FROM OUR PASTOR

One night a couple of weeks ago, the Parish Council and I started making phone calls again to all of our parishioners. We decided to repeat the phone call project that the parish had done at the start of the pandemic. Parishioners might recall that volunteers called to check up on them and to help

them stay connected to the parish. The Parish Council had advised me that a repeat of those phone calls could be important at this point in time. So, we started the round of calls.

Since then, I had the volunteers in the office continue making the phone calls. With almost 140 pages of names and phone numbers equaling to about 2,000 households, it is a long process but we are slowly making progress. Some of you may already have received phone calls from these dedicated volunteers.

The Parish Council and I meant these phone calls to be friendly calls from fellow parishioners just to say "hello." We wanted to let parishioners know that they were in everyone's thoughts and prayers especially at this time. We also asked if parishioners had any intentions for which they wanted prayers. That was and continues to be the purpose of the phone calls that we have been making to all of our parishioners.

For those who may not have received a phone call yet, please be patient as we have a long list of households to get through. If you are willing to volunteer and make phone calls on behalf of the parish, please let me know. To make the calls, it would be easier if volunteers made them from the parish office using the parish line. If your phone number has changed in the last year or so, please let the office know. We have also been discovering a significant number of phone numbers that are no longer in service or have been disconnected. We hope to help everyone feel connected to this parish that is your spiritual home.

When the Parish Council, the other volunteers, and I started making the phone calls, for the most part, the calls were well received. One person on the Parish Council made a call to someone who actually just

recently joined the parish. The comment this new parishioner made was something to the effect of "Wow! If this is going to be how my new parish will be, I am in the right place!"

Again, for the most part, everyone to whom we spoke was very grateful for the effort to reach out to them. There were even some who did not realize that the parish had resumed many of our activities and events. A few of those who volunteers spoke with expressed a little bit of guilt that they have not been back yet in person since the parish resumed in person Mass and activities. To those, we assured them that we did not call to make anyone feel guilty and that we will all be happy to see them back here at the parish whenever they felt comfortable to do so. All in all, it has been a good effort to reach out and connect with one another.

I have been meaning to mention this for a while but I kept forgetting. I wanted to take this opportunity to share with the parish some of the intentions for which parishioners had asked for prayers. This is only the "tip of the iceberg" as the saying goes. Since compiling this list, volunteers have made more phone calls so I am sure there are more prayers requested. But, I ask that we all keep these especially in our prayer. Out of respect for people's privacy, though, I intentionally have not used people's full names. Still, I am sure that those who requested these prayers will be greatly appreciative if we all bring them before God in some way.



In today's Gospel (Mark 12:28b-34), we hear that the greatest Commandment is to love God and our neighbor as ourself. Jesus is being questioned by a scribe about this. Interestingly, the scribe who addresses Jesus appears to be an admirer; he is not testing Jesus. Love of God finds its expression in our love for our neighbor. This connection was heard in a new and fresh way when spoken by Jesus. The Scribe engages in a positive dialogue with Jesus and agrees with Jesus' teaching that the two commandments to love God and neighbor stand above the rest. As followers of Jesus, our moral behavior is guided by the two part commandment taught by Jesus...love God and love your neighbor as yourself. Many of us have taken these words as a way to examine our conscience. Talk with your family about how you can serve others among your family members or in your Church community.

The Holy Fire Retreat will be held here at St. Julie Devine Center on Saturday, November 6 from 9am until 11:30am followed by Mass.




