like to thank everyone who helped to make Totus Tuus a success. First, thank you to our missionaries for their energy, enthusiasm, and commitment to spreading the Good News of Jesus. Your generosity is also a mark of our combined effort and commitment to making our young generation into strong disciples. Finally, thank you to Fr. Ton who worked to put everything together.

As we know very well, our younger generation is truly the future of our Church and parish. It is incumbent upon us to help parents in their roles as first teachers of the faith. It takes a group effort to make disciples and I was happy to see so many people taking part in this worthwhile effort. Again, thank you to everyone who helped in any way with Totus Tuus!

LETTER FROM THE CARDINAL

ARCHDIOCESE OF CHICAGO



Dear Sisters and Brothers,

In Chicago, in the metro area, and even more widely across our nation, we face a profoundly painful moment in our life together. So many families are grieving the loss of loved ones to violence, and those loved ones include babies and small children. The grief is compounded by the senselessness of the loss. Fear accompanies many of us as we go about our daily lives. We are afraid of becoming a victim of gun violence, or a carjacking, or an assault. And we are afraid not only for ourselves but also for the people we care for.

As we recover from the pandemic and embrace a more familiar way of life, the comfort of normalcy we had hoped for is being spoiled by a menacing violence that threatens all of us.

Understandably, we want this horrifying situation resolved without delay. Government leaders and community activists have offered many ideas, for example: more effective policing, reforming the criminal justice system, stemming the flood of illegal guns, dismantling gangs, investment in historically disadvantaged neighborhoods, strengthening education and shoring up family life. I cannot claim special expertise in all these matters. But as a pastor, I can point to the underlying spiritual crisis that this violent and unstable situation has provoked.

When violence prompts grief, fear, and a loss of hope, as it always does, people feel alienated from one another. On one level, the fractures appear to be along the lines of race, ethnicity, economic class, and political affiliation. But it runs much deeper than that. We seem unable or unwilling to comprehend that we are inextricably connected with each other. Yet we truly are *Fratelli Tutti*, as Pope Francis put it — all brothers and sisters to each other. If we lose that sense of interconnectedness, we also lose our sense of compassion, empathy and responsibility for each other. And that counts as an incalculable spiritual loss, with profound consequences for how we live together as neighbors, as members of the same human family. In this light, I recall the prophetic words of Dr. Martin Luther King in 1964: “We must learn to live together as brothers [and sisters] or perish together as fools.” (St. Louis, March 22, 1964)

The challenge, especially for believers, rests at the very center of the Church’s identity. At the beginning of the Second Vatican Council’s Constitution on the Church, we see powerful and defining words: the Church is in the manner of a sacrament, that is, an effective sign of the unity of all humanity in God. If we, the people of God, are to remain faithful to our identity and our calling, we must respond to the challenge to human solidarity that violence has provoked. At the same time, we can legitimately ask ourselves: What can we do? What difference can we make? How can we bridge the divides that separate us?

Faith does not give us ready-made solutions to complex problems. Faith does give us hope that with God's help we can move forward, and that we ought to move forward as best as we can. With that in mind, I want to propose to Catholics and to all people of good will five steps that we can take:

Ask questions: Explore our experience and seek understanding, but in asking questions, also be prepared to authentically listen, even when what we are hearing proves painful.

Dialogue: Seek honest exchanges with people of different backgrounds. No one person or group has all the answers, and when we speak with and listen to those who have experiences and expertise that differs from our own, we begin to move toward understanding. We cultivate empathy.

Pray: Ask for enlightenment, place struggling people in God's hands, and imagine Jesus walking with us, because he is.

Follow the prompts: If we truly open ourselves to God and to each other, and if we remain attentive, we will begin to identify where God is leading us. This is discernment.

Stay connected: The great temptation during a time of crisis is to retreat to what we consider a safe space. In fact, what we most need is to go out of our comfort zones and accompany one another, even when that calls for effort and even some risk.

For people of faith, no matter the severity of the crisis, the last word is trust in God. The stirring words of Psalm 91 have consoled me and strengthened my resolve these days:

He who dwells in the shelter of the Most High and abides in the shade of the Almighty says to the Lord: "My refuge, my stronghold, my God in whom I trust."

It is he who will free you from the snare of the fowler who seeks to destroy you; he will conceal you with his pinions and under his wings you will find refuge.

You will not fear the terror of the night nor the arrow that flies by day, nor the plague that prowls in the darkness nor the scourge that lays waste at noon.

A thousand may fall at your side, ten thousand fall at your right, you, it will never approach; his faithfulness is buckler and shield.

And finally, in the words of Pope Paul VI: "If you want peace, work for justice." God bless you and your loved ones and keep you safe.

FAMILY FAITH SHARING

In John's Gospel, (John 6:1-15), Jesus' multiplication of the loaves and fishes is presented as a sign of His authority and divinity. This miracle reminds us that Jesus feeds and nourishes us, caring for our physical needs as well as our spiritual ones. In the Eucharist, we are transformed and sent to the poorest among us, so much so that very often this Gospel is sometimes called the "gospel of hope." When we offer all of our efforts to God, we ask God to transform them so they will be more than necessary for the tasks and needs before us. As your family gathers, talk about the things your family needs, starting with the basics ...food, shelter, safety and so on. Continue to name other family needs: time together, cooperation, patience, and love. Talk about how Jesus provided plenty of food for the crowd with just five loaves and two fish. We pray that Jesus will also take what we have and make it enough to take care of all our needs. It is a great practice to pray the Morning Offering, asking God to bless and make fruitful the work of each of our days.


TRUCK STOP MINISTRY

Reduce car idling to save money and reduce pollution.

Unnecessary vehicle idling wastes six billion gallons of fuel per year, contributing to smog and air pollution according to the US Dept. of Energy. These emissions make air unhealthy, especially for children and elderly people, and increase the likelihood of global warming.

Except in traffic, turn the engine off if you'll be static for more than 10 seconds, especially while running an errand, waiting for someone, or at a long stop like a railroad crossing. With modern engines, idling is actually harder on your engine than shutting it off. Even in the winter don't idle a cold engine for more than 30 seconds because engines warm up better by being driven gently.




