SO LONG, FAREWELL, AUF WIEDERSEHEN, GOODBYE!

For many of us, we may remember that line from the classic “Sound of Music.” That line oftentimes comes into my head when I come to moments such as this weekend. As we all know by now, this is Fr. Ton’s last weekend with us as Associate

Pastor of St. Julie. Saying goodbye is never easy but we also know that it is not a permanent farewell. We will see Fr. Ton from time to time. I will see him at priest gatherings and even when I may visit the cathedral – especially since the other new Associate Pastor moving to the Cathedral is a friend of mine. For parishioners, Fr. Ton will be around from time to time. I will keep him on our “Need a Priest” list. So even as we say farewell to Fr. Ton we know that is not going to be forever until we see him next.

A parishioner recently asked me why priests have to be reassigned so often. I believe I wrote on this very question once before but perhaps it bears repeating for our benefit this weekend. In a nutshell, priests are moved around so often to ensure that we always have a “missionary spirit.” A missionary is one who is called upon to share God’s Good News to everyone who needs to hear it. Our task as priests is always to assist people to find the way that will lead them to eternal life – the path of Jesus. As is oftentimes the case, missionaries move from place to place just as Jesus and his first disciples had done. And, a missionary needs to be ready to move at a moment’s notice if that is what the Spirit of God requires.

In my 26 years as a priest, I have had 6 assignments prior to St. Julie parish. My average time would be about 3 1/2 years. Moving around from parish to parish has helped me to grow in ways I never imagined. Each assignment is different and teaches specific lessons. What was true for one parish community might not be the same for another. So, moving around has helped me to “stay on my toes,” so to speak, and keep things as fresh as possible. As difficult as it is to say goodbye to one community, I have found that it has made me a better priest. The same is true for many of my fellow priests. Moreover,

having been in several assignments myself, it has also become a clear reminder to me that the mission is not my own. Rather, the mission belongs to God. It is God’s work that a priest is called to do and he is called to do it wherever God needs him to do it.

It is never easy to say farewell – for the priest and parishioner alike. There have been assignments that I hated to leave especially when I poured out my heart and soul for a particular faith community and that same faith community poured out its heart and soul for me. But it is an inevitable part of the life of every priest and parish. Goodbyes don’t have to be a permanent thing.

So, please join me in wishing Fr. Ton the best of God’s graces as he moves on to his next assignment at Holy Name Cathedral. I think that we can all agree that his energy and enthusiasm for the faith has been a tremendous gift to this parish. Personally, I have found him to be a huge asset to our faith community. He works hard and loves God with his whole heart, soul, mind, and body. That same love for God is the foundation for his love of each and every one of God’s people. All of that has been very evident in the way Fr. Ton has exercised his ministry here at St. Julie for the past 3 years. We are all better people for having met and known Fr. Ton.

I express my gratitude to Fr. Ton for all of his hard work especially in the time I have been pastor. He formed the Men’s Group to provide the men of our parish an opportunity not only for fellowship but also growth in the faith. He has worked tirelessly with our youth and teens to make sure that they remain engaged in their faith and a vital part of our community. He brought customs of faith and devotion in starting the First Friday Adoration and the First Saturday Mass. He shared his love for God’s creation by planting vegetables in the rectory garden and colorful flowers in other parts of our campus. He has enriched our experience of the Universal Church by sharing his Vietnamese culture. He also has exercised his ministry in evangelization by giving Vietnamese Catholics in the area an opportunity to be able to pray in the language they know best – something that has not been available to them because the Vietnamese Catholic ministry has all been concentrated on the North Side. I can go on and on.

But, let me summarize it all by saying that I am amazed at how much Fr. Ton has helped to bless the parish in the span of 3 years.

Yes, we will all miss Fr. Ton. Let us all wish him well. But, let us all remember that once God brings people into our lives as He has with Fr. Ton, we will always be a part of his life just as he will always be a part of ours.


For now, please join me in saying "Good luck Fr. Ton! God bless and keep showing the world how much you LOVE being a priest!"

FAMILY FAITH SHARING

Today's Gospel reading tells us Jesus began His journey to Jerusalem which will end with His ministry in Jerusalem. (Luke 9:51-62) In Jerusalem, He will meet His death but also enter into His glory. It is in Jerusalem that His disciples wait after His Ascension to be sent the Holy Spirit on Pentecost. And it is from Jerusalem that the good news is spread to

Rome and to the ends of the earth. The rest of today's reading is about the radical demands of discipleship. Jesus' unconditional commitment to God's saving work will demand of Him His life. Jesus does not want anyone to rush into discipleship because the demands of discipleship required everyone considering it to be aware of the cost, make Jesus and His mission central to his life and then go forward without looking back.

Parents are always working to help their children set priorities. As a family, talk about some simple examples of setting priorities like finishing chores before going out with friends. Explain that in this Sunday's Gospel, Jesus talks about the importance of making Him the number one priority in our lives. Talk about how going to Sunday Mass as a family is an important way of keeping God at the center of our lives. Talk about other ways that the family can make Jesus a priority.

YOU ARE CALLED!

When we think of the first disciples of Jesus, we picture quite a "motley crew." This peculiar and sometimes blundering collection of fishermen and a tax collector were to become the foundation of his Church. Jesus relied on very average human beings to build and extend the kingdom he had proclaimed. He called them forth and told them to go, to tend, and to proclaim what they had heard and seen.

We, as the baptized, are also called to carry on the mission of Jesus. We may think of ourselves as inadequate or lacking teaching skills but we know the message and it is ours to share. One great way to transmit the "good news" is by being a Catechist or Substitute Catechist in the Faith Formation Program here at St. Julie. WEEKLY STEWARDSHIP RECOMMENDATION
COMPOST



Food scraps and yard waste together currently make up about 30 percent of what we throw away, so consider composting instead. Making compost keeps these materials out of landfills where they take up space and release methane, a potent greenhouse gas. Your compost may then be used to enrich soil and reduce the need for fertilizer. For convenience, try using an airtight receptacle in your kitchen for interim storage of scraps to reduce trips to your outdoor composter.




