## **DIRECTOR OF LIFELONG FAITH FORMATION**

This week, I wanted to share an update in regards to the replacement for Pat Kmak. She is a very special and giving person and has been a tremendous gift to the parish. No one will ever be able to replace her. But, there is still the need to find someone to take over Faith Formation.

I had mentioned previously that there was an applicant who had surfaced shortly after the position was posted. This week, I am happy to announce that one of our parishioners has accepted the task. His name is Nathan Roy. He comes highly recommended by Pat Kmak and I am excited to bring him on board.

Nathan and his family have been parishioners for several years after moving to the area from the North side. He and his wife have two young daughters. Parishioners may have even seen them at Mass since they are faithful attendees every week. Even before moving here and joining the parish, Nathan has been a catechist for many years. He is currently a teacher in a Catholic high school but his passion has always been toward forming people into strong disciples. I am happy that he accepted the position and will officially begin starting this July 1.

When Nathan begins, his title will be different. It will be Director of Lifelong Faith Formation. In speaking with Nathan, he was very much interested and excited about the position.

So, what is the difference between the position previously and what is now? A lifelong approach to faith formation has a more encompassing task in regards to teaching the faith and helping people to grow in discipleship. There is really a “womb to tomb” focus to faith formation in this new position.

The Archdiocese had adopted the approach as a result of the Renew My Church process. Nathan and I have talked about this approach.

With a focus on lifelong faith formation, the task of the Director will be to focus on people’s growth in the faith starting from baptism. A lot of times parishes

lead parents to the moment of baptism through a preparation session. However, after a child is baptized, unfortunately some parents/families become disengaged with the faith. Too often in these cases, the faith is not revisited until the child reaches the age for First Communion. Then, parents/families will enroll children in faith formation classes.

After First Communion, there are some instances when parents/families become disengaged once again. The faith is revisited when children reach the age when they realize they will need to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation. Then, too often, after Confirmation there is a tendency to think that children have “graduated” from the faith and no longer need to be formed in it. This creates several gaps in the lives of children where the faith might be seen as something that is needed only at certain moments of one’s life. This is where the lifelong approach to faith formation comes into play.

A lifelong approach to faith formation will hopefully be able to “bridge the gaps” when a lot of parents/families and even children become disengaged from the faith. It acknowledges that the faith life begins at baptism but it does not end until the day when we are standing before God’s throne in heaven. The question becomes “what happens between those two moments?”

When Nathan begins, it will be part of his task to look at ways in which we might be able to keep parents/families engaged between baptism and the formal start of faith formation classes. He will also be responsible for continuing a program through which the parish can still assist parents in their responsibility as the “First Teachers of the Faith.”

Nathan will also give attention to the continuing faith formation of teens post-Confirmation. His position will also require him to collaborate with the Young Adult ministry in the area to help foster an engagement with the faith especially in the years when young adults go off to college. He will also be giving a lot of time and energy to adult faith formation through RCIA and other opportunities for adults to grow in the faith.

Having described all of that, it might be apparent that Nathan will have a big task on his hands. I do not

expect him to get it all “squared away” in a month or even a year after he begins this new position. It will take a while. It may even involve several attempts. But, I have become more and more convinced that a lifelong approach to faith formation is an essential to helping all members of our faith community remain aware that discipleship is a lifelong commitment.


Obviously, one of the first things Nathan will have to tackle when he starts will be the faith formation program for our youth. For parents and families who have been wondering about that, please be patient and communication will be made as soon as possible. The position of Director of Lifelong Faith Formation is a new approach which will require a lot of pieces to put together. I am confident in Nathan’s abilities and skills to get things organized. The details regarding the next year’s program will be shared when they are ready.

For the time being, let us thank God that someone came forward so quickly. Please join me in praying for Nathan as he prepares to begin his role as our new Director of Lifelong Faith Formation.

Let us also continue praying for Pat as she prepares for retirement. In the spirit of our patroness, St. Julie, let us always be aware of how good is our good God! Just a reminder to save July 24 on your calendar to celebrate Pat Kmak and her 48 years of selfless service to the parish.



# ...FROM DEACON JOHN BENZ



## HAPPY BIRTHDAY TO US ALL!

This Sunday the Catholic Church celebrates the Feast of Pentecost, which is sometimes referred to as the birthday of the Church.

Why is it called that? Because it marks the beginning of the Apostles work together as they continued the mission and ministry of Jesus. The Apostles were our Church's first bishops, and St. Peter our first pope. Within a very few years, priests and deacons were ordained for the growing Church to help the bishops in their increasingly demanding work.

The Feast of Pentecost recalls God's sending forth of His Holy Spirit upon the first disciples, inspiring and strengthening them to carry Jesus's gospel message to the entire world. (You can read about the first Pentecost in the second chapter of the Book of the Acts of the Apostles.)

Pentecost also serves as the foundation for our Catholic Sacrament of Confirmation. In the Sacrament of Confirmation, the presider (usually a bishop) anoints the head of the confirmandi and calls down the Holy Spirit upon the candidate. In the Sacrament of Confirmation, we receive the gifts of the Holy Spirit:

**Understanding** - the ability to perceive and recognize the presence of God's Holy Spirit and love all around us.

**Counsel** - the gift of being able to listen to others and to offer words of encouragement, insight, and hope to them.

**Fortitude** - the staying power that allows us to persevere and endure hardships for the sake of the Gospel and others.

**Knowledge** - the ability to use our experience in life for the benefit of ourselves and others.

**Fear of the Lord** - the humility to understand that one's proper relationship with God must be one of reverence, respect, and divine love.

**Piety** - the ability to respond to God's holy presence by allowing ourselves to be conformed to God.

Both Holy Scripture and the Catechism teach us that God the Father sends the Holy Spirit upon us to lead us to Jesus. Jesus, in turn, shares with us his own privileged relationship with our God the Father.

Of course, few of us throw birthday parties to celebrate the Feast of Pentecost, but maybe we should. For those of us who have been confirmed, what gifts in our lives have had a bigger effect on us than the gifts of the Holy Spirit?

The gifts of the Holy Spirit are powerful, but they are not given to us principally for our own good. Rather, they are given to us for sake of the whole Church. We are stewards of those gifts, and we are called to share them just as we are called to share all the gifts of our lives - for the common good of all.

We can do this, of course, only with the grace and help of our loving and merciful God.

Let us pray in thanksgiving this Pentecost for all the ways that the Holy Spirit and God's Church touch our lives. **Happy birthday to us all!**

## FAMILY FAITH SHARING

As part of His Farewell Discourse on Holy Thursday, Jesus tells His disciples that He will send the Holy Spirit to guide them after He ascends to the Father. So, Jesus appears to them and gives them the gift of the Holy Spirit. (John 20:19-23) The Easter season then concludes with today's celebration, the feast of Pentecost, on which the Church celebrates the descent of the Holy Spirit upon the frightened Apostles gathered in the Upper Room in Jerusalem. This event marks the beginning of the Church, and the Gospel reminds us that the Church is to be a reconciling presence in the world. No matter how strong a temptation, no matter how puzzling a problem that faces you, no matter a crisis in family life, whatever it may be, you have one approach, the simple prayer: "Come Holy Spirit." When you say that prayer, the Spirit will be with you, not just give you light to see what you should do, but more importantly, giving you the power to do it. Today is a great time to share a family celebration of reconciliation. Talk together about how Jesus gave us the gift of the Holy Spirit to help us in the work of forgiveness and to bring peace.




