WELL DONE, MY GOOD AND FAITHFUL SERVANT

Some of you may already know, but I would like to share once again that after many years of dedicated service to St. Julie parish (48 to be exact) as our Coordinator of Faith Formation of Youth and someone who has guided thousands of children and

families in their faith formation, Pat Kmak will be retiring at the end of June.

Pat had been considering this for some time and after a period of discernment, prayer, and reflection, she submitted her Letter of Retirement. With sadness, I accepted her decision and then needed to begin the search for someone to take on this important role in our parish as our planning for Faith Formation for this Fall has already begun. The position was then posted on the Archdiocesan website.

It is difficult to imagine that Pat has been in the ministry of faith formation for the entire history of our parish community. She shared that when she began at the start of the parish there were 2,000 children in the program. It is almost unfathomable, yet amazing, that she was able to manage a program of that size and that she has remained committed to that ministry to the present day! She must have had a great support system at home with her husband, Len, and her own three children. In a day and age when people move so often from one job to another, Pat has shown an extreme dedication and loyalty to the Church and to the parish. She has been and should continue to be an inspiration to us as we grow in our own discipleship.

For those who know Pat, you have undoubtedly encountered her gentle and loving presence. She truly is a person of faith and one who has lived out the wisdom of our patron saint – St. Julie Billiart. Pat celebrates every moment of life because she, like St. Julie, knows *how good is our good God*. For this, I am sure that Pat would be the first to say that her accomplishments are not her own. Instead, whatever she may have accomplished was only possible because the grace and spirit of God was at work.

Understandably, after many years of working, Pat shared that her energy level is not where it once had been. This was part of the motivation that led her to make the difficult decision to retire. But after all of those years of hard work and dedication, it is a very well-earned reward. She is looking forward to spending quality time with her children and grandchildren. Of course, just because she is retiring from her position on staff does not mean that it is an end to her relationship with the parish. Pat has been and always will be an essential part of our parish community.

Pat is a wealth of knowledge when it comes to the history of the parish community. She was here from the very beginning and has seen it all! She was here when the first pastor, Fr. William Devine, was entrusted with the task to build a parish community in this area. She was here when Masses were celebrated at the local bank at 159th & Harlem and was here when land took shape from a huge field to what is now several buildings that make up our campus. Pat will always have a place at St. Julie's just as much as we can remain confident that the parish will forever be a part of Pat's life.

Yes, it will be bittersweet to see Pat turn over the reins of our Faith Formation program to someone else. It will be the end of an era. The person to follow after her will have very big shoes to fill, so to speak. At the same time, though, let us focus on the countless contributions that Pat has made to the life of the parish and I know we will celebrate and give thanks. Pat's work here has touched the lives of thousands of youth and their families, encouraging them to become committed disciples. If each of us have only a fraction of Pat's spirituality and dedication to forming others as disciples, think of how much growth we can see in our parish!

Not only has Pat had an impact upon our youth and their families, but just think of the hundreds of Catechists and Grade Level Coordinators on whom she has imparted her wisdom and spirituality. And, undoubtedly, Pat herself would say that those same Catechists and Coordinators have impacted her life in a myriad of ways. There have been many former students who have grown up and become Catechists and even a Grade Level Coordinator at St. Julie.

At this time, we are planning to have a retirement celebration for Pat the weekend of July 23/24. We are in the planning stages right now, but once finalized, we will be sharing the information with the entire parish. In all honesty, being ever so humble, Pat would undoubtedly prefer that no attention be given to her. However, we will not give her that option and neither will her family. They realize the enormity of her gift to the parish and wish to share in this celebration. The parish needs and wants to show our appreciation and admiration for a woman who has given so much to this faith community and to our God. Pat's many accomplishments need proper recognition! Watch future bulletins for news of her celebration!

From the post on the Archdiocesan website a candidate has come forward for the position and is endorsed by Pat herself. The candidate has a young family and regularly comes to Mass on the weekends. This person has also worked with Pat in the Faith Formation program ever since joining the parish several years ago. This candidate comes with Pat's highest recommendations and would be her first choice for the person to follow her. I have already spoken over the phone and met in person with this candidate several times now. In fact, I have offered the position and the candidate has accepted. I am grateful that there is a strong candidate to fill her shoes!



FAMILY FAITH SHARING

Jesus promises His disciples that He will send an advocate or Intercessor who will who will remind the disciples of everything that Jesus taught them and bring them peace. Jesus is preparing His disciples in advance for His absence so that they will continue to believe in Him and not feel all alone after His return to the Father.

As our celebration of the Easter season is coming to an end, the Liturgy reminds us that Jesus remains with us through the Holy Spirit, who teaches us everything we need to know, reminding us of all that Jesus taught, bringing us peace. Parents are always helping their children prepare for something, whether that is getting ready for school, preparing for a test or making plans to go on a vacation. As a family, talk about the kinds of events you have prepared for together. Share why it is important to prepare for special events in our lives. Then, read today's gospel and talk about how Jesus prepared His disciples for His death and resurrection and how He wanted them to be prepared for what would happen and that they would be able to believe. Talk about how, as a family, you can prepare for Pentecost, when we celebrate the coming of the Holy Spirit.



Celebrating the Anniversary of Pope Francis' transformational encyclical, Laudato Si'

"Care for Creation" and *Laudato Si'* (Part I)

The Anniversary of *Laudato Si'*

This week is the anniversary of Pope Francis' encyclical *Laudato Si'*: a text of landmark significance and an appeal for us to rethink our relationship with nature.

- He reframes the environmental dialogue from a political discussion into language of faith. Creation, the natural world around us, is recognized as a precious gift from God to be revered by all.
- The Holy Father invites us to become aware and reflect deeply on the unsustainable environmental degradation around us and its consequences.
- The Pope asks us to examine our lifestyles through sound ecological virtues, greater simplicity and less focus on material things.
- By reducing excessive consumption and waste in our lives, we can significantly improve care for Creation.
- Francis also points out the scientific consensus that human activity is the main contributor to a warming climate and warns of a worsening crisis. Without change, additional harmful sea level rise, droughts, and negatively impacted crop yields are expected.
- Since the livelihoods of the poor will be most impacted, it becomes a moral imperative to take action.
- Pope Francis urges us to take action to mitigate these outcomes by working to protect our common home and by eliminating wastefulness in our lives.



Important details about the Monthly 50/50 Raffle:



- **Must** be 18 years old to participate.
- \$5 per entry (*Entries **must** be submitted in our preprinted salmon colored envelopes **only**, with contact information filled out completely on the blank lines provided.*)
- No limit to the number of entries per person per month, but each \$5 entry must be submitted in a separate envelope (**Any amount in a single envelope that exceeds \$5 will automatically be considered a donation to the general fund, and that envelope will still be considered a single entry.**)
- Winner of each monthly drawing will receive half of the funds received that month via a check from the parish.
- All entry dollars received within the current month will always be included in the current monthly drawing. (For those who receive monthly envelope packets: The name of the month is also preprinted on your raffle envelopes due to a printer requirement, but we will disregard this date and include your entry during the month it is submitted.)
- We cannot accommodate any special instructions, regardless of any notes written on the envelope. (*i.e. we will **not** hold funds for a future month's drawing.*)
- 50/50 Raffle entry dollars are not considered a donation for tax purposes and are **not** tax deductible. (These entry dollars are not entered into our database and will not be included in end of the year tax statements.)
- Please refrain from adding tape, stickers, return address labels, etc. to the back of the envelopes as a "sealer". They are "pull tab" envelopes, which makes sealing & opening very easy. Adding all the "sticky" things, slows down the opening process, is tearing the envelopes, adds weight. This means that not all entries are then weighted the same and is causing the envelopes in the drum to stick to one another. The envelopes are used as the "tickets" and having raffle tickets all be of equal weight and size and condition, is very important!
