FROM OUR PASTOR

I cannot believe that later this week will be the start of Lent. In many ways, Lent can be a very busy time of year just as much – or even more so – than the weeks leading up to Christmas. Like the weeks of Advent, we can find ourselves focused heavily on the details of preparation – for the

Easter gathering or even simply our Lenten disciplines. Oftentimes, we get so caught up on those details that we completely miss the spirit of this holy season.

Lent is meant to be a 40 day long retreat. For those who have never taken a retreat, it is not simply a time to “get away.” But, a retreat is not the same as a vacation. Rather, a retreat is a time we set aside to focus more strongly on our relationship with God. For this, we do not necessarily need to go somewhere else although it is oftentimes helpful. Lent is a time where we can even take a retreat from the comfort of our own homes. Even as we are concerned about other things, hopefully we will take the time to be with God more so during Lent than at other times of our lives.

We all live very busy and full lives that we find it very difficult at times to spend time in prayer with God. In many ways, a retreat recognizes that we are busy and our days are full. But, a retreat is our way of focusing more energy on spending time with God which is at the heart of prayer. This is what Lent helps us to understand.

I cannot begin to tell you the many times that people have admitted to me that they have not devoted enough time to prayer. In many ways, it is understandable because the average person does not live like a monk or a religious where prayer times are actually scheduled during the course of a day. For the average person, though, prayer times can be erratic and irregular. But, that does not diminish the need to spend regular time in prayer. If God is truly essential in our lives and prayer is the time we spend with God to be in His Presence to recognize how essential God is to us, we need to carve out some time each day for that very purpose.

A retreat time is meant to give ourselves that opportunity to be with God a little more than we have been doing. Lent becomes that yearly opportunity to give more attention to our relationship with God. No matter what we may choose to do as a Lenten discipline, all of it is meant to redirect our energy and focus on our relationship with God. If that is not happening, whatever we may have “given up” for Lent will make us holier.

Essential to prayer is silence. God speaks to us most clearly in silence. Most of the time, God did not make Himself known through large and grandiose displays of power. Rather, God makes Himself known to us and speaks to us when we are silent. In silence, distractions are at a minimum so that we can focus on the whispering voice of God.

If we are like most people, we might respond by saying that we do not have time to spend in silence. Yet, it does not even require us to spend hours on end in silence. Have we ever tried to sit in silence for just 60 seconds or even 10 seconds? More often than not, it is not that we do not have time for silence. It is, rather, we are afraid of it.

We live in a time where distractions are prevalent. We have work. We have family responsibilities. We have television and the internet. But we now also have social media, Tik Tok, Instagram, and every other form of distraction imaginable. We are so predisposed to be engaged in those things that we allow them to take over. Many of them are good things but they can still take us away from who ought to be the center of our lives. But, because our lives are so full of distractions, any time spent in silence makes us feel uncomfortable. We cannot sit still for more than 10 seconds. We get full of anxiety. We feel like we have to be “doing something.”

Silence, though, is an essential component to prayer. However, for the average person whose days are filled with driving the kids to school, getting to work, and things like that, it does not necessarily mean that we have to carve out an hour long time to be in silence. We can spread it out during the course of a day.

When people admit to me that they do not have too much time to devote to prayer, I suggest that they take small steps. I point out some simple things that

can be done. For example, I have suggested to people that as they wake up let the Sign of the Cross be the very first thing that they do. It brings them into the presence of God and begins the day in God's Name. Likewise, I have suggested that the Sign of the Cross be the last thing they do right before going to bed. In this simple way, the entire day is begun and ended in God's Name.

Then, during the course of the day, I have suggested that people take whatever time they can find to be in prayer. Again, for example, during the moments they find themselves alone in the car, drive in silence instead of turning on the radio. For myself, when I know that I am going to be driving a long distance, I turn off the radio and pray the rosary. The whole point is simply to rely less on those distractions and focus on bringing ourselves into God's presence. Or, more accurately, it is reminding ourselves that we are always in God's presence.

During the 40 days of Lent, no matter what we may have chosen to "give up," let us not forget that times for prayer is essential. Retreats help us to remember this. Lent serves the same purpose. As much as we value quality time that we spend with family and friends, we ought to be doing the same with our relationship with God. In this way, we see more and more that our relationship with God is not one of God being the giver and we are the ones who ask for favors. Instead, the more time we spend in prayer the more we value the presence of God in our lives just as much as God values our presence in His.

As we prepare to enter into the holy season of Lent, let us all take small steps to enter into the spirit of a retreat. Let us take small steps to spend more time in silence being in the presence of God. Those small steps can lead to a deeper relationship with God who simply wants to be a part of our lives and asks that we desire to be a part of His. No matter what steps we may take this season of Lent, let us each do what is necessary to be less focused on the distractions of life. Instead, let us fill our lives with the joy of knowing that God is always present to us.

GOD HAS ANOTHER PLAN

A couple weeks ago, I was so excited about a ski trip to Colorado that I had planned with my friends. On Monday prior to our trip, while getting ready to inspiring the students at St. George with my vocation story, I turned to my right and sprained my neck. What? I know, right! How can it be? I know, right! And off course, Jesus' words were echoing in my head, "Truly, truly, I tell you, when you were young, you dressed yourself and walked where you wanted; but when you are old, you will stretch out your hands, and someone else will dress you and lead you where you do not want to go." "Seriously, Lord?" Part of me was trying to bargain, "Lord, I am not that old and I have been working so hard; can you expedite my healing process so I'm able to go on the ski trip?" Do you think my petition was answered the way I wanted? Well, God had another plan for me. I ended up going for a silent retreat at St. Meinrad, Indiana with the Benedictine Monks. I learned so much about God's will during the retreat and came back rejuvenated. I will unpack God's graces received from this retreat with you during Lent.

I, now, conclude this short article with a bio of St. Meinrad.

"Born about the year 800 in what is now Germany, Meinrad was a Benedictine monk who lived as a hermit for much of his life, dedicated to prayer and solitude. Even as a hermit, his reputation as a wise and holy man led people to seek him out for counsel and prayer. Despite his desire for solitude, the monk Meinrad graciously attended to his guests' needs, physical as well as spiritual. In 861, two robbers came to Meinrad's hermitage, believing he had treasures hidden there – gifts from the people he had counseled. In spite of a premonition of his impending death, Meinrad invited the robbers in and offered them food and drink. The men murdered him and then fled in fear without taking anything. Meinrad's death earned him the title of 'Martyr of Hospitality.'" Wow, what's a saintly life and saintly death!

I LOVE BEING A PRIEST!

Lent is almost here. Lent is a 40 day season of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving that begins on Ash Wednesday (March 2) and ends at sundown on Holy Thursday (April 14). It's a period of preparation to celebrate the Lord's Resurrection at Easter. During Lent, we seek the Lord in prayer by reading Sacred Scripture; we serve by giving alms; and we practice self-control through fasting. We are called not only to abstain from luxuries during Lent, but to a true inner conversion of heart as we seek to follow Christ's will more faithfully. We recall the waters of baptism in which we were also baptized into Christ's death, died to sin and evil, and began new life in Christ. Praying that we will have a deep encounter with the Lord during the Lenten Season.



At the end of my retreat, I sneaked in a mini ski trip and successfully convinced a seminarian and a sister to join. As we always say, "God is Good!" – "All the Time!"

I had a retreat and a ski trip! Wow! It is a win-win!

FAMILY FAITH SHARING

The three parables in today's Gospel (Luke 6:39-45) all tell us how to be a good disciple. However, before you can be a good disciple and teach others, you need to take care of yourself. Do not try to take a speck out of your brother's eye until you have taken the board out of your own. Lastly, only when you have purified yourself, can you do the good work that the Teacher requires.

Discipleship asks us to produce good deeds but to produce them requires the integrity found in the teacher. When people see your good acts, they will know that this is because you have a good heart. Jesus' parables in this week's Gospel are a reminder of the importance of continual learning, prayer and reflection, and humility in our discipleship. We are shining examples of God's light to the world when we are filled with God's grace and recognize our need for transformation through Jesus.

As busy parents, responsible for our children's spiritual growth, we may be challenged at times to care for ourselves and our own spiritual growth. Gather as a family and spend some time sharing ideas about what it means to be a good disciple. Share how sometimes we look at the shortcomings of other family members and neglect to examine ourselves and our own shortcomings. Pray the Our Father together that you will grow together in your discipleship.







NEWS IN OUR CATHOLIC NEIGHBORHOOD PARISHES

While the seven parishes in the Orland / Tinley area have successfully completed the initial Renew My Church process, we have now taken the next step in building community within our Catholic neighborhood.

Representatives from Saint Elizabeth Seton, Saint Francis of Assisi, Saint George, Saint Julie Billiard, Saint Michael, Our Lady of the Woods and Saint Stephen Deacon and Martyr met over the last several months to share our strengths and our individual areas of challenge. We discussed ways we could both learn from and support each other. We are very fortunate that there is no need to close or consolidate any of our parishes. The Archdiocese recognizes all the wonderful things happening here. It is our wish to build on that and create a strong, lasting presence in the communities, keeping the main focus on Evangelization, drawing people closer to Jesus through our Catholic Faith.

The original committee members determined there would be many benefits if we shared our talents to form an even stronger Catholic bond. The result of that was the formation of the seven parish **VISION COUNCIL**. There are two members from each parish, with the Pastors taking turns overseeing the group.

As a result of the first meeting, many practical ideas are being discussed:

- 1) Young Adult Ministry,
- 2) Youth Ministers to be hired and shared by parishes that presently lack that position, and
- 3) shared RCIA between parishes.

It is our desire to see all parishioners, of every age group, feel welcome and a sense of belonging, and ultimately develop a deeper connection to the Faith and our Church. The mission of the **VISION COUNCIL** is to determine how we seven parishes can move together toward the Kingdom of God.

- **We cannot accommodate any special instructions**, regardless of any notes a participant may write on the envelope. (*For example, we will **not** hold funds for a future month's drawing.*)

If a contribution dated in December was mailed to the parish office and is postmarked on or before December 31, it will be recorded as a 2021 contribution. However, all contributions delivered to the parish office in person, left in the drop box, or postmarked on or after January 1, must be recorded as a 2022 contribution. Therefore, even if a check was dated in December 2021, but mailed, left in the drop box, or delivered to the parish office in January, that contribution must be recorded as a 2022 contribution.

Contribution statements will only be provided upon request and will be available mid to late January 2022. Statements can be picked up at the parish office, mailed or emailed. Please designate the preferred method of receipt when requesting the statement.




