

PARISH STAFF CHANGES

This past June, we remember that our beloved Pat Kmak retired but, sadly, never enjoyed it. God called her back home shortly after she had retired. May she rest in peace.

More recently, Sue Clemons has stepped down from her position as Coordinator of Music Ministry. She also made that decision so that she can enjoy retirement life with her husband and family. She has already been making the most of it. I'm hope to have a new Coordinator of Music around mid to late October at the latest.

Now, though, I share another bit of news regarding our staff. Neno Babic has been our part-time Facilities Engineer for the last year and a half. Recently, he has told me that for personal reasons he has decided to resign from his position. He will be on staff until the end of this calendar year. So I am already in the process of looking for a replacement for the position of Facilities Engineer.

In regards to the music position, I have decided to move it to a full-time Director of Music Ministry position. Sue was hired as part-time before I started here at the parish. She remained part-time until she resigned from her position. I already interviewed several applicants to fill the position. There have been many strong candidates so this will be a decision that will require a lot of prayers. I brought one of them in last weekend to see him "in action." In the next coming weeks, several more applicants will be interviewed by the Search Committee as well as several members of the choir. After I gather all of the input, I will take it all to prayer and make my final decision.

As for Neno, again, it is for personal reasons that he makes the decision to resign. He has assured me that he is willing to work until the end of this calendar year. I brought him on staff as part-time. In the time he has been on staff, he has done a lot of great work and has been extremely helpful. His love for the faith and for the parish can be felt in the way he worked. It was with sadness that I accepted his resignation.

I have already posted the job opening. Like with the music ministry position, I have decided to move to a full-time Facilities Engineer. As valuable as Neno has been and as much as he has been able to do even at part-time, I had come to a realization even before he notified me about his resignation. Namely, I realized that a full-time position is needed in the area of Facilities Engineer. We have a large campus with a lot of needs. So I will be looking for a full-time person in this area.

Looking for a new Director of Music Ministry and also a Facilities Engineer was not in my plan at this time. However, now that I find myself in this position, I felt it to be a good time to create and fill another position. So at the same time that I will be looking for a Facilities Engineer, I have decided to create the position of Director of Parish Ministries/Evangelization which will also be full-time.

The Director of Parish Ministries/Evangelization position is similar to a Pastoral Associate. However, there might be more required of a Director of Parish Ministries/Evangelization than a Pastoral Associate. This position is meant not only to help organize the parish ministries and be a liaison to them but also to provide pastoral assistance whether it be pastoral counseling or spiritual direction.

Furthermore, the position of Director of Parish Ministries/Evangelization is also meant to address the crucial need of evangelization. To put it business terms, there is a need to "market" the parish to the larger community in the hopes of bringing new people into the parish. This position will need to be able to utilize all the parish media – bulletin, website, social media, etc. – and other tools in order to reach out to the "unchurched" as well as to those who have fallen away.


We know that there is a great need to reach out to the young families in the neighborhood that may or may not know that they are seeking faith. We also need a concentrated effort to reach out to those Catholics who have fallen away from the practice either because of the pandemic lockdown or other reasons. In either case, there is great need and much work that needs to be done. Having a person on staff devoted to all of these tasks will be extremely helpful.

To add to all of this, I have also made the decision to move toward creating and filling an Office Manager/Bookkeeper position. I felt that this position would be necessary in order to prepare for the other positions. As you can imagine and as you may already be thinking, there will need to be another restructuring of current staff positions – that is, either elimination of positions or reduction in hours. Some of the current duties that are part of current positions will be absorbed by those who will be filling the other positions. So, there will need to be some consolidating to avoid duplication of duties.

Looking for one new staff person is already a challenge. Fortunately, as I mentioned, I should be ready soon to make a decision regarding the Director of Music Ministry. As for the other positions, I am giving myself until the end of this calendar year to fill the positions of Facilities Engineer, Director of Parish Ministries/Evangelization, and Office Manager/Bookkeeper. If I can fill them sooner I will. Of course, those who are currently on staff whose positions may be impacted will also be considered for the new positions but I would also like to consider as many potential applicants as possible.

I know that this is a lot to take in at this time. And I am sure that there will be some who might question my decision to go this route. I just felt it would be better in the long run to do it all at once. I am giving myself until the end of the calendar year simply because I have a trip to the Philippines coming up this week as well as a pilgrimage to the Holy Land in November with several people from the parish. It will require that I make best use of the time I have to conduct interviews some of which might need to be done online while I am in other parts of the world. As best as possible, I will also look to parishioners to meet with potential candidates to give me their input. Again I know that there might be mixed feelings about this decision and move that I am making. At this point, I just ask for everyone's prayers.

IN THE SHADOW OF THE WORD / LANDONG SA PULONG

"No servant can serve two masters. He will either hate one and love the other, or be devoted to one and despise the other. You cannot serve both God and mammon." Luke 16:13

Let us talk about love and devotion and let it be our way of life. The choice is stark: God or mammon. Each of us has a god we serve.

The question centers upon which will attract our devotion. Jesus tells us to make friends through our use of this world's goods. It is a reminder that the spiritual bonds of human friendship are more important than the simple accumulation of things. Spiritual bonds endure over time. Things can be lost and can rot. We should use the time and opportunities we have to widen our friendships and attach ourselves to a community that will place us into a wider and more enduring context of meaning than our own narrow self-interest.

There are a variety of ways of achieving that. Parish service is one of the most prominent. Include the good deeds we do to our fellows that would en flesh the love we have for God in response to the reality that God first loved us, and faithfully continues to do so. We pray for that love to be strengthened in our devotional prayers.

We are back to having First Saturday masses and invite all to make it a devotion. **The next Mass is October 1 at 8am.**

How to Practice the Five First Saturday's Devotion

- 1) **Confession:** Make a good confession during the 8 days prior to the first Saturday with the intention of offering reparation for the offenses against Our Lady's Immaculate Heart.
- 2) **Communion:** You should attend Holy Mass and receive Holy Communion with the intention of offering reparation for the offenses against Our Lady's Immaculate Heart.
- 3) The Communion should be received *on the first Saturday of the month.*
- 4) The confession must be **repeated for 5 consecutive months**, without interruption, otherwise you must recommence from the beginning.
- 5) **Recite 5 decades of the Holy Rosary** with the intention of making reparation to Our Lady's Immaculate Heart.
- 6) **Fifteen minutes meditation on the mysteries of the Holy Rosary.** Accompany Our Lady by meditating on the mysteries of the Holy Rosary. This may be done by reading the biblical texts of the mysteries of the Holy Rosary slowly thinking of their content. You could meditate on one mystery for 15 minutes at the end of the prayer as did Sr Lucia. This meditation is in addition to the recitation of the Rosary.
- 7) **Say the prayer to the Immaculate Heart of Mary to conclude the devotion.**




MARK YOUR CALENDAR! - TOOTSIE ROLL SALE FOR SPRED September 24/25 (After all the Masses)
