

FROM OUR PASTOR

It is just around the corner! The first ever Taste of St. Julie which will be this coming Saturday, August 21. Fr. Ton and I hope to see as many parishioners there as possible.

Several months ago when many of the COVID restrictions were eased, Fr. Ton and I wanted to have an event that could bring the parish together for some fun. When the Archdiocese allowed for more parish events, a parish picnic like St. Julie used to have in years past seemed only natural!

A committee was formed and plans developed from being a parish picnic to a Taste of St. Julie. It became even more exciting to have such an event. I am so grateful for the work of the committee and all the volunteers in putting everything together especially in a time when things seem to be going back and forth with restrictions.

When plans got started, we wanted an opportunity for parishioners to gather together for a fun event. We have all been through a rough year so a little fun was in order. It was not necessary that it become a fundraiser. If any expenses were incurred, it would be good just to break even. But if we were able to make some money for the parish, then great!

Even now, there may be some who are apprehensive of coming to a gathering of this nature especially with the updated guidelines. But, our cleaning volunteers already know how to handle many of the restrictions so, if need be, adjusting the plans would be easy enough. Let us just pray that the plans will not be affected too much in the weeks to come.

For those who are comfortable to gather for this event, Fr. Ton and I welcome the opportunity to see you. For those who are uncertain, you can still join us in spirit. There will be plenty of time and opportunity to get together to have fun soon. During the Taste, we strongly encourage parishioners and guests to observe current guidelines and precautions. But, either way, the Taste will be a parish event to enjoy a day of fun. Again, whether or not you are able to make it to the Taste please pray that it will be a

successful event full of fun and camaraderie and a lot of different and delicious foods to taste!

On a different note, I wanted to take this moment to draw peoples' attention to the newly planted gardens on the north side of church. In particular, there are now rose bushes planted at the base of the bell tower as well as new flowers in the northeast corner of the church façade. These were made possible by two separate donations.

The garden at the base of the bell tower was a donation by a family to honor their deceased loved ones who had a special connection to one of the bells that we have in the bell tower. You can read a brief history of the bells that is written on a memorial plaque near the sidewalk that leads to the north doors of church. On the plaque is also written the names for whom the rose bushes were donated as a memorial.

At about the same time as a parishioner approached me about a memorial garden at the base of the bell tower, another parishioner came to me wanting to make another donation. I mentioned the northeast garden to this second parishioner who simply responded that the donation is to be used at my discretion. I requested an estimate from the same landscaper who was contracted out for the bell tower garden. Since the northeast garden was within the donation amount (with some leftover), I decided to have both areas beautified at the same time. With the leftover amount, we were able to use it to pay some parish bills.

I have not forgotten about the 159th entrance project. With the help of some parishioners, we were able to clean up the area at the base of the tree that is along the entry/exit on 159th. But, we ran into a little snag in the plan. We were hoping to keep the cost down by trying to do as much of the work ourselves but other needs around the campus keep cropping up and it has required a bit more priority in terms of time and attention. Fortunately, another family has come forward with the possibility of adding to that project since the family also wanted a way to remember their loved ones. We'll be exploring possibilities on how to get that project back on track.

Since we're on the subject of projects, I'd like to share that I have been looking into ways we can utilize the

funds that we have collected from the “To Teach Who Christ Is” campaign. As it turns out, we still have a significant amount in that fund. Rather than having all that money sit there, we’re looking into other parish needs that can be addressed by using the TTWCI funds. With that in mind, there are two items in particular.

First, a couple of years ago, the parish had looked into the possibility of installing a large electronic sign along 159th. As I understand, an electronic sign was part of the case statement when the TTWCI campaign began. If we are able to install a sign of significant size along 159th Street, it would not only serve to bring more attention to the parish but also serve as a valuable tool for evangelization and communication. At this point, we are waiting for estimates.

Second, we are looking into possible improvements to the Devine Center. There are so many things that either need to be repaired or updated. The Devine Center is an integral part of our efforts of catechesis, evangelization, and parish life. Addressing some of those needs is important. Our Facilities Engineer is beginning to make a list of needed repairs so that we can get estimates.

Let me end by stating that good things are happening at our parish and there is more to come. In God’s time and with His grace to guide our efforts, we will be able to see all of those come to fruition. As they happen, let it serve as a reminder to share the news that God continues to bring good things into the lives of all people.

ARCHDIOCESE OF CHICAGO



This message is going to all clergy, employees, volunteers and members of the Archdiocese of Chicago community.

We are grateful for the heroic work done these past months by our clergy, school staff and other employees to keep our places of worship, education and work safe for all we serve. As we continue to monitor guidance of public health authorities and respect the input of our employees and school families, we must remain flexible in our policies. Only by doing so can we maintain safety so all feel protected in our facilities.

The rise in the number of COVID-19 cases and hospitalizations attributable to the highly transmissible delta variant understandably has caused a shift in the guidance of public health authorities.

Cook and Lake Counties and the City of Chicago have reached the threshold for “Substantial Transmission” of the virus. **Therefore, the Counties’ and Chicago’s Departments of Public Health, consistent with IDPH and the CDC have issued guidelines strongly recommending that all persons, vaccinated or unvaccinated mask in all indoor public spaces.**

We will follow this new guidance. Beginning now, it is strongly recommended that all persons entering Archdiocesan facilities be masked regardless of their vaccination status. This applies to parish offices, schools, churches and other public spaces. Observance of this policy aligns us with public health officials layered mitigation strategies. Further guidance on mask usage during liturgies will be forthcoming for clergy and lay ministers. We will release student and staff mask guidelines for the beginning of the 2021-2022 school year shortly.

We will continue to monitor the situation and will reevaluate our policy if conditions and public health guidance warrants it. **It is our hope and our prayer that measures taken now and scrupulously applied will enable us to adopt a mask-optional policy for vaccinated persons in the future.**

Certainly we are disappointed and saddened that infection and serious illness rates have again surged. We must do our part to bring the pandemic under control and the suffering to an end. This is both our civic and Christian duty. **Thank you for all you have done and continue to do to keep each other and the people we serve safe and well.**
