

FROM OUR PASTOR

This week, the Church will celebrate the feast of Our Lady of the Most Holy Rosary on October 7th. For this reason, the month of October has been named the Month of the Holy Rosary.

Many of us grew up praying the Rosary on a daily basis most often as a family. I remember growing up that about 9pm every night was dedicated as the time for the family to come together to pray the Rosary. As children, we oftentimes dreaded the moment when our mother would call us to her bedroom to pray the Rosary. We looked at it as an interruption in our lives. Yet, no excuse was good enough. Even if we had a ton of homework still to do, my mother's response was always the same, "You won't be able to do well in anything unless you pray first." In the end, though, I entered into adulthood finding the Rosary an essential part of my daily prayer routine.

We may have come across various accounts of the historical development of the Rosary. One of them attributes the Rosary to St. Dominic who was gifted with a vision of the Virgin Mary who handed the Rosary to him with the instruction to spread the devotion. The use of beads, though, in prayer is even more ancient than the time of St. Dominic.

One account of the historical development of the Rosary connects it with the official prayer of the Church which is known as the Liturgy of the Hours. The Liturgy of the Hours – also known as the Divine Office – is a prayer with which the average Catholic may not be familiar. Priests, deacons, and those in religious life would know it well. Basically, the Liturgy of the Hours has been an ancient way to sanctify the entire day with seven different prayer times.

Our Jewish brothers and sisters have had a long tradition of praying at different times of the day. When the early Christians began to form, they began to incorporate those prayer customs. We see something similar as well with our Muslim brothers and sisters who stop and pray at specific times throughout a single day. The Liturgy of the Hours

has been a way to sanctify an entire day by turning hearts and minds to God.

Central to the Liturgy of the Hours is the use of the 150 Psalms found in the Old Testament. Found in these Psalms are every emotion that any human heart has felt at any time in history. There are psalms of peace and joy. There are psalms expressing gratitude. There are also psalms that express anger toward God when life gets to be difficult. There are psalms that express a deep prayer in those same difficult moments of life. The Liturgy of the Hours is structured so that all of the 150 Psalms are prayed at various times of the day and/or during a set period of weeks. Again, priests, deacons, and religious were obligated to pray the Psalms as part of their practice of the praying the Liturgy of the Hours.

As monasteries grew with both monks and sisters praying the Liturgy of the Hours, the average Catholic wanted to be able to pray in a similar way. However, as the average Catholic became more and more illiterate, it would have been impossible for the faithful to pray the psalms using a manuscript. Without the basic ability to read, the average Catholic did not have a way to pray the psalms. This is where the Rosary is said to have originated.

There is a theory that the Rosary was thought to have originated as a string of 150 beads that represented each of the 150 Psalms. However, since the average Catholic could not read but knew certain prayers by heart, the psalms were replaced by 150 Our Fathers. In time, the 150 beads were separated into decades of 10 beads upon which were prayed the Hail Mary with a bead separating each decade upon which was still prayed the Our Father. Eventually, the Glory Be was added to the prayers along with the Mysteries that we know to this day.

In the end, the Rosary was shortened to five decades with three sets of Mysteries assigned to different days. In more recent times during the time of Pope St. John Paul II, a fourth set of Mysteries was added to the Rosary. Again, to this day, the Rosary remains a very unique form of Catholic prayer.

In praying the Rosary, many people might think that the focus is on the words that are being prayed. But, the Rosary is a form of meditation. As a meditation,

the focus is not so much on paying attention to the words as it is on paying attention to the rhythm in which one prays. In other words, the rhythmic repetition of the prayers serve as a sort of mantra (a phrase repeated in succession). The rhythm has a calming effect on a person. When calm, a person can enter into an interior silence and, in that silence, come to be in the presence of God. When hearts are calm, the ear of faith can hear the voice of God more clearly since the distractions have been removed.


There was a time when every Catholic knew the Rosary and how to use it in prayer. Sadly, there are generations now who have little to no knowledge of the Rosary. For some, the Rosary ends up being something we hang on the rearview mirror of our vehicles as a kind of amulet of protection. In this month of the Holy Rosary, let us pray that families might reintroduce this prayer into their daily lives. With the Rosary, we may not be praying the 150 Psalms on each bead but it still remains a beautiful form of prayer. When we seek calm and peace, we can do what generations of Catholics have done before us and seek that serenity in the Rosary.

This month, on the weekends of our customary birthday and anniversary blessings, the parish's gift to those celebrants will be a Rosary. Those celebrants can either keep the gift for themselves or share it with someone who might need it. For anyone else who might want or need a Rosary for oneself or someone else, we should have plenty to give away.

For us as Catholics, the Rosary still remains a beautiful form of prayer and a powerful way we can help teach the faith to future generations. Meditating on the life of our Savior and our Blessed Mother not only can bring us comfort in our times of need but also be a witness to the great faith we profess.

May Mary, Queen of the Most Holy Rosary, pray for us and keep us faithful to the life of discipleship we are called to live.

In order to maintain a healthy relationship, it is important to prioritize. We have found that the happiest times in our marriage have been when we were successful in putting God first, each other second, followed by the children.

While we will always love, honor and respect our parents, as mandated Christ, once we made vows to each other, our new first loyalty must be our spouse. With that, while we love our children fiercely, we haven't made vows to them. Thus, the reason children are to be our third priority.

While two generations ago a divorce was rare, it is all too common today. Pick a partner wisely and then enter marriage with the mindset that calling it quits is not an option except in rare cases. There will be days when you'd be willing to sell the love of your life on the black market. Particularly in these moments we must choose to honor the commitment we've made.

FAMILY FAITH SHARING

In Mark's gospel (Mark 10:2-16), Jesus uses these private moments to teach His disciples in greater detail about the kingdom of God. The end of the Gospel seems disconnected from the previous teaching about divorce. When read together though, these pages present a picture of Jesus' strong emphasis on the importance of family and that God intended for men and women to be joined together in marriage. Among the purposes

of marriage is the raising of children so by welcoming children and fostering their relationship with God, parents and families bear witness to the Kingdom of God. At the end of today's gospel, the people were bringing their children to Jesus, and again, Jesus' disciples show that they just don't get it. Recall that in the gospel for each of the past two Sundays, Jesus has taught His disciples the value and importance of these little ones in the Kingdom of God. Yet, in today's gospel, the disciples try to prevent people from bringing their children to Jesus. Jesus reprimands His disciples and welcomes the children as an example of the kind of complete trust and dependence that God expects of all of us.

Pray together that God will help us keep our commitments to one another.
