HAPPY FOURTH OF JULY WEEKEND!

This weekend, I wanted to take a moment to share with parishioners a sort of “state of things.” These are just a few thoughts that came to my mind to share with the larger parish especially as we now begin a new fiscal year.

1. Our financial situation coming into this new fiscal year looks hopeful. If all goes well this year, our budget is projecting that we will be “in the black.” This is promising news for us since we have not been in the black for quite some time. As good as this news may sound, though, I would like to remind parishioners that this does not mean that we are “free and clear.” We do not have much of a savings and our financial situation, though better than it has been in years, still does not give us too much of a “cushion.” In other words, we do not have much set aside for a “rainy day.” Still, with the hopeful look of things, we managed to keep the office and pastoral staff pretty much as is even with the addition of a new Director of Lifelong Faith Formation and a shared Youth Minister with St. George.
2. Perhaps one other staff change that I have not yet announced concerns Karen Calcagno who was our Bookkeeper. As of July 1, she began a new job as the Business Manager of Cardinal Joseph Bernardin School. Please join me in wishing her well.
3. Our new Associate Pastor – Fr. Roy Belocura – is with us this weekend. Some of you may have already met him since he came to visit a couple of times. However, given that this is a holiday weekend, our official welcome for him will be next weekend.
4. As I mentioned in a Midweek Moment video a couple of weeks ago, we have two young men who are in the process of completing their Eagle Scout projects. When completed, both of them will attain the highest and most prestigious ranking in the Scouts. The first of the two is Luke Rost with his project to create a memorial space dedicated to veterans and those in active service. This is nearly complete and you can already see it on the south side of our church building. Luke is waiting on a few more finishing touches before we can plan to have a

dedication ceremony. The second young man working on his Eagle Scout is Noah Moreno. He is hard at work building a Micro-Pantry which will be set up on the west side of our campus. The Micro-Pantry is meant to be stocked with non-perishable food items. Parishioners and neighbors can keep it stocked with donations. The Micro-Pantry will provide hope for people in the immediate area who, at any time, might find themselves in need of food items to get them through a slump. I am grateful to these two young men who have answered the call to be good citizens as well as good disciples of Jesus.

5. Our 50/50 Monthly Raffle seems to be going okay. It seems to be a steady income from it so it looks like we will continue with it for the time being. I am grateful for everyone who continues to support it.
6. The electronic sign project is back on track. In fact, have set a goal that the project be completed by the end of the summer. It had been delayed because we needed to figure out how to get power from the main power source on campus to the 159th Street area where the sign will be located. I am happy to say that an electrician has been found and he has assured us that not only will he be able to get power to the electronic sign but also help us fix the light posts on the north lot that have been out for a while. The sign contractor is aware of this and will resume the process of getting the required permits from the Village so that construction may begin asap.

Speaking of the parking lot, this is going to be a huge undertaking. If you have driven on our parking lot, you definitely know that it is in a very sorry state. We have potholes, deterioration, and a lot of other issues with the parking lot surface. The north lot is the worst because it is the area of our lot that gets the most traffic. The parking lot desperately needs work done. We have reached a moment where patchwork will not resolve the problem. We have already received a couple of estimates on what it will take to redo the entire parking lot surface. Sad to say, it will be a minimum of a half million dollar project. No amount of small fundraising events will ever get us close to the amount we will need. The only way we will be able to get it done soon is to do a capital campaign to raise the funds needed to do the project. I think we can all agree that the parking lot is a dire need and an essential project. Given the fact that we are close to our 50th anniversary as a parish, this would be a good

time to do a capital campaign. Hopefully, we will not only be able to do the parking lot but also raise funds to get other improvement projects done as well in other parts of our campus. Such a campaign will be an important part of our 50th anniversary planning as a way for us to prepare for the next 50 years.

This month marks the start of my third year as pastor. I cannot believe that two full years have already passed. I started here in the midst of the pandemic that caused life to come to a screeching halt. My first year here did not see much in terms of activities around the parish. As we passed that stage and resumed many of our activities, I am glad to see that, for the most part, we have returned to our vibrant and energetic parish life. I am truly grateful for everyone here in the parish. We have involvement from all ages – youth, young adult, and all other ages. We have a great staff that does great work. We pray well and we are dedicated to teaching the faith. We continue to be known for our hospitality and spirit of welcome. As I begin a new year as pastor, I pray that we will continue to respond to the call to evangelize, build community, give witness, and to form disciples.



Consider zero-waste options for picnics, BBQ and camping meals.

Reusable items add a touch of class, sensibility and significantly reduce waste. Use lightweight reusable plates, utensils, bowls, cups and cloth napkins.

Get creative with packaging...reusable containers? Of course. What about Mason jar desserts? Go heavy on finger foods: cut vegetables and mixed nuts. Wipe off food when finished and use a washable cloth bag to hold used dinnerware for dishwashing later. Reserve a bag for recyclables and a container for compostables.




