CHRISTMAS SEASON?

Do you know which country is known for having the longest Christmas season? I will give you a hint. It is the birthplace of both your pastor and associate pastor. Yes, the Philippines is known for having the longest Christmas season in the world.

Among Filipinos, we often joke that the Christmas season begins when the people in the Philippines start feeling the cold and start saying “brr.” So, Christmas starts when people say SeptemBER, OctoBER, NovemBER, and DecemBER. I know it is a silly type of “dad joke” but that is the reality in the Philippines. Christmas in the Philippines begins on September 1 and oftentimes goes until early or mid-February. The Philippines has the record of celebrating Christmas for at least half of an entire year.

For us in this part of the world, we might find it odd that the holiday season seems to start earlier and earlier. We may remember when Christmas décor would go up immediately after Thanksgiving. In more recent times, Christmas-themed décor seem to be going up sooner than before sometimes alongside Halloween decorations. Truth be told, people in the Philippines have started celebrating Christmas on September 1 for decades – maybe even more. Why? There is a little bit of cultural background that you need to know in order for me to answer the question of why Christmas is so long in the Philippines. For one, the Philippines was an agricultural society which still plays an important part in peoples’ lives to this day. The first harvest is usually around late April into May. For this reason, there are many, many festivals in all parts of the Philippines all throughout May. Many towns and cities will celebrate feast days of their patron saints during the month of May. This became the way for the early missionaries to help evangelize the early Filipinos. To this day, you can travel to all parts of the Philippines in May and find a festival in a different part of the country on any given day during that month.

The first harvest is important in an agricultural society like the Philippines. Whatever the outcome of the harvest meant either prosperity or struggle. If the

harvest was good and plentiful, it meant families could rest at ease. If the harvest was not good, obviously, there would be cause for concern. For the most part, though, the first harvest has been celebrated as a time to give thanks for blessings received.

After the first harvest comes a period which can be referred to as the “lean months” when it is time for paying off debts. School fees are oftentimes due during this time which, for many families, can be a struggle in and of itself. Other expenses need to get paid as well. So shortly after the celebration of a good harvest comes a period where money might be tight and families have to make sure they can stretch the income as far as it might be able to go.

Around the latter part of the year comes the next harvest period. It becomes a time where hope picks up again. After a period of struggle and “penny pinching,” there is a promise of another source of income. This inspires a spirit of celebration in the heart of the Filipino. So starting September 1, it became natural for the Filipino religiosity to look to the source of hope and joy which, of course, is Jesus.

The birth of the Savior became the “light at the end of a dark tunnel.” The struggles of the “lean months” is easier to bear when the Filipino heart thinks of the joy of the coming of the Savior. The Filipino culture just could not contain the anxiety and the joy. For this reason, the joyful season of Christmas was extended months prior and months after. The Philippines has the longest Christmas season in the world.

If you travel to the Philippines at this time, families will already have their homes decorated; stores and shopping malls will have Christmas themed displays; radio stations will be playing Christmas carols. In homes and karaoke bars, you will hear people already singing “I’m Dreaming of a White Christmas.” In some ways, it does not make sense. But, again, seen in the light of the struggle of Filipinos, it makes absolute sense to look forward to the Birth of Jesus. After all, Jesus is the fulfillment of all hope.



"Whoever does not carry his own cross and come after me cannot be my disciple." -Luke 14:27

The Lord is speaking of the obligation that comes with discipleship. One can be a disciple in name and phrase, but a serious effort to examine what it means to follow Christ, what love requires, how we give expression to the

Gospel message in the kind of society that we live in is not susceptible to a series of facile cliches. Each person has to give serious consideration as to how they will incarnate their baptismal spirit in their lives.

My own cross refers to whatever that tries to separate me from the Lord. Something or someone that captures my heart but leads me away from the Lord. Carrying this cross takes a careful planning and serious effort to follow through. Let me invite you to consider this. Faith can be expressed in various trivial and unsatisfying ways. It can also be a radical and penetrating way of living with depth and

satisfaction. Let our desire be to grow in our life of following Christ's radical love. We pray for the grace of courage and strength to lift and carry the cross that comes with it.

On another note, next Sunday at four o'clock in the afternoon, join us celebrate 2022 Annual Asian Catholic Community Mass with the Cardinal, organized by the Asian Catholic Initiative of the Archdiocese of Chicago. Celebrate the Season of Creation



The Season of Creation is a month-long prayerful observance that calls upon Catholics to pray and care for God's Creation. **It starts September 1st and ends October 4th.**

It's a time to reflect on our relationship with the environment, how we live, and how our lifestyles impact the natural world, humans and other creatures inhabiting it. This "time for creation" offers, in the words of Pope Francis, "individual believers and communities a fitting opportunity to reaffirm their personal vocation to be stewards of creation, to thank God for the wonderful handiwork which he has entrusted to our care, and to implore his help for the protection of creation...".

The US Conference of Catholic Bishops reminds us that "we show our respect for the Creator by our stewardship of Creation". Pope Francis urges us to recognize our connectedness with the natural world saying, "Nature cannot be regarded as something separate from ourselves or as a mere setting in which we live. We are part of nature, included in it and thus in constant interaction with it." (LS 139). Advocating for Creation Care helps safeguard the inheritance the Creator has given us, ... an inheritance essential to our well-being. Pope Benedict XVI told us that protecting this inheritance is a way of fulfilling our role as stewards of Creation.





