BEING DISCIPLES OF JESUS

HAPPY EASTER!

The gospel on Easter Sunday morning this year ends with the words, “they did not yet understand the Scripture that he had to rise from the dead.” What was it that the disciples did not understand? Do we understand it?

Jesus kept talking about giving his life as a ransom for many. He had prepared his disciples on several occasions telling them that he had to suffer much, be put to death, and three days later rise from the dead. During Jesus’ time with the disciples, we know that they misunderstood his words at every step of the way. Even at the last moments of Jesus’ life on earth as he faced his Passion, the disciples were still clueless. They thought that Jesus wanted them to take up arms and defend themselves. But when Jesus offered no resistance, it left them confused. Now, even after seeing the tomb empty, the disciples are still uncertain as to what it all means. It will only be during and after the next fifty days while the Risen Jesus is with the disciples that they will begin to understand the reason why Jesus had to rise from the dead.

This reminds me of a movie entitled “Risen” which came out back in 2016. The story centers around a fictional Roman centurion character. He was assigned to the crucifixion of Jesus. He witnessed Jesus die on the cross. He saw his body being buried. He even helped to seal the tomb. Then, when the tomb was discovered to be empty, this same Roman centurion was assigned the task of hunting down the Apostles and disciples to find out who stole the body of Jesus.

At one point, the Roman centurion was fast on the tails of the Apostles. They were cornered and, at last, he would have the answer. The Apostles were locked in the Upper Room. The Roman centurion kicked down the door but he stopped dead in his tracks at the sight he witnessed. There in the center of the room was the very man he knew to be dead. He fell back in disbelief and confusion. The man who had risen from the dead all of a sudden disappeared from sight. The Apostles left the room to look for Jesus the

one who was dead but was now alive. The Roman centurion remained in the room alone paralyzed by the confusion that was filling his mind.

The story continues as the Roman centurion finds himself following behind the Apostles curious to see if Jesus would appear to them again. Jesus does indeed appear and the mind of the Roman centurion continues to be filled with so many questions. He finds himself compelled to follow after Jesus all the while uncertain if he could call himself a disciple.

The Roman forces still pursue the Apostles and, this time, the confused centurion finds himself to be the target of the army he once commanded. At one point, he even aids the Apostles in an escape. The Apostles, understandably, are skeptical but end up trusting the Roman centurion. This moves the Apostles to welcome the Roman centurion turned seeker.

Toward the end of the movie, the Roman centurion has a conversation with the Risen Jesus who shows no anger toward him.

The movie ends with the Roman centurion turning up at an inn and speaking with the innkeeper. He is telling this stranger everything he encountered and witnessed. In the end, the innkeeper asks one question of the Roman centurion. He asks the Roman, “do you truly believe all this?” The Roman centurion pauses for a while but manages to respond by saying, “I believe...I can never be the same.” The very last scene of the movie shows the Roman centurion – no longer dressed as a Roman soldier – walking off into the distance into an unforeseen future.

Perhaps this is what the disciples in the gospel had not yet understood. Perhaps this is what they had not been able to comprehend even while Jesus was with them. Jesus came to live and die and rise again so that all things would be made new. Jesus came so that nothing nor no one would ever be the same after being touched by God’s mercy.

During Jesus’ public ministry, the disciples and Apostles were firsthand witnesses to the miracles of Jesus. Yet, despite seeing the wonders he was able to do and the words he had preached, it had not yet dawned on the minds of the disciples what the full impact of Jesus’ life would have on them and the world. They believed that Jesus was going to bring



about a new era but they believed it was going to happen by a display of military force. Jesus came to show that his life, suffering, death, and resurrection would change everything by a power stronger than any military – the power of God’s love.

For the Apostles and disciples, it took the empty tomb and the post-resurrection appearances to begin convincing them that Jesus had changed everything but not in the way they had thought. Their encounters with the Risen Jesus left them just as confused and dumbfounded as the fictional Roman centurion. But, in the end, they were also left with the question if they truly believed everything that had happened. Their answer was the same as in the movie. They believed that they would never be left the same.

For us today, if we are to understand the full impact of what the Resurrection means, we must know above everything else that we will never be the same. If we are the same people as we were before the start of Lent, then we have missed the point. Or, as my college English professor was prone to say, we have had the experience but missed the message.

Do we believe all the stories to be true? Yes, they are true in ways we can never imagine. The truth of the stories lies much more beyond than the ability to prove things historically. The truth of the stories of Jesus are true because there is a message from God that is life-transforming. As long as we believe that we will never be the same because of Jesus’ rising from the dead, we are on the way to being the best disciples we can be.

100%? OF COURSE!

"Jesus, who was crucified, has risen as he said. Alleluia!" is the Church's proclamation resounding throughout the world today. Yes, the Lord is risen! Truly, He is risen. Usually at Easter Mass, the Church would have an Easter Sequence sung as extensions of the sung Alleluia. It is an ancient liturgical hymn

that praises Christ, the paschal victim, for his victory over death. It goes like this, "Christians, to the Paschal Victim offer your thankful praises! A Lamb the sheep redeems; Christ, who only is sinless, reconciles sinners to the Father. Death and life have contended in that combat stupendous: the Price of life, who died, reigns immortal. Speak, Mary, declaring what you saw, wayfaring. 'The tomb of Christ, who is living, the glory of Jesus' resurrection; Bright angels attesting, the shroud and napkin resting. Yes, Christ my hope is arisen; To Galilee he goes before you.' Christ indeed from death is risen, our new life obtaining. Have mercy, victor King, ever reigning! Amen. Alleluia." WOW! I know, it is a beautiful prayer, isn't it? With a sorrowful heart, Mary Magdalene went to the tomb and something amazing happened. She encountered the resurrected Lord, who died for our sins and rose victoriously. This good news exuberates Mary Magdalene's heart, and our hearts, to the point that she sung joyfully "Christ my hope is arisen!"

We see Christ has loved us 100%, has kenosis/self-emptied 100%, has taken on flesh in everything except sin 100%, has laid down his life for us by dying on the cross 100%, and has conquered death triumphally 100%. Now, Christians have hope for our salvation. Mary Magdalene, after being converted to Christ, has followed him 100%. As she rushed home announcing Christ's Resurrection to the disciples, she had with her 100% energy. What's about us? Are we still have the fire of the resurrected Lord in us? To anchor our life in Jesus, to love one another, to spread the message of salvation through our words and actions 100%? I hope and I pray that we do.



FAMILY FAITH SHARING

Today we begin the Easter season, our fifty day reflection on the Mystery of Christ's Resurrection. Today's Gospel (John 20:1-9) tells us about the disciples' discovery of the empty tomb and these disciples were women. The passage concludes that even having seen the empty tomb and the burial cloths, the disciples did not yet understand about the Resurrection. In the weeks ahead, the Gospel readings will show how the disciples came to believe in Jesus' resurrection through His appearances to them. Our faith in the Risen Jesus is based on their witness to the empty tomb and their continuing relationship with Jesus in His post-Resurrection appearances and in the gift of the Holy Spirit. Although the disciples did not fully understand Jesus' resurrection, that understanding gradually began to unfold for them in the same way, our understanding of Jesus' resurrection unfolds for us throughout our lives.

Encourage your family to imagine they are the first disciples experiencing the discovery that Jesus has risen. Pray together, "This is the day the Lord has made; let us rejoice and be glad in it" (Psalm 118).




- **Must** be 18 years old to participate.
- **\$5 per entry** (Entries **must** be submitted in our preprinted salmon colored envelopes **only**, with contact information filled out completely on the blank lines provided.)
- No limit to the number of entries per person per month, but **each \$5 entry must be submitted in a separate salmon colored envelope** (Any amount in a single envelope that exceeds \$5 will automatically be considered a donation to the general fund, and that envelope will still be considered a single entry.)
- Drawings will be held once a month on the last Monday of the month.
- Winner of each monthly drawing will receive half of the funds received that month via a check from the parish. (NO cash will be handed out.)
- All entry dollars received within the current month will always be included in the current monthly drawing. (For those who receive monthly envelope packets: The name of the month is also preprinted on your raffle envelopes due to a printer requirement, but we will disregard this date and include your entry during the month it is submitted.)
- **We cannot accommodate any special instructions**, regardless of any notes a participant may write on the envelope. (For example, we will **not** hold funds for a future month's drawing.)
- 50/50 Raffle entry dollars are not considered a donation for tax purposes and are **not** tax deductible. (These entry dollars, therefore, are not entered into our parish database and will not be included in end of the year tax statements.)
- **IMPORTANT!** Please refrain from adding tape, stickers, return address labels, etc. to the back of the envelopes as a "sealer". They are "pull tab" envelopes, which makes sealing and opening very easy. Adding all the "sticky" things, slows down the opening process, is tearing the envelopes, adds weight. **This means that not all entries are then weighted the same and is causing the envelopes in the drum to stick to one another.** The envelopes are being used as the "tickets" and having raffle tickets all be of equal weight and size and condition, is very important!


