



FROM OUR PASTOR

In our lives as believers, there are many questions that challenge us on the deepest levels. One of those might be the question of evil in our world is one that has been asked from believers and non-believers since the beginning of time. It always begs the question of whether or not God actually

cares about what is going on here on earth. Any one of us may have asked this question at one time or another. If we have not yet found ourselves asking this question, inevitably we will.

The readings this weekend touch on this theme in different ways. In the first reading from the Book of Exodus, we hear the story of Moses and the Burning Bush. In that story, God tells Moses that He has seen the suffering of His People and has come to earth to free them. This is one of the stories from Sacred Scripture that remind us that God does see the suffering we endure. God does care. And, God does respond. Yet, the question of evil in the world still exists and we can still find ourselves scratching our heads.

In the gospel, people tell Jesus the story about several Galileans who suffered a cruel fate at the hands of Pilate. Their deaths were ordered and orchestrated by Pilate. But, as if death was not humiliating enough, Pilate took it one step further. Pilate had the blood of these Galileans mixed with the blood of pagan sacrifices. The thought was that the Galileans must have done something so wrong to offend God that this was simply a form of divine punishment. Yet, Jesus responds by stating that God does not act that way.

This, of course, was the thinking in ancient times. If something bad happened to a person, it was presumed that he/she was being punished by God for an offense. This is how the people thought God acted. That was an easy way to explain the presence of evil. The only way to counteract this was to be as faithful to all of the commands of God as possible—even more. The minds of our ancestors in the faith believed that as long as they were faithful to God's law and commands, God would not do bring harm to

them. In fact, this is why many of the religious leaders took issue with Jesus. He seemingly was changing everything around that they were afraid his actions would incur God's wrath and the whole people would end up getting punished.

To the modern mind, this way of thinking no longer makes sense. However, many people still try to explain the presence of evil in the same way. There is still a generation of Catholics who speak as if the bad things that happen to us are forms of divine punishment and still leads to the same difficulties as in the past. Today, it tends to turn people off to embracing faith in God. For many people, it does not appeal to them to follow a God who can be petty.

So, what is the answer? How do we explain the question of evil and God's role in it? One of the tools I find myself going back to over and over again in dealing with this question is a book I read several years ago entitled The Shack written by William Paul Young. In 2017, there was a movie adaptation of the book. Every time I am faced with my own questions of why there is evil in the world or why bad things happen to me, I find myself returning to that story. In some ways, the book tells a story that is disturbing but it still describes the journey of faith that is common to all of us.

The story centers around a father who sadly lost his daughter. Understandably, he has anger toward God. Naturally, this father seeks answers from God as he continues to deal with the pain of loss. One day, the father receives a mysterious message inviting him to spend a weekend away. It turns out that the message was from God who appears to this hurting father. During the course of the visit, the father struggles to understand the mind of God.

Even though he is blessed by a personal visit with God, the father still finds himself full of anger. He lashes out at God demanding He explain himself. In many ways, this father puts God on trial for all the moments of neglect in the world. But, after that brief visit with God, the father does not necessarily get all the answers. He only knows that his relationship with God has changed. He can never fully explain what happened. But, there is healing on every level as this father begins to understand the world from the perspective of God.


In many ways, this remains at the heart of our Lenten journey. We want to remain faithful to God. We want to follow God more closely and deeply. Yet, what oftentimes holds us back is that question of why evil exists. We cannot help but ask how God who is supposedly all loving can allow such atrocities and tragedies to occur in peoples' lives. It is a struggle that is still a part of our lives and we would gladly welcome the opportunity to have a face to face visit with God during which we can ask God for answers to our deepest questions. Why is there suffering in the world? Is God powerless in the face of evil?

Asking these questions or having these thoughts from time to time is not necessarily a bad thing. Likewise, it is natural to have some anger towards God whenever bad things may happen to us or to others. It is a natural response. But, like in all other relationships, if we remain in that anger, we run the risk of breaking that relationship even more. This was another lesson I found from the book I read several years ago. It is a lesson that still stands true to this day.

But in terms of finding the answer to the question of evil in our world, we will never be able to answer that unless we see things from the perspective of God. When we find ourselves wondering if God cares or why God seems to be indifferent to our own pains and sufferings, we will never be able to see things clearly unless we allow God to show us how He sees the world. God's wisdom goes so much farther and deeper than our own human wisdom. The challenge and invitation is always to unite ourselves with the mind of God and then we will begin to see the answers to all of our questions.

As we continue with this season of Lent, let us take every opportunity available to us to grow deeper in our relationship with God. That relationship grows stronger the more we express our love for God. But, that relationship also grows stronger the more we deal with those difficult questions

FAMILY FAITH SHARING

In today's Gospel (Luke 13:1-9), Jesus teaches repentance with the parable about the barren fig tree. He also must respond to those who challenge and question His authority and actions. At first, Jesus' words seem to have a fire and brimstone quality when he basically says "Repent or perish." The tone changes in the parable that follows. The story of the barren fig tree contrasts the patience and hopefulness of the gardener with the practicality of the property owner. We may be unfamiliar with fig trees but we might know about the growth of Spring flowers. We know or have thought about the patience required to grow and tend to a beautiful flower bed. We don't have to be gardeners, however, to know about patience and hopefulness.

As parents, we practice these virtues each day with our children. We may be frustrated by their lack of cooperation yet we continue to offer them our attention and guidance in hope that one day our efforts will bear fruit. Today's parable suggests that God is like that with us...patient and hopeful. As your family gathers, offer praise and thanks to God for His patience and hopefulness towards us.

40 DAYS OF A SIMPLE LENT

- Day 12:** Pray for people and situations in today's news.
- Day 13:** Read *Psalm 139*– Memorize a verse that speaks to you.
- Day 14:** Make an extra effort to offer sincere compliments.
- Day 15:** What's the first thing you touch in the morning. What value does it have compared to other things you touch the rest of the day (including people).
- Day 16:** Spend 10 minutes looking at the sky, trees, and land, and give thanks to God for His incredible creation.
- Day 17:** Forgive someone. Apologize to someone.
- Day 18:** Write someone a hand-written letter.
- Day 19:** Change one light in your house to a compact florescent.
- Day 20:** Take a walk with someone you love, or a new friend.
- Day 21:** Schedule a more significant Sabbath in your day. It should be a 6-to-1 ratio, with one hour of rest to 6 hours of work. Use that time for meditation, retreat, or volunteering.
- Day 22:** For two hours, turn off all devices (phone, computer, etc.). Use this time to play a game with your family, call an old friend, – in short, connect with loved ones.
- Day 23:** Introduce yourself to a neighbor.
- Day 24:** Read *Psalm 121*. Memorize a verse meaningful to you.
- Day 25:** Use your own reusable mug/ water bottle/container.




