

OCTOBER DEDICATED TO THE HOLY ROSARY

October is the month dedicated to the Holy Rosary. The feast of Our Lady of the Most Holy Rosary is always celebrated on October 7th. The Rosary still remains one of the devotions unique and particular to our Catholic faith.

Growing up the Rosary was a central part of my family experience. Every night my mother would gather the family together to pray the Rosary. No excuse was acceptable enough for her to exempt us from the nightly prayer routine. Even though it really only took no more than 15–20 minutes out of our time, it seemed like an eternity and a huge burden. However, today, I cannot seem to get through an entire day without the prayer of the Rosary.

For many of us, we are accustomed to praying the Rosary in a certain way. There are standard prayers that are universal but there also might be some that are unique to each individual's devotion. Such was the case with how my mom taught me how to pray the Rosary. Namely, the Litany of the Virgin Mary was always a part of the nightly Rosary. I grew up thinking that the Litany was a prescribed prayer that was always supposed to accompany the Rosary and surprised later in life when I learned that others did not have the same experience. Whether we use the Litany or not, personally I have found it to be a beautiful addition to my experience of the Rosary.

For those unfamiliar with a litany, it is a list of short invocations followed by a common and repeated response. The word litany itself comes from a word that means "list." The Litany of the Virgin Mary is a list of titles given to the Virgin Mary. When we look at the list of titles, we can be amazed at how many. From the first centuries of the Church, Christians have been honoring the Virgin Mary and this particular Litany has remained a testimony to the love Christians have had for the Virgin Mary since the start of the Church. Growing up, I never really paid attention to each invocation. But, later in life I have taken the opportunity to pay closer attention to each title and am now able to see that each title helps us to have a clear understanding of who Mary is for us.

Here is the list of invocations that make up the Litany of the Virgin Mary. In some versions, there are additional titles but this is pretty much the version that I grew up with and still pray.

Holy Mary,
Holy Mother of God,
Holy Virgin of virgins,
Mother of Christ,
Mother of divine grace,
Mother most pure,
Mother most chaste,
Mother inviolate,
Mother undefiled,
Mother most amiable,
Mother most admirable,
Mother of good counsel,
Mother of our Creator,
Mother of our Savior,
Virgin most prudent,
Virgin most venerable,
Virgin most renowned,
Virgin most powerful,
Virgin most merciful,
Virgin most faithful,
Mirror of justice,
Seat of wisdom,
Cause of our joy,
Spiritual vessel,
Vessel of honor,
Singular vessel of devotion,
Mystical rose,
Tower of David,
Tower of ivory,
House of gold,
Ark of the covenant,
Gate of Heaven,
Morning star,
Health of the sick,
Refuge of sinners,
Comforter of the afflicted,
Help of Christians,
Queen of angels,
Queen of patriarchs,
Queen of prophets,
Queen of apostles,
Queen of martyrs,
Queen of confessors,
Queen of virgins,
Queen of all saints,
Queen conceived without original sin,
Queen assumed into heaven,
Queen of the most holy Rosary,
Queen of peace.

Again, with each of the invocations, we are actually taught the proper Catholic understanding of the Virgin Mary. Oftentimes we are accused of worshipping Mary or making her into a goddess. But, we do not worship her because worship is only to God. The high honor that we do give to the Virgin Mary is seen in each invocation of the Litany. With each one, we understand why it is right and proper that we honor her as we do.

The Virgin Mary is holy because she was filled with the presence of God. The Son of God dwelt in her womb for nine months. She allowed that presence of God to guide her in everything even when she did not understand God's plan.

The Virgin Mary is Mother. She is not only the Mother of Jesus. Mary is also our Mother. She gave birth to the physical body of Jesus. We are now the Body of Christ on earth so in a real way, Mary is truly our mother because we are the physical body of Jesus in the world today.

Mary is also Virgin. We believe that she was kept pure and unstained before, during, and after giving birth to Jesus. This was by God's design and God's doing. Mary has no power of her own except what God has given to her. Likewise, Mary's virginity reminds us of the need to be aware of how we must always allow God to be the one at work in us.

The Virgin Mary is also rightly honored because she is a great help to us as we daily live out our call to be disciples of Jesus. It is a hard task and one that requires help from someone who lived it. As we celebrate the month of the Holy Rosary and honor the Virgin Mary through that beloved prayer, let us never forget her great impact in all of our lives.



"When you have done all you have been commanded, say, 'We are unprofitable servants; we have done what we were obliged to do.'" - Lk 17:10

The expected attitude of a Christian disciple, a follower of Christ, is that of servanthood. This can only be attained when there is the recognition of the fact that the Lord God is the first one who loves us and whatever good that the disciple does is a necessary response to that love, not the other way around.

We can check ourselves if we do have that attitude by asking ourselves why we pray or why we do the good deeds that we do. Many times we find ourselves making conditions for the Lord, like asking to grant us something in return for a good deed. We fail to realize that the Lord has granted us the best that we need even before we asked for it. The greatest of them all is the great love of the Heavenly Father, who created all things, including us whom he did in his own image and likeness, enjoying the knowledge and freedom to love in return and love forward our neighbors who are our brethren in Christ.

Let me continue to propose "devotion" to practice this response to God's love. This is the third week in a row that I talk about devotion as a way for us to grow in faithfulness to the Lord. I have mentioned First Saturday devotion to the Immaculate Heart of Mary, and First Friday devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. Let me add to my proposal another devotion, and that is the practice of praying the rosary every day (if you are not doing it as a devotion throughout the year yet) for the whole month of October since it is the month of the Holy Rosary. We celebrate the feast of Our Lady of the Holy Rosary on October 7th.

Next week let us learn more about the Church's practice of "Plenary Indulgence" and distinguish its meaning from what we reflected on this week.

Turn then, most gracious advocate, thine eyes of mercy toward us, and after this our exile show us the blessed fruit of thy womb, Jesus. O clement, O loving, O sweet Virgin Mary.


Close with leader saying *Pray for us, O holy Mother of God.*




