

FROM OUR PASTOR

Monday, February 14 will not only be Valentine's Day, but it will also be the first official day for our new Business Manager, Lisa Melnik. I am grateful that I was able to find a qualified person to fill the role.

I again thank Nancy Pfeiffer who retired this past December. She

had served as the parish's Business Manager for many years. I am grateful for all of her hard work and commitment to the parish. Her retirement is a well earned reward and one I am sure she will enjoy.

Our new Business Manager comes to us with some work experience that really made me take notice. I ended up interviewing about ten people who applied for the position. All of them had gifts and strengths. But, of course, I could pick only one person to fill the position. I am glad that Lisa Melnik accepted the position.

Lisa comes to us having worked for the Archdiocese of Chicago in the recent past as a Parish Operations Administrator. In that role, she helped several parishes with their financial and administrative needs. She also has the added benefit of having worked as a Business Manager for one of the parishes in the Gary, Indiana Diocese.

In finding a Business Manager, one of my first priorities was to make sure that person and I would work well together. If there were any hints of friction from the very start, that would have been a serious cause of concern for me. If the new Business Manager and I would not be able to get along, it would just create a difficult working environment. Fortunately, all the candidates I interviewed had good personalities and work ethics. I am confident that I would have gotten along very well with any one of them. But, again, I could choose only one.

The role of a Business Manager is very important in the life of a parish. It is also important to a pastor, like me, who oftentimes has not been trained in the day to day administration of a parish. Taking myself as an example, in seminary I was trained to have theological and pastoral skills. The aspect of parish administration was not a central focus. In many

ways, that is understandable since the primary role of a priest/pastor is precisely the spiritual and pastoral needs of the faithful entrusted to him. But, for that very reason, a pastor needs a good "arm" to help him with the day to day administration of the temporal goods of the parish. That is the part the Business Manager fills.

In time, I am sure that more and more parishioners will get to meet Lisa. For the time being, she will have A LOT of work. She will need to assist me in putting the budget together for the next fiscal year which includes creating a strategy where the gap between our income and expenses can be greatly reduced. That is still a challenge we are facing. So I again ask for your prayers as Lisa begins.

To change gears a little bit, I do also want to share another bit of news that parishioners might have heard already. This one is regarding to Fr. Ton.

This coming June 30, 2022, marks the end of Fr. Ton's assignment term here at St. Julie's. He was here for a year before I started and he was with me since then. His term is a total of three years. As he looked at this reality, he felt that it was time for him to seek reassignment to another parish. In effect, then, he will be with us only until the end of this June. God willing, July 1, 2022 we will be welcoming a new Associate Pastor.

As Fr. Ton discerns where God might take him next, I am sure that there are some questions in the minds of parishioners. First among them would be why a priest needs to leave a parish assignment in the first place. There are several reasons for this. First, it is to prepare oneself to become a pastor. Ultimately, all priests need to discern and prepare himself to become a pastor. Of course, not all priests will have the skills to be a pastor and some should not be pastors. But, this is a reality that all priests must face especially in light of current situations that face every Catholic diocese in the world. Fr. Ton and I have been keenly aware of this right from the very beginning. Having gone through it myself, I recommended to him that he should have at least two different parish assignments prior to deciding to become a pastor or not. The current trend nowadays is that pastors will be in great demand so Fr. Ton felt it necessary to get himself ready in case that day will come sooner than anyone might expect.


Another reason why priests are reassigned so many times is to keep a missionary spirit inside of him. Missionaries can move around much more than diocesan priests like myself or Fr. Ton. The life of a missionary requires that he/she be ready to move to a new assignment even at a moment's notice. This serves as a reminder that the work is not one's own. Rather, the work is God's and God Himself is the one who is doing the work through the lives of those who serve Him. Moving from one assignment to another simply helps a priest to keep in focus the reality that the mission is so much greater than just himself. He is simply part of a greater mission.

I share the sentiments of all parishioners in saying that it will be hard to say "goodbye" to Fr. Ton. He has been a great and valuable asset to our parish. He brought an energy and enthusiasm that draws every person around him to love the Lord just as much as he does. He has been a great companion in the rectory and a partner to me in the pastoral care of the parish. But, it is time so another parish will soon get to benefit from his gifts.

In looking at our calendars, Fr. Ton and I have both decided that the weekend of June 18/19, 2022 will be his last weekend here at the parish. From personal experience, I told him that it would be good to take some time off between assignments to rest, relax, and reenergize. So for the last couple of weeks in June, he will do just that to get himself ready for whatever lies ahead. He and I also agreed that if, at any point, he changes his mind, we are keeping the option open of staying here a little longer.

Nonetheless, I will also be looking to the possibility of a new Associate Pastor. He will have big shoes to fill but an Associate Pastor will be a huge help. So please pray for that process as well.

Financial Assistance for the orphans, unwed mothers, and burials of unborn babies of the Orphanage of Trust

Dear Father Tirso S. Villaverde, Jr., Father Ton Nguyen, and the Parish of Saint Julie Billiart,

As a religious sister who belongs to the Congregation of the Lovers of the Holy Cross of Dalat from Vietnam, I am Sister Hoa Nguyen. On behalf of Sister Therese Tran Thi Kim, the Superior General of the congregation, I am writing this letter to express our gratitude for your support and financial assistance for the orphans, unwed mothers, and burials of unborn babies of the orphanage of trust, one of the ministries that our congregation has devoted to serve for decades.

Our Congregation is under the jurisdiction of the Bishop of Dalat Diocese. Historically, the Congregation of the Lovers of the Holy Cross was established in 1670 by Bishop Lambert de la Motte. One of our mission ministries is protecting the life and the rights of infants and promoting the dignity of women who are victims of society.

In the past few years, abortion has become legal and popular in the hospitals as well as private clinics. Therefore, the Sisters of our Congregation have continued this ministry of protecting life and human dignity, especially in the works of taking care of the orphans, the burial of aborted unborn-babies, and the care for women in crisis pregnancies.

The Sisters in charge of this mission and some volunteers daily come to the hospitals and local clinics to meet women who intend to have abortion in order to counsel them to keep their babies and offer them rooms to live in our house so that they can be taken care of during their pregnancies.

These women are from different circumstances: poor people, teenagers, students, divorced, unwed mothers, and ethnic women. All those who decide to keep their babies will be cared for by the Sisters for lodging, food, clothing, medicines, and other needs until they give birth. After giving birth, if a mother has no house or is abandoned by her family, our Congregation will continue to take care of her and help her find a paid manual job to support herself. If the mothers cannot support their children, we will continue to take care of their babies at our orphanage. Besides this ministry, we also welcome newly born children left at the gate of the orphanage.

Until now, we have taken care of 634 women: 141 of them left their babies and moved on with their life; 487 brought their babies to their families; and six expecting mothers are living in our house now. We are also taking care of 74 babies and six pregnant women.

Dear Fathers and all, most of the communities of our congregation are in rural areas and only a few are in the cities. We carry out our ministry in parish works and education for children in kindergartens. The only financial support for the Orphanage is from the communities in the cities. However, we are now in the midst of the pandemic outbreak, we have no work and no income to support all our pastoral works and mission. Therefore, we are experiencing financial difficulties. In fact, all our social services are free for the poor and the needy based on our own budget. We have not received any support from the Vietnamese government. Your spiritual and financial support (\$ 4150) has strengthened our ministries and motivated us to continue to fulfill God's plan in us and those who need our hearts and hands to live a holistic life as God's children.

We do believe that God is working through you as you would like to put hands together with our Congregation to continue maintaining the orphanage, the house for unwed mothers, and the pastoral work of burial of unborn babies. We truly appreciate all of your care and financial aid to our congregation in our desperate situation in the present to continue our

pastoral service. I am attaching here some pictures of the orphanages and the cemetery where we have buried so many innocent unborn babies.

May God continually bless you and your parish with His abundant blessings and goodness.



If a contribution dated in December was mailed to the parish office and is postmarked on or before December 31, it will be recorded as a 2021 contribution. However, all contributions delivered to the parish office in person, left in the drop box, or postmarked on or after January 1, must be recorded as a 2022 contribution. Therefore, even if a check was dated in December 2021, but mailed, left in the drop box, or delivered to the parish office in January, that contribution must be recorded as a 2022 contribution.

Contribution statements will only be provided upon request and will be available mid to late January 2022. Statements can be picked up at the parish office, mailed or emailed. Please designate the preferred method of receipt when requesting the statement.
