## ST. JUSTIN, MARTYR

This Wednesday, June 1, is the feast day of St. Justin Martyr. He was a martyr of the 2nd century. He is known as an “apologist” which simply means “defender.” St. Justin, then, defended the Catholic Christian faith during the first centuries.

In his well known written work – “The First Apology” – St. Justin writes a 68 chapter long document explaining and defending the life and practices of the early Church. Persecution was strong in that period and the Apology was meant to make it clear that the Christian faith was not a threat to the Empire. Of course, this did not stop the persecutions.

Interestingly, there is a part in the Apology where St. Justin describes the structure of the weekly worship of the first Christians. The early Christians were accused of being cannibals who ate the flesh and drank the blood of Jesus. St. Justin wrote to show that this was not the case.

The structure St. Justin describes, though, follows the identical structure of the Eucharist as we know it today. This is a testimony to the lasting Tradition that enriches our Catholic faith. If we study the text of Chapter 67 of The First Apology of St. Justin Martyr, we will see clearly that we are part of a faith community that has celebrated Christ’s presence in the same way for over 2,000 years.

*And on the day called Sunday, all who live in cities or in the country gather together to one place, and the memoirs of the [apostles](#) or the writings of the [prophets](#) are read, as long as time permits; then, when the reader has ceased, the president verbally instructs, and exhorts to the imitation of these [good](#) things.*

From these words of St. Justin, we see the structure of the “Liturgy of the Word.” The “memoirs of the of the apostles or the writings of the prophets” refer obviously to the Books of the Old and New Testament. From the very beginnings of our faith, we see that our Eucharistic celebration has been rooted and grounded in the Word of God. The Scriptures contain the stories of God’s Family and so they are our stories as well. The readings from Scripture –

even from before the time of St. Justin – are followed by the leader of the community giving instructions as to how the faithful can live out God’s Word.

*Then we all rise together and [pray](#), and, as we before said, when our [prayer](#) is ended, bread and wine and water are brought, and the president in like manner offers [prayers](#) and thanksgivings, according to his ability, and the people assent, saying [Amen](#);*

In this short section, we see that there was already a time when the faithful would communally offer prayers. We see this today in the part of the Mass that we call “General Intercessions.” We follow the example of the first Christians and pray for our own needs and the needs of all the world.

This, of course, is followed by the Preparation of the Gifts which, again, we see has been a part of the Eucharistic celebration almost from the very beginning of our Church. Bread and wine are brought forward and the presider of the assembly offers a consecratory prayer on behalf of the community to which all joyfully respond “Amen.” The collective “amen” is an affirmation that what has been celebrated and made real truly is what it is.

*and there is a distribution to each, and a participation of that over which thanks have been given, and to those who are absent a portion is sent by the [deacons](#).*

Communion with the consecrated bread and wine has been a central part in the Eucharistic celebration from the very beginning. From the time of the first Christians until now, the Church has taken very seriously the moment when the faithful come forward to take Communion. It is a moment when we and Christ are made one – in every sense of what that means. For this reason, we must take it seriously and not allow that moment to be empty of meaning.

*And they who are well to do, and willing, give what each thinks fit; and what is collected is deposited with the president, who succours the orphans and widows and those who, through sickness or any other [cause](#), are in want, and those who are in bonds and the strangers sojourning among us, and in a word takes care of all who are in need.*

We see that the early Church also took seriously the responsibility of taking care of one another. It became the community’s duty through its leaders to make sure that everyone’s basic needs were met.

But Sunday is the day on which we all hold our common assembly, because it is the first day on which [God](#), having wrought a change in the darkness and matter, made the world; and [Jesus Christ](#) our Saviour on the same day rose from the dead. For He was crucified on the day before that of Saturn (Saturday); and on the day after that of Saturn, which is the day of the Sun, having appeared to His [apostles](#) and [disciples](#), He taught them these things, which we have submitted to you also for your consideration.

Since the time of the early Church, the faithful have been gathering on Sunday for the Eucharist. Sunday is considered as the Lord's Day. It was on Sunday that Jesus rose from the dead. For this very reason, Sunday is a consecrated day. In Catholic theology, Sunday is not only considered as the first day of the week but it is oftentimes referred to as the "eighth day." The number eight has become symbolic of God's transforming power that makes all things new. This is what we come together to celebrate each Sunday.


Thanks to St. Justin, we see that we are part of a much greater reality than just our own.

# THE STUMP OF JESSE

## SIMPLE, BUT PACKED WITH RICH THEOLOGY

There are many prayers and songs that we pray and sing very often but have we pondered much on the beauty of the text? Take Gloria as an example. The song starts with, “**Gloria to God** in the highest, and on earth **peace** to people of **good will**.” On the night of the Lord’s birth, we hear a heavenly choirs of angels singing, “**Gloria to God** in the highest, and on earth **peace** to those on whom his **favor rests**.” This was recorded in Luke’s Gospel. What do these phrases try to convey?

- (1) The word “glory” in the original Greek language is defined an “opinion, judgment, or view,” and is exuded a reverent and majestic perspective that motivates praise and worship. It represents a most glorious condition, most exalted state, and of the splendor and brightness that defines glory, is the kingly majesty of the Messiah.
- (2) We give glory to God the Father, God the son/ Jesus Christ, and God the Holy Spirit. Another Greek word for us to know is “Theos.” It is used to express the Godhead and spoken of the only and true God.

So, we give glory – the most respective praise and worship to the only and true God. If we do so, what do we get? Well, we get the peace that comes from the Lord – “Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you. Not as the world gives do I give to you. Let not your hearts be troubled, neither let them be afraid (John 14:27).” Isn’t these phrases beautiful? When we give God praise and thanksgiving – because it is truly right and just – we will have the peace resting in us and the world.

St. Gianna Molla is a splendid example of singing this song perfectly in her life. What do we know about her?

“In less than 40 years, Gianna Beretta Molla became a pediatric physician, a wife, a mother and a saint! She was born in Magenta near Milano, the tenth of Alberto and Maria Beretta’s 13 children. An active member of the St. Vincent de Paul Society and a leader in the Catholic Action movement, Gianna also enjoyed skiing and mountain climbing. She earned

degrees in medicine and surgery from the University of Pavia, eventually specializing in pediatrics. In 1952, Gianna opened a clinic in the small town of Mesero, where she met engineer Pietro Molla. Shortly before their 1955 marriage, Gianna wrote to Pietro: “Love is the most beautiful sentiment that the Lord has put into the soul of men and women.” In the next four years the Mollas had three children: Pierluigi, Mariolina, and Laura. Two pregnancies following ended in miscarriage. Early in her final pregnancy, doctors discovered that Gianna had both a child and a tumor in her uterus. She allowed the surgeons to remove the tumor but **not** to perform the complete hysterectomy that they recommended, which would have killed the child. Seven months later in April 1962, Gianna Emanuela Molla was born at the hospital in Monza, but post-operative complications resulted in an infection for her mother. The following week Gianna Molla died at home, and was buried in the cemetery of Mesero. Gianna Emanuela went on to become a physician herself. Gianna Beretta Molla was beatified in 1994 and canonized 10 years later. Her liturgical feast is celebrated on April 28.”

St. Gianna has given God glory on earth through her vocation as a faithful Christian mother. What did she have? She had the peace resting in her and brings her to heaven. What is the common trap that people usually fall into? Well, instead of glorifying God we glory ourselves and make us the center of everything? What will we get? Something, but certainly not the peace of the Lord. As we are celebrating Pentecost next Sunday, we pray that the Lord gives us graces to glory Him through our vocations.







Due to HIPAA privacy regulations, only the patient or designated family member may notify the parish of a hospitalization, if you request a priest visit, communion or to be placed on the sick list in the bulletin for three weeks.
