ST. ISIDORE, THE FARMER

May 15th is a big deal in my hometown of Lucban in the Philippines. It is the feast day of one of the town's patron saints — St. Isidore the Farmer. Over the last two years, much of the festivities had to be scaled down and limited because of the COVID cases in the town.

Thanks be to God, this year the town has been able to resume much of its faith life and devotion. The town of Lucban has always been a very strong Catholic town producing many vocations to the priesthood and religious life. It is good to see the town celebrating in full force the feast day of St. Isidore the Farmer.

St. Isidore was a farmer of the 12th and 13th centuries. Born in Madrid, Spain, he is known as the patron saint of farmers. Along with his wife St. Maria, St. Isidore is still honored in many parts of the world. He has a very interesting story teaching us the lesson of always putting God first in our lives.

It is said that St. Isidore initially had the reputation of being a lazy and irresponsible farmer. The reason for this was that instead of going straight to work on his farm in the morning, he would spend hours in prayer at church. The rest of the farmers would wake up before dawn and even in those early hours they would already be hard at work.

Yet, before going to his own fields, St. Isidore would stop by the church to attend Mass, pray, and even do some service for the parish. It would only be towards the middle of the day when St. Isidore would actually arrive at his fields to start work. As a result, his fellow farmers branded him as lazy. They ridiculed him as one who would never be successful as a farmer and never be able to provide for the needs of his family. However, this is where the miracle of St. Isidore's life touches at the heart of the message.

While it is true that St. Isidore spent hours going to church and praying before starting his farm work, his fields always managed to produce the biggest and best harvest. St. Isidore's harvest always put the other farmers to shame. They could not believe that they were proven wrong about St. Isidore. As a

result, St. Isidore's harvest usually provided for not only his family but basically the entire town. What was the reason?



The story goes that God was so impressed with the way St. Isidore always put his relationship with God first above anything else. Because of this, God would send his angels to St. Isidore's fields to do the work needed while the saint was spending time with God at church. The

divine intervention created the miracle of such a great and abundant harvest each and every time. It was God's reward to St. Isidore for his personal fidelity to his relationship with God.

St. Isidore stands as a clear reminder to us all of how we are rewarded with grace beyond our imagination whenever we put our relationship with God first above everything else. When God truly is at the center of our lives, we receive abundant graces and blessings in ways we may never have imagined. St. Isidore again reminds us to keep our relationship with God first and everything else will follow according to God's design.

St. Isidore became one of the patron saints of my hometown of Lucban because the original settlers were mainly farmers. To this day, there are still many farmers in the town. Every year on May 15th, there is a grand fiesta. The celebration actually begins days and sometimes even a month prior to the date of the feast day.

As part of the celebration in honor of St. Isidore, the townsfolk of Lucban put up elaborate displays of their harvest. Ground rice is colored, steamed, and



formed into floral patterns. These are known as “kiping” and the entire festival is known as the “Pahiyas Festival” (the word “pahiyas” is a local term that refers to the act of decorating the home in a festive manner). Since it is made out of

ground rice, the “kiping” are actually edible. At the end of the day on May 15th, all are welcome to take the pieces of “kiping” home to enjoy. The “kiping” can either be grilled or deep fried which creates a tasty rice cake treat.


People are also encouraged to take any of the produce that is displayed in front of peoples’ homes. All of this is seen as an act of thanksgiving for the blessings received and a way to share those blessings with others. St. Isidore did the same in his life so the town of Lucban simply follows the example of its patron saint.



May St. Isidore inspire us to be just as focused on our relationship with God and grateful for the blessings God will shower upon us!

HOW THE BLESSED MOTHER HAS AFFECTED MY LIFE

I was asked the question, “How has the Blessed Mother affected my life?” An appropriate question with May quickly approaching. I sat pondering this and thought how in the world can I answer. Surprisingly thoughts flooded my mind with how this beautiful woman has played such a huge part in my life. Thank you, Fr. Ton, for bringing this to me. I am honored and you must have known I needed a boost to know just exactly how blessed I am.

I was brought up in a very Catholic home. We were “strongly encouraged” to attend Church and pray to the Blessed Mother and of course our Lord. I joined The Children of Mary which meant every first Saturday you arose early and go to mass, sing in the choir and then you could be chosen to carry the Blessed Mother statue for May crowning. Oh, how I wanted to carry her and that I did.

As I continued through adolescence and young adulthood, there were many challenges with alcoholism and drug abuse in our home. On each of those “explosions” I would just pray the Hail Mary to make it stop. She brought me peace, strength and courage while keeping us safe. To this day, whether it is facing a root canal, doctor appointment, car accident or just not knowing what to do in a given situation, without thinking I find myself turning to our Blessed Mother and I pray the Hail Mary repeatedly until whatever the event is passes.

Of course, I was also blessed with a devoted Busia (polish grandma), mother, and two very faithful sisters who helped me grow in faith. Most recently our family has been desperately challenged. My oldest sister passed away not too long ago and before she did, she made me promise to take care of her cement statue of the Blessed Mother. So, I brought her home cleaned her up and repainted her. She sat in my yard so beautifully. One day as I prayed for Mary’s assistance once again and pleaded for “what should I do” kind of thing I heard a huge crash. It actually shook the house. We investigated it and found that this couple hundred-pound statue just fell.

No wind. No storm. No one in the yard. That I feel was a sign for me to increase my prayers to Mary and that everything will be okay. Well, we are still waiting for that but our Mother’s strength and love has made me stronger.

As we celebrate Mother’s Day let’s remember our true Mother, pay her homage and ask that she watch over our earthly moms, grandmothers, aunts and anyone who acts in the role of a mother.

I share all of this so that during the month of May we might increase our prayers to the Blessed Mother or maybe even just start praying to her. Go ahead try it. Her arms are just waiting to embrace you. It takes 30 days to make a habit and 30 days to break one. So, what are you doing for the Month of May?

FAMILY FAITH SHARING

In today's Gospel, we hear Jesus give His disciples a new commandment: "Love one another". John's Gospel (13:31-33a,34-35) does not present a sentimental view of love, but rather a type of love that is shown in service and sacrifice. Jesus tells His disciples that all will know that they are His disciples because of the love they show for one another. This description of the early Christian community will be repeated in the Acts of the Apostles: "See how they love one another". Love is at the heart of Christianity. Is love the first word your family members use to describe your interactions? In the love we have for one another, difficult and challenging as it may sometimes be, we find Jesus. Think of a time when your family was together this week. When is it less difficult to show love to family members? When is it more difficult? When love is difficult, what do we do? Jesus just didn't tell us to love one another...He showed us how. In what ways did Jesus show us how to love?



The following is a copy of a Letter to the Editor that was sent by Crisis Center Executive Director Pam Kostecki to local media. We would like to share it.

The recent tragedy in Tinley Park where a 17-year-old high school senior girl lost her life to domestic violence, allegedly at the hands of her abusive father, is weighing heavy on our hearts and our community.

Domestic violence can impact anyone. It's all about exerting power and control over another person, and it's never OK. Every nine seconds a woman is beaten, yet despite increased awareness of domestic violence, it continues to be a public health crisis. Major sports leagues, television networks and our local governments have spoken out about zero tolerance, yet cases of domestic violence continue to grow at epidemic proportions.

The Crisis Center for South Suburbia is here to support victims of domestic violence, **including children and youth.** We work hard to provide domestic violence prevention and education at local high schools through our Safe Start program, but as a community we need to be vigilant and watch for signs of domestic violence, especially because it's not always at the hands of an intimate partner. We need to be there when someone is in trouble before another life is lost or traumatized.

If you are a victim of domestic violence and don't feel safe, we are here to help. If you feel isolated and alone because someone is controlling you, reach out. I want to live in a world free from violence, don't you? Call our 24-hotline for support, emergency shelter, resources, or just to talk. Our help and services are free and confidential.

“Care for Creation” and Laudato Si’ (Part I)




- ◆ The Pope’s encyclical, *Laudato Si’*, is a text of landmark significance in Catholic Social Teaching.

- ◆ By taking personal action and reducing excessive consumption and waste in our lives, we can meet our obligation to reduce our impact on the environment while creating a sustainable future for generations to follow.
