## **ANNUAL ASIAN CATHOLIC COMMUNITY MASS**

In a couple of weeks, the parish will be host to a special annual event of the Archdiocese. On Sunday, September 11th, we will be host to the Annual Asian Catholic Community Mass with

the Cardinal at 4:00pm. All the Asian Catholic communities in the entire Archdiocese of Chicago will be invited. Presiding over that Mass will be Cardinal Cupich joined by Asian priests serving in the Archdiocese. It is a special event that had started several years ago.

To give everyone a little bit of history, shortly after Cardinal Cupich was appointed to be the Archbishop of Chicago in 2014, he formed an advisory board known as the Asian Catholic Initiative (ACI). The ACI was established to be the eyes, ears, and voice of the Asian Catholic Community in the Archdiocese of Chicago. The ACI was to report to the Cardinal in regards to the pastoral needs and concerns of all Catholics who come from every Asian background. A priest was appointed to be the head of the ACI and others were chosen – priest and laity – to serve on the board. The first head of the ACI was Fr. Aloy Funtilla who, at the time, was serving as pastor of St. Hilary on the north side. After Fr. Aloy's term was completed, Fr. Phi Nguyen was appointed as the head of the ACI while he was serving as pastor of St. Henry Parish also on the north side. Fr. Phi was reappointed as the head.

Together with the chairperson of the ACI, other priests and laypeople were recommended to serve as members of the ACI. The idea was to make certain that there was a representation of all the Asian communities that were present in the Archdiocese of Chicago. Actually, I have been serving on the ACI since the beginning acting as representative of the Filipino Catholic community which is the largest Asian Catholic community in the Archdiocese. Together with the other members of the ACI, we have been working to make sure that the voice of the Asian Catholic Community is heard in the Archdiocese and our presence is celebrated as a gift from God.

In addition to being an advisory board to the Cardinal in Asian Catholic matters, the ACI had started an Annual Mass that would bring together and celebrate the entire Asian Catholic Community. The Catholic experience in the various Asian countries is unique to each group. The Philippines, for example, still is known as the only predominantly Catholic nation in all of Asia. Every other country in Asia is majority non-Catholic and even non-Christian. In other countries – like Vietnam – the Catholic faith experienced severe persecution. In each country, the Catholic faith obviously is one but Catholics from each of those countries has their own unique expression of the One True Faith. The ACI came up with the idea of having an annual event that would celebrate the rich history of the Catholic faith in all of Asia. Thus was born the idea of an Annual Mass presided by the Cardinal who is the chief shepherd.


The first Asian Catholic Community Mass was held at St. Henry. The second was at St. Celestine. The third was at St. Margaret Mary while I was still pastor there. There was a gap during the pandemic when everything was put on hold. As the ACI was planning on resuming the annual event, I noted that all the previous Asian Community Masses were on the north side. I pointed out that there are also Asian Catholics present on the south side. Fr. Phi, who had once been assigned to St. Damian in Oak Forest, echoed the observation. So, this led to St. Julie's being chosen as the host for this year's Asian Catholic Community Mass with the Cardinal.

The Asian Community Mass has been a way to bring together Asian Catholics from all across the Archdiocese. As I mentioned, the experience and history of the Catholic Church in each respective country is unique. But, the ACI found that there is one thing that unites all Asian Catholics apart from sharing the same faith. What is common to all Asian Catholics is a strong devotion to the Virgin Mary as Mother. The role of the mother is very strong in virtually all of the ethnic groups from Asia. That cultural value translated itself into a strong love for our Heavenly Mother. The affinity the bread we use at Mass only became the small thin wafer we are accustomed to many years after the first disciples. The small wafer became the norm perhaps more out of practical necessity than anything else. As the

members of the Church grew and the faith spread to all parts of the known world, it became more and more impractical to use the large bread that the first disciples had used. Eventually, the bread became the thin wafer because it was easier that way to provide Communion for a larger number of people. The thin wafer became the norm of the Church in the West (aka the Latin Rite Church).

# IN THE SHADOW OF THE WORD

*"Take my yoke upon you, says the Lord, and learn from me, for I am meek and humble of heart."*  
-*Matthew 11:29ab*

There are two things we can reflect from the Gospel reading today. First is that there is no place in the kingdom for spiritual exaltation. The attitude of the Christian community toward other religious traditions should not be measured in terms of superiority but of service. Our special intimacy with the Lord should enable us to assist and not deprecate the spiritual journey of others.

Second is that Christian service and concern must not be a subtle disguise for enhancing our reputation. The more genuine our service to others is, the more effective a vehicle it will be for God's grace to them. It is not a literal voice from heaven but our ordinary dealings with others that in some mysterious way can be what brings people back to the Lord.

I am sharing with you the Prayer for Generosity by St. Ignatius, whose Feast Day we just celebrated on July 31st, and let it be our prayer response to the Gospel message today, especially the second point made. Then, let it flow to our actions as we live out the Gospel message in our places of work, in the family and community we live in, in our daily lives.

### Prayer for Generosity

*Lord Jesus, teach me to be generous;  
teach me to serve you as you deserve,  
to give and not to count the cost,  
to fight and not to heed the wounds,  
to toil and not to seek for rest,  
to labor and not to seek reward,  
except that of knowing that  
I do your will. Amen. -St. Ignatius*



**"Care for Creation" and Laudato Si' (Part I)**



### WEEKLY STEWARDSHIP RECOMMENDATION

#### Conduct a Home Energy Assessment:

Call your electricity provider to see if they provide a free energy assessment of your home. This often includes free or discounted LED light bulbs, programmable thermostats, low flow showerheads, faucet aerators, power strips and hot water pipe insulation...for a significant household energy savings.

**Conduct a Home Energy Audit:** After an assessment, the next step is a professional audit. An audit usually costs, but can have a very fast payback. A blower is placed on your door and ductwork to find air leaks. IR guns determine insulation effectiveness. The EPA estimates that homeowners typically save 15% on heating/cooling costs each year by air sealing homes and adding insulation. Your power company may be able to help you identify qualified energy auditors.


