MY TRIP TO THE PHILIPPINES

I just got back from the Philippines two days ago. As is usually the case, it will take me several days to get readjusted to the time. With a 13 hour difference, you can imagine that it can be a little bit of a challenge to

get reacclimated. But, it is good to be back and I want to thank the parish for allowing me to take the trip back to the Philippines.

Going back to the Philippines, for me, is so much more than just a vacation. I do take time to relax and explore new places that I have not yet visited. But, there oftentimes is so much more to a trip back to the Philippines. Since I am oftentimes asked to celebrate Mass at different churches throughout the Philippines, you could also say that it is a “business trip.” But, one of the ways I describe a trip to the Philippines is that it is almost like a pilgrimage.

I was born in the Philippines but my family moved to Chicago when I was not even five years old. It took me seventeen years before I was able to make a trip back to the Philippines. From that first trip back, I promised myself that I would not let five years pass by without making a trip back. For Filipinos like myself, going back to the Philippines is “going home.” In fact, we use a specific word in Tagalog when speaking of taking a trip to the Philippines. It literally is translated as “going back home.” So, again, for me there is an element of pilgrimage every time I take a trip home.

The reason why I say it is like a pilgrimage is I always make it a point to go to my hometown. With the exception of one trip, I have always made it to my hometown of Lucban in the Province of Quezon. Whether it is for a couple of days, a weekend, an entire week, or more, it has become very crucial for me to go back to my hometown.

Some might find it unusual because I never grew up there. But that is not what makes it like a pilgrimage for me. Even though I did not grow up in Lucban and know only a handful of people there apart from those who are related to me, I recognize it as the place where my parents’ love story began. It is the place

where both my parents were born and raised. It is the place where God’s grace led them to one another. It is the place where they began to answer the call to live out the vocation to be husband and wife.

Going to Lucban is as much a pilgrimage as it is a vacation because it is the place where the seed of my vocation was planted. It was there that my mother and father vowed to love one another for the rest of their lives. In doing so, their love created a family that was rooted in the faith. It was in that family context that I heard the voice of God inviting me to consider the priesthood. It was in that family context that God’s grace strengthened me to say ‘yes’ to the priesthood that has been a part of my life for the last twenty-six plus years. For all of those reasons, I see going to the Philippines as a pilgrimage—a trip to a holy place—that helps me get reconnected to the Divine Power of God.

Of course, going to the Philippines also involves a reconnecting with relatives and friends. I do not have the same experience as people like Fr. Roy who grew up there. I did not grow up with my cousins there. But, since I have been able to reconnect with them throughout the years, we have shared memories that will always be a part of us.


I must also admit that each time I go to the Philippines, there is a little bit of “business” as much as there is “pleasure.” What I mean is that I get things for whatever parish to which I am currently assigned. Things can be a lot cheaper there and of equal or better quality. So if there are things I can get for the parish while I am there, I take advantage of the moment.

Such is the case with this past trip I took. One, through a friend, I commissioned an image of the Virgin Mary to be added to our wall of Marian images in church. That wall in the northwest corner of church has different images that represent the various ethnic



backgrounds that make up our parish community. The image I chose depicts the Virgin Mary with the Child Jesus dressed in distinctly Filipino clothing overlooking a small village. Her title under this particular image is Our Lady of the Barangay (barangay is the smallest part of a neighborhood). It is a combination of painting on canvas with hand embroidery. The Rosary beads carried by the Child Jesus are made up of freshwater pearls. With many different images of Mary from every region in the Philippines, I chose this particular image since it is more universal to all Filipinos no matter from what region they may originate.


I also picked up a second piece of artwork. This one will be going up on the wall leading to the tabernacle chapel. It is an image of a mother pelican with her younglings. The pelican is an



ancient image for the Eucharist. It is said that a mother pelican will bite off pieces of her own flesh if she cannot find enough food to give to her young. From ancient times, Christians have seen that as a metaphor for Jesus' act of giving his own Body and Blood for the life of his disciples. Again, knowing that I was going to be in the Philippines, I commissioned a painting.

The painting of the pelican was done by seminarian Mark Bambao. I came to know him through mutual priest and seminarian friends. Mark would post his artwork on Facebook and each one captivates me. One of his pieces was even shared with Pope Francis. I asked him to paint the pelican image which will be framed and eventually hung on the wall leading to the tabernacle. It will remind us of the great significance of the Eucharist in our lives. Peace,

We just had our blessing of pets last week to celebrate the feast of St. Francis of Assisi and honor his love for all sentient beings. It is not surprising then that I got asked again this question: "Will my dog go to heaven?" It reminded me of one of my professor's Final Exam questions in my Theology seminary course "Creation, Sin, and Eschatology," "Will Scooby (my professor's pet dog) go to heaven?"

Yes was my answer. "By virtue of Scooby's being God's creature, heaven as going back and united with God, the Creator" would make the best sense. Per my professor, I got it partly right; partly because there is a need to distinguish this sense of heaven from that of heaven as human salvation, that of human beings like us, who are created in the image and likeness of God, endowed with knowledge and free will.

Pope Francis' words give us consolation as to where our pets are headed when he prays in his encyclical on the

environment, "Teach us to discover the worth of each thing, to be filled with awe and contemplation, to recognize that we are profoundly united with every creature as we journey towards [God's] infinite light."

In a 1990 papal audience, Pope John Paul II proclaimed that "the animals possess a soul and men must love and feel solidarity with our smaller brethren." He added that animals are the "fruit of the creative action of the Holy Spirit and merit respect" and that they are "as near to God as men are." Though Pope John Paul II never made any claims about heaven, he enforces the idea that all animals are God's creation.

Personally, I continue to say and believe that yes, all creatures are bound to return to the Creator, including our beloved dogs. They have a sure spot in God's eternal dwelling. Now it's time for us to check our own destiny as human beings as well. Do we do our best to stay on the path to that destiny of eternity to the Creator?





OCTOBER IS DOMESTIC ABUSE AWARENESS MONTH

Domestic violence is a pattern of behavior in any intimate relationship whereby one partner seeks to gain or maintain power and control over the other. Abuse can be physical, sexual, emotional, economic and psychological. The abuser takes action or makes threats that influence the other person. This includes any behaviors that frighten, intimidate, terrorize, manipulate, hurt, humiliate, blame, injure, or wound someone. Domestic violence can happen to anyone of any race, age, sexual orientation, religion, or gender.

Domestic violence affects people of **all socioeconomic backgrounds and education levels**. (Adapted from *National Domestic Violence Hotline*). Abuse is a repetitive pattern of behaviors to maintain power and control over an intimate partner. These are behaviors that physically harm, arouse fear, prevent a partner from doing what they wish or force them to behave in ways they do not want. Abuse includes the use of physical and sexual violence, threats and intimidation, emotional abuse and economic deprivation.


