

BEING DISCIPLES OF JESUS

FROM OUR PASTOR

About a year and a half ago when I came to St. Julie parish I brought up the fact that the Associate Pastor comes from Vietnam and the Pastor comes from the Philippines – both in Asia, obviously. I brought up some possible concerns that parishioners might have of an

“Asian Invasion.” I meant that comment as a way to lighten the mood. I also followed it up explaining that sharing different cultural expressions of faith has been something very important to me and an enriching experience of what it means to be the Church.

The Catholic Church is called so because the very word “catholic” means “universal.” We are a universal Church because our faith applies to every people no matter what their country of origin might be. The Catholic Church speaks all languages because God speaks to people in whatever language might be their first and primary language. In other words, God does not talk to people exclusively in one language over another. God speaks all languages and, for that very reason, the Church also does the same. Sharing in one another’s experience helps us to gain a greater understanding of what it means to be the Body of Christ here on earth. This is something I have personally come to value even from my experience growing up in a very ethnically diverse area of the northside of Chicago.

I grew up going to Mass at St. Edward’s Parish near Montrose and Cicero. My family and I lived in the nearby Albany Park neighborhood. My grammar school years were mostly at Haugan Elementary about a half mile away from our home. I continued on to Roosevelt High School about a mile away from where I grew up. All of those experiences helped to shape my appreciation and love on sharing in one another’s cultural experiences. This became especially stronger whenever I met fellow Catholics from other ethnic backgrounds. I became fascinated in learning how there could be various cultural expressions of the same Catholic faith. It helped to fuel my own sense of discipleship.

Going to Mass at St. Edward’s while growing up, I remember seeing all sorts of faces. There were Filipino, obviously. But, there were also other Asians including Japan, Korea, and India. I remember seeing all of those various ethnicities and, in time, I learned to see just how universal the Catholic Church truly is.

Living in the Albany Park neighborhood also proved to be a blessing. On our particular block, there were other Filipino families as well as families from Cuban and other Latin American countries, Yugoslavia and other European nations, the Middle East, and everything else “under the sun.”

We lived near Lawrence and Pulaski. Everywhere, there were stores and groceries of every kind – Korean, Indian, Pakistani, Middle Eastern, Hispanic. Every time I walked the neighborhood, it always felt as if I were seeing a microcosm of the entire world. I wanted to experience every culture as much as possible.

All of this is just a way for me to explain why, as pastor, I want to bring the world to our parish. When we share in one another’s cultural expressions of our common faith, it makes that faith come alive in ways we may never have imagined to be possible. When we hear other people praying and praising God in different languages, we can gain a sense of unity with one another. In the case of our Catholic Church, we may be speaking in different languages but it is our common faith that makes us one. As I have thrived in my own sense of discipleship by sharing in and experiencing the various cultural expressions of our Catholic faith, it is my hope that we might foster the same in one another.

Next weekend, we will have a new opportunity to experience the faith of another Asian nation. A small but strong contingency of brothers and sisters from Vietnam will share with us the custom/celebration of Lunar New Year. It is a special time of year for the Vietnamese and other Asian nations that observe Lunar New Year. For those who are also Catholic, it is a celebration that comes almost equal to Christmas and Easter. I am happy that our Vietnamese parishioners came forward with the desire to share this moment with the parish. I am grateful that Fr. Ton has been guiding them in organizing our first ever Lunar New Year celebration here at St. Julie.

Personally, I was more deeply exposed to Catholicism in Vietnam when I became friends with a Vietnamese seminarian while we were both in Mundelein Seminary. He introduced me to the food. He brought me to various Vietnamese celebrations in Chicago including Lunar New Year. When his sister became engaged to be married, he even invited me to join in the traditional engagement ceremony at which his father even introduced me as part of the family even though I had only recently met them.

From knowing my friend's family, I also saw how Vietnamese Catholics prayed and I found it to be such a beautiful expression of faith. The Vietnamese language has a natural melody to it. Even as people are praying together in Vietnamese, it sounded as if the people were chanting the prayers in complete unison. The melodic beauty of the language came out even more when it was set to music. Ever since my first exposure to the Catholic Vietnamese expression of faith, I only wish that I could learn the language and enter more deeply into that beauty.

Again, next weekend, we will have the opportunity to experience the Vietnamese expression of our Catholic faith. It may be a small glimpse of it but I am sure that it will be something that enriches the faith of all of us no matter where we come from or what language we may use to pray to God. I hope and pray that it will be a start to an even greater sharing of faith.



THE STUMP OF JESSE

WE JUST CELEBRATED JESUS' BIRTHDAY BUT NOW WE'RE CELEBRATING HIS BAPTISM? JESUS TURNS 30 AFTER THREE WEEKS?

You might say, "Peter has the answer. He says, "But do not forget this one thing, dear friends: With the Lord a day is like a thousand years, and a thousand years are like a day. The Lord is not slow in keeping his promise, as some understand slowness. He is patient with you, not wanting anyone to perish, but everyone to come to repentance" 2 Peter 3: 8-9. It is true that God is outside of time but don't forget that Jesus carries his human nature as well. A better answer for this question is we are following the liturgical calendar which marks the Church year, a sequence of seasons and feasts in the liturgy during a year's time. In each liturgical year, we celebrate the entire life and paschal mystery of Jesus Christ. What is so significant about the Baptism of the Lord? It marks the beginning of Jesus' ministry and confirms his identity as the Son of God.

Does Jesus need to be baptized? The answer is Yes. But you might say, "Jesus has no sin, why does he need to be baptized?" Well, the answer is ... your homework. ☺

The Baptism of the Lord once again calls us to live out our baptismal call – to be saints and to glorify God through our words and actions.

FAMILY FAITH SHARING

In today's Gospel (*Luke 1: 1-4, 4: 14-21*), as in the other Gospel accounts of Jesus' Baptism, we hear John the Baptist speak to the confusion of the people who thought that John might be the Messiah. John the Baptist says that he has baptized with water but that someone will come and will baptize with the Holy Spirit.

The Baptism of Jesus is then considered a manifestation of God in Jesus, another "epiphany." On this, the last day of the Christmas season, the gospel reveals to us Jesus' relationship to God: the Son of Mary and Joseph is also God's own Son. Here, in Luke's Gospel, all three members of the Trinity are manifested: God the Father in the voice, the Holy Spirit descending, and Jesus, the Son.

Through his Gospel, Luke will show Jesus to be a person of prayer, who regularly withdraws from the crowd and His disciples to pray to His father, through Baptism, we, the children of Adam and Eve are charged with continuing the mission that Jesus began: Jesus set up the framework for all of us when he announced His ministry and His mission in today's Gospel. Jesus also gave us the helper we would need to participate in His mission.

Gather with your family and suggest that they try to picture the vision that Jesus describes, using the words of the prophet, Isaiah. What are the situations and who are the people who most need to see this vision fulfilled? Make a family commitment to pray for the Kingdom of God.

CJB is a “regional” Catholic school sponsored by St. Francis of Assisi, St. Julie Billiart, St. Stephen Deacon & Martyr, and St. Elizabeth Seton. We also welcome children from other parishes or households whose parents are seeking a Christ-centered, excellent educational environment. Share this news with your friends! CJB is adjacent to St. Elizabeth Seton Parish – at 9250 W. 167th Street in Orland Hills.

Do you offer Pre-K and Kindergarten classes?

Yes! We offer half-day and full-day 3PK and 4PK! Kindergarten is full-day. Half-day 3PK is Monday-Thursday (7:40a-10:40a.) Half-day 4PK is Monday-Friday (7:40a-10:40a). Our full-day PK and Kindergarten programs are, of course, Monday-Friday. Full-day hours are 7:40a until 2:40p (except on Tuesdays when we dismiss at 2pm).

How do I register?

“Open registration” is happening now! We accept applications until all spaces are filled. Our online registration application is available at www.cjbschool.org To register, submit the online application, then mail or drop off an *original* birth and baptismal certificate (*originals will be returned*), and a family registration fee of \$250. For Grades 1-8, include a copy of the 2021-22 first semester report card and all standardized test results.

How much is tuition? Is there Financial Aid?

Tuition for next school year will be announced once budget meetings are finalized. Parishioner tuition for the current school year is as follows. K-8 is \$5,900. Out-of-parish tuition for 2021-22 is \$6,900. There is an additional \$300 required for technology and curriculum fees. Full-day Pre-K 3 and Pre-K 4 is \$6,416. Half-day 3PK is \$3,513. Half-day 4PK is \$4,140. Financial aid is available for in-parish families (K-8). When you complete the online application, you will have an opportunity to complete the financial aid application. Financial applications must be submitted by mid-March.

Is there a “Before and After School” Program?

Yes! Our Extended Day Program opens at 6:30a and closes when the school day begins; it re-opens at 2:40p and closes for the night at 6:00p. The hourly-rate (\$8/hr. for one child; \$10/hr. for two or more children) is invoiced monthly. All registered students may attend the Extended Day Program.

When may I register?

Registration for new families is happening RIGHT NOW.



However, all contributions delivered to the parish office in person, left in the drop box, or postmarked on or after January 1, must be recorded as a 2022 contribution. Therefore, even if a check was dated in December 2021, but mailed, left in the drop box, or delivered to the parish office in January, that contribution must be recorded as a 2022 contribution.

Contribution statements will only be provided upon request and will be available mid to late January 2022. Statements can be picked up at the parish office, mailed or emailed. Please designate the preferred method of receipt when requesting the statement.
