

FROM OUR PASTOR

This Thursday, November 18, is the feast of the dedication of the Basilicas of St. Peter and St. Paul. These are two churches that are located in Rome.

First, the term “basilica” refers to a certain architectural style. These buildings oftentimes were first

used as a gathering place for civic or legal affairs. The building would be a rectangular shape. On one of the short ends would usually be a set of 3 doorways. Upon entering, there would be a large open space for people to congregate. On the opposite end from the entry, there would be a semicircular recessed area known as the apse. There would be seated the judge or whoever was presiding over the civic proceedings.



Basilica buildings were among the structures donated to the early Christian community after its legalization by the Emperor Constantine. They were then converted into worship spaces. This is the reason why so many churches throughout the world have been built in that style.

As the Church began to use the basilicas, the elements of the building began to be infused with Christian symbolism. For one, the 3 entryways into the building oftentimes represented the Blessed Trinity. In the apse was placed the altar representing the truth that Jesus was the one presiding over the assembly. In time, seats were added to the basilicas which would all face in the same direction. The seating all faced the same direction simply because the people’s attention was to be toward Jesus who was the right object of worship. Nonetheless, the use of the basilica buildings was the start of the public worship of the early Church. Christians no longer had to fear being persecuted or even executed. The move into the basilica buildings meant that the early Church had physical structures to represent the House of God and a gathering place for God’s Family.

Today as the Church uses the term, “basilica” refers to a special honor given to a particular church building more than the style in which the building was constructed. This honor is bestowed upon a church building by the Vatican either for a historical significance or some other major event that took place in that building. For example, after being visited by a reigning Pope, a church building might be given the honorary title of basilica. Or, the honor might be bestowed on a church building because of a strong devotion to a particular saint or a miracle that might have taken place in that particular church building. Here in Chicago, there are several churches designated as “basilicas” among them would be the Basilica of Queen of All Saints on Devon Avenue in the Sauganash neighborhood of Chicago or the Basilica of Our Lady of Sorrows on Jackson Blvd. in the West Garfield Park area.



When designated as a basilica, a symbol that looks like a giant umbrella would be added to the interior of the church. On it is embroidered a insignia of the Pope who by whom the honor was granted.

Getting back, though, to the Basilicas of Sts. Peter and Paul in Rome, many of us may never have been to Rome and seen either of these basilicas in person. The feast of their dedication may not mean much to us. It just so happens that I have been to both of these basilicas, helping me to understand their significance.

As for the Basilica of St. Peter (aka the Vatican), it stands on the site of what is believed to have been the location of St. Peter’s death and burial. In the courtyard in front of the Vatican, there is an obelisk with a cross on top marking the site believed to be where St. Peter was crucified upside down. The story goes that St. Peter was slated to be hung on a cross in the very same way as Jesus. However, St. Peter himself said that he was not worthy to die in the same

manner as Jesus because of his denial of Jesus. For this reason, his executioners decided to crucify St. Peter upside down. It is also believed that St.



Peter was buried not too far from the site of his execution. The Tomb of St. Peter lies inside of the Vatican several levels underneath the main altar which can still be visited to this day.

As for the Basilica of St. Paul, it is referred to as "Outside the Walls" because it lies just beyond the ancient wall that enclosed the City of Rome. Of course, today the City of Rome has expanded. But, in the time of the New Testament, the City of Rome was smaller and a defense wall was built around it. Parts of that wall still stand to this day.



St. Paul was a Roman citizen. As such, he could not be executed within the city limits. For this reason, St. Paul was first led outside of the city where he eventually


faced his demise. In his case, St. Paul was put to death by beheading which was the proper form of execution reserved for Roman citizens. The Basilica of St. Paul stands on the site of this saint's death.

Inside the Basilica of St. Paul Outside the Walls, there is a shrine in which is found the chains believed to be the same used to keep St. Paul bound on his way to be executed. These chains are kept in a reliquary in the sanctuary of the basilica.

Sts. Peter and Paul are important in our faith because they are the two pillars upon which our faith rests. Whether we have visited Rome or not, may the dedication of their churches teach us to be bold in our faith.

CATHOLIC LIFE STORIES AT ST. JULIE

FIELD TRIP TO MUNDELEIN SEMINARY

10/17/21 - On this day, we had a wonderful spiritual journey through Mundelein Seminary, also known as the University of St. Mary of the Lake. This 600-acre treasure, located about 60 miles north of St. Julie parish is composed of beautiful buildings 'American neo-classical on the outside, European influence on the inside', wooded areas, breathtaking lake and chapel views from the Belvedere, awesome Chapel of the Immaculate Conception, seminarian and faculty residences, classrooms, refectories, libraries, conference rooms, religious statues, memorial gardens and many more.

The 35-strong pilgrims/tourists were bussed from St. Julie for a 1-1/2 hour ride to the seminary. Leading the pack were Associate Pastor Ton Nguyen and Deacon John Benz, who gave us valuable information about the history of the seminary as well as life in the seminary. Fr. Ton spent 6 years as seminarian and was ordained there. Deacon John spent 6 months as seminarian in the early 1980s, left and raised a family and went back to study and become a deacon several years later.

Our tour started at the Column of the Immaculate Conception, located in front of the Immaculate Conception Chapel. The chapel is the center of the magnificent seminary campus built under the charter of the University of the St. Mary of the Lake Seminary in 1921 by George Cardinal Mundelein (1872-1939), whose grand vision was to create a seminary system that would serve Chicago, one of the largest Catholic populations in the nation. Now, the seminary is used as training grounds for priests by around 30 dioceses in the USA, two in Uganda and one in India. At that time, the campus was perceived by some as extravagant, considering the many amenities provided to seminarians. Cardinal Mundelein, believing that Service to God deserves the best, told the seminarians, "the best has been given to you, I now expect the best from you!" His exhortations ring true today. The seminary has produced and continues to produce thousands of the best priests on the planet!

Earlier that day, at 9:30am, a Centennial Mass (1921-2021) was held at the Immaculate Conception Chapel. Thanks to an Facebook post by a good friend who was blessed to be invited to the Mass, we learned the following: Centennial Mass was celebrated by Cardinal Wilton Gregory of Washington DC, concelebrated by Chicago Cardinal Blasé Cupich and Archbishop Christophe Pierre, Apostolic Nuncio to the USA. While we did not attend the Centennial Mass, we hope we shared in the blessings by "being in this place".

From the chapel we proceeded to the Feehan Memorial Library constructed in 1929 in honor of the first Archbishop of Chicago, Ireland-born Patrick Augustine Feehan (1829-1902). On entering the building, one feels like being at a sixteenth century Italian palace, with the center court surrounded by three stories of arcades filled with hundreds of thousands of books, mostly ancient, many in foreign languages and old, old texts. We suspect that some seminarians who are true bookworms would have said to themselves 'oh, if we only have enough lifetimes to enjoy these treasures!'

Then on to the extension of the library, known as the McEssy (donor family) Theological Resource Center, built in 2004. This new library of about 200,000 volumes houses the heart of the library's collections - theology, scripture studies, history of Christianity and the Roman Catholic Church. Beautiful, contemporary and very pleasant venue for reading, learning and contemplating the goodness of God! To be continued in Part II ...in two weeks!

FAMILY FAITH SHARING

In today's Gospel, (Mark:13: 24-32), Jesus teaches about the signs of the coming of the Son of Man. As we approach the end of the Church Year, our Gospel invites us to consider Jesus' predictions and teaching about the end of the world. Jesus continues His teaching by offering His disciples signs to look for that will indicate that the coming of the Son of Man is near. Jesus offers the lesson of the fig tree, a parable that teaches if one knows how to read the signs, one can be prepared for the end times. Jesus also teaches, however, that no one knows when the end time will come, except the Father. Jesus' words are not spoken to frighten His disciples nor should they frighten us. Rather they are offered to prepare us for the changes we will experience during our lifetimes.

Our consolation and hope is found in God's never-ending love for us. Many things in our lives change. Yet, all of us find stability in relationships. We can confidently accept change if we know that we will continue to be loved by our family and by God. We help impart this sense of trust to our children with our daily assurance to them that nothing can ever change our love for them.


