FROM OUR PASTOR

Happy Birthday to the Virgin Mary!

This Wednesday, September 8th, is the feast day of the Birth of the Virgin Mary. Obviously, there is no mention of the birth of Mary anywhere in Sacred Scripture. So, how did this celebration

originate? It is connected to the Eastern Church. The Church in the East begins a new liturgical year in September. The feast of the Virgin Mary's birth marks the start of a new liturgical year for the Eastern Churches.

When September 8th was designated as the Virgin Mary's birthday, the Catholic Church was able to determine the date of the Immaculate Conception. Nine months prior to September 8th would be December 8th which then was designated as the date for the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception.

The Immaculate Conception is the dogma that teaches us that, at the moment she was conceived, Mary was preserved from the effects of Original Sin – the sin of Adam and Eve – which made human beings prone to rebelling against God. This does not mean that Mary was without free will. On the contrary, it is a reminder that the Virgin Mary was full of grace which allowed her to have the strength and courage to say “yes” to God despite not fully understanding all the implications of what God was asking of her. But, Mary, like all other human beings, was not simply a “puppet” in a divine game. December 8th celebrates the moment when the Virgin Mary was conceived in the womb of her mother, St. Ann, and was preserved from the inclination to turn away from God.

If December 8th is the moment the Virgin Mary was conceived, then nine months later – September 8th would naturally be the day she would have been born. Of course, there is absolutely no way of being able to determine whether the Virgin Mary was actually born on that precise date or not. Chances are good that September 8th is not even the actual date of Mary's birth. But, in many aspects of our Catholic faith, we focus more on the message it brings rather than on the literal details.

Along with Jesus, the Church celebrates the birth of only two other New Testament figures. There is the Birth of St. John the Baptist on June 24th. Then, there is the coming feast of the Birth of the Virgin Mary which has been celebrated by the Church since at least the sixth century. But, why celebrate the birth of the Virgin Mary?

When we consider the announcement of any birth, it is usually a call for new hope in the world. Even when family members or friends announce the pregnancy, there is already a joyful anticipation, excitement and energy as preparations are made ready to welcome a new life into the world. This is perhaps why parties have become so popular nowadays where couples will announce the pending birth of a child or even host a “gender reveal.” Then, when the birth finally happens, the excitement and energy comes to a climax and the moment is marked with even more rejoicing. Again, the reason for all the enthusiasm is precisely because there is reason for hope as a new life enters the world. With each new life, there is hope that there is another person who might grow up to help make the world a better place.

Obviously, when we consider the birth of Jesus, the world truly became a better place because the promise of salvation was given to the whole of humankind. At the same time, when we consider the birth of the Virgin Mary, we have a similar joy because we know that it was through her that the promise of salvation entered into the world. So, if Jesus brought the fullness of salvation, we celebrate the Virgin Mary's birth because her birth marked the dawning of God's plan to redeem humankind.

We naturally celebrate the birth of Jesus with great joy. But, next to his birthday, we also ought to celebrate the birth of Mary with almost the same joy. The birth of Jesus is the ultimate cause of happiness in our hearts because Jesus is the fulfillment of God's Promise. However, we rejoice at the birth of Mary because through her was born the cause of our unending happiness. This September 8th, let us all take time to wish a happy birthday to our Blessed Mother.

Bingo News


On another note, I am looking for volunteers in a couple of areas. For one, we are still in need of

This means that I need some parishioners who would have the time to volunteer on a regular basis as well as the right personality to work the Front Desk.

As the first person people see when they come to the office or the first voice that greets them on the phone, those assigned to the Front Desk become the very face and voice of the parish. This is an important part to maintain that level of hospitality for which our parish is known. If you are interested in more details, you can speak either with me or Nancy in the office. Specifically, I would need people who can cover Wednesday mornings 8:30am-11:30 am. We may be able to work around people's availability. The more important thing is to add the number of volunteers who can work the Front Desk. Again, let me know if you are interested or need more information before deciding.






- **Adult Choir** meets on Tuesday nights beginning September 7 at 7pm in the Parish Hall.

CELEBRATE THE SEASON OF CREATION

The US Conference of Catholic Bishops reminds us that "we show our respect for the Creator by our stewardship of Creation." Pope Francis urges us to recognize our connectedness with the natural world saying, "Nature cannot be regarded as something separate from ourselves or as a mere setting in which we live. We are part of nature, included in it and thus in constant interaction with it." (LS 139). Advocating for Creation Care helps safeguard the inheritance the Creator has given us, ... an inheritance essential to our well-being. Pope Benedict XVI told us that protecting this inheritance is a way of fulfilling our role as stewards of Creation.


