

THIS WEEK'S MESSAGE

It is hard to believe that we are at the end of April now and next Sunday will already be May. The time does go by quickly. Before Holy Week, there has been this sense that things can be put off until after Easter. Our focus, after all, had been on the celebrations leading up to Easter. For those in

the ministry, we look forward to a little "breather" after the big celebrations. However, it seems like there will not be too much time to breathe now that May is upon us.

May will be the month of First Communions. This year, we are doing First Communions a little different in that we will not be having a separate liturgy with just the First Communicants and their families.

Instead, families have signed up for various Mass times on each of the Sundays during May. There are a couple of reasons for this change. For one, in many instances, when parishes schedule a date for First Communion there will inevitably be conflicts in family schedules. Secondly, First Communion is really not only a celebration of the immediate family but it should also be a celebration of the entire parish family. Like all the sacraments, it is the entire Church that rejoices and celebrates them. Even when there are only a few people at a particular celebration, each sacrament is a celebration of the entire Church—the local Church, the Universal Church throughout the world, and even the Church in heaven. To accommodate the schedules of families and to emphasize the universal aspect of the celebration, families this year were given the choice to sign up for a date and a Mass time in May that would fit their schedules.

So, at various times throughout the month of May, there may be several families at a particular Mass who will join the parish family in the celebration of a child's First Communion. Having First Communion at a Sunday Mass also helps to emphasize everyone's obligation to come together as God's Family on the day of the week we know as the Lord's Day.

Also in May, there will be the annual May Crowning in honor of the Virgin Mary. She is our heavenly

Mother and, as we honor our earthly mothers with Mother's Day, it is only right that we should also honor our heavenly Mother.

This year, May Crowning will be after the 11:30am Mass on Sunday, May 15. Weather permitting, we will again have an outdoor procession. This time, we will use the same statue of the Virgin Mary that was used for the Easter Sunday morning prayer. Details will follow but please put that date on your calendars.

As we approach the month of May, it will be very soon that we will bid farewell to Fr. Ton. I am sure that he is anxious to know where he will be assigned and excited to start there. His new assignment will begin on July 1st. His last weekend with us will be June 25th and 26th. We will have a chance after each Mass that weekend to wish him well. I have not yet had a chance to plan it but I am sure that it will all come together.

At the celebration of the parish's Feast Day, some of you may have met Fr. Roy Belocura. He came to visit and have a chat with me. I announced then that he may be one of the prospective candidates to be our new associate pastor. Several months ago, I was asked by the Archdiocese if I would consider welcoming as my new associate pastor one of the extern priests who is in the process of incardination. I responded that I would be open to the possibility and I was given the names of two priests.

Fr. Roy was one of the two. He is currently assigned to St. Mary's in Des Plaines. He has been in the process of incardination for several years now. As part of the process, he is required to have a second parish experience before he completes the incardination process. It was a fortunate coincidence that Fr. Roy was able to come on the day of our Feast Day and meet several parishioners.

I met one on one with the other candidate who is Fr. Erasto Nyoni. He is currently at St. Kieran and is also required to go through a second parish experience before becoming incardinated.

In case anyone is wondering, an extern priest is one who comes to a diocese from a different diocese. In some cases, an extern priest is "on loan" from his home diocese for a set amount of time. After that time, the extern priest returns to his home diocese.

In some cases, though, extern priests come to a particular diocese requesting to join the diocese and become one of its priests. That is, he wishes to switch dioceses. In this case, he enters into a process known as “incardination.” It is a process that can take several years as he is asked to serve in several parishes before he is formally accepted. If he is accepted, he makes a promise of obedience to the local bishop—in our case, Cardinal Cupich. After that, he is officially received and recognized as one of the priests of the Archdiocese. Both Fr. Roy and Fr. Erasto are in this process.

Again, I had the chance to meet with the two extern priests who may be candidates for the next associate pastor. Both are fine men and I am confident that either one will fit very well here at the parish. I am also confident that I would get along well in the rectory with either one. I have notified the Archdiocese which one I prefer. But, at this point, everything remains up in the air. The Office of Externs of the Archdiocese will make the recommendations to the Cardinal. However, it is the Cardinal who ultimately will be the one to make the appointment. Until I get a letter appointing one or the other as associate pastor, I cannot say for certain if anyone will be assigned to our parish as of July 1st.


If one of them is assigned here, though, we could expect that it would be a minimum of two years at the end of which he would be incardinated. Once incardinated, there is a possibility for him to choose to stay on longer as the associate pastor. But, for now, let us just keep it all in prayer.

As we can see, there are busy and full times ahead of us as a parish. Our family of faith is never without its hustle and bustle of activity. Let us look forward to the days ahead as we continue to rejoice in the new life we have been given in the Resurrection of our Lord!

People would ask me, "where can we find good Vietnamese food around here?" "Well, I haven't found one yet," I would say. Since I cannot find one, I am opening one. ☺ "For real!?" Yes, it is for real! Stop by the South parking lot – behind the Devine Center

on **May 8, from 6pm to 9:30pm** and see. There will be amazing selections of three regions of Vietnamese on food and beverages available to feast and celebrate the Mother's Day.

Where does this idea come from?

Pope Francis has chosen the theme for the Synod—"For a **Synodal Church: Communion, Participation, and Mission.**"

The three dimensions of the theme are communion, participation, and mission. These three are interconnected, enriched and oriented one another.

"à **Communion:** By his gracious will, God gathers us together as diverse peoples of one faith, through the covenant that he offers to his people. The communion we share finds its deepest roots in the love and unity of the Trinity. It is Christ who reconciles us to the Father and unites us with each other in the Holy Spirit. Together, we are inspired by listening to the Word of God, through the living Tradition of the Church, and grounded in the *sensus fidei* that we share. We all have a role to play in discerning and living out God's call for his people.

à **Participation:** A call for the involvement of all who belong to the People of God – laity, consecrated and ordained – to engage in the exercise of deep and respectful listening to one another. This listening creates space for us to hear the Holy Spirit together and guides our aspirations for the Church of the Third Millennium. Participation is based on the fact that all the faithful are qualified and are called to serve one another through the gifts they have each received from the Holy Spirit. In a synodal Church the whole community, in the free and rich diversity of its members, is called together to *pray, listen, analyze, dialogue, discern and offer advice on making pastoral decisions* which correspond as closely as possible to God's will (ICT, *Syn.*, 67-68). Genuine efforts must be made to ensure the inclusion of those at the margins

or who feel excluded.

à **Mission:** The Church exists to evangelize. We can never be centered on ourselves. Our mission is to witness the love of God in the midst of the whole human family. This Synodal Process has a deep missionary dimension to it. It is intended to enable the Church to better witness to the Gospel, especially with those who live on the spiritual, social, economic, political, geographical, and existential peripheries of our world. In this way, synodality is a path by which the Church can more fruitfully fulfil her mission of evangelization in the world, as a leaven at the service of the coming of God's kingdom." Vatican website.

Inspired by Synod and the Pope's invitation, Fr. Tirso and I are trying to build a ministry that will help to evangelize the Vietnamese in the Southwest suburbs of Chicago. We are having one Viet Mass per month. Usually, it is the second Sunday of the month at 4:30pm followed by dinner at the Devine Center. In May, the mass will be at 4:30pm in the Church followed by Mother's Day Celebration with much food and live music. All are welcome! You will experience more of the universal church; have the most authentic Viet food with the best prices ever!



Care for Creation *"The earth is the Lord's and everything in it"*

In linking respect for human life and dignity with care for the natural world, Pope Francis follows in the footsteps of both Pope Benedict XVI and St. John Paul II, who noted that "respect for life and for the dignity of the human person extends also to the rest of creation, which is called to join man in praising God" (*Message for the 1990 World Day of Peace*).

The efforts of all three are rooted in Scripture and longstanding Catholic teachings. Those teachings remind us that when we don't responsibly care for God's creation, it's the poor who suffer most. Pollution, food and water insecurity, and conflicts over declining resources first affect those on the margins - "the least of these" Jesus entrusts to our particular care. There's an "intimate relationship between the poor and the fragility of the planet" (LS, no. 16), and we have a responsibility to live out our solidarity with the poor in concrete ways.

What one thing can we change right now that will make a difference to God's incredible creation today, tomorrow and every day after?


