



BEING DISCIPLES OF JESUS

HAPPY NEW YEAR!

We continue the celebration of the Incarnation—God becoming human in Jesus of Nazareth. For us as Catholic Christians, we believe that Jesus is much more than an ordinary human being who lived an extraordinarily good life. If that is all there was to Jesus, it is hardly enough reason for us to profess faith in him. Rather, Jesus is fully human and fully divine.

In other words, in a specific moment in history and in a specific place on earth, God took on human flesh. The Son of God—the Second Person of the Blessed Trinity—left his place at the Father's Right Hand, entered into the human experience without losing his divinity, and was born of the Virgin Mary to be our Savior. Again, Jesus is the Son of God who became flesh yet never lost anything of his divinity. If Jesus truly is divine, we can truly declare that Mary is the Mother of God insofar as she gave birth to the human flesh that God took on in the Incarnation.

But, have we ever stopped to think of why God chose to become human in the time of history He did? Further, have we wondered why Jesus as the Son of God would choose the area of modern day Israel and the West Bank to exercise his ministry? God never does anything without reason so there must be a reason for the choice in time and place.

In terms of place, our Holy Land guide taught us pilgrims an important insight as to why God chose the specific location of the ancient Middle East. The land that is now modern day Israel and including the West Bank was actually a very strategic location in ancient history. It was a natural route where literally the entire world would converge. From the east, travelers would have to travel west into the land now known as Israel in order to reach further destinations. Likewise, those traveling from the north with a final destination of Egypt must pass through that same part of the world. Also, from the west, the shores of modern day Israel were a natural port from the Mediterranean Sea. In every way, then, the ancient land that is now known as Israel along with the territories controlled by Palestine was a central hub. If God wanted to make sure His Word was heard by as many people as possible and spread to the farthest reaches of the earth, it would be natural for God to choose a location that would facilitate a flow from one end to another. That part of the world provided a strong vantage point from which Jesus - the Son of God - could not only preach his message but ensure that people from all parts of the known world would hear him and then share his message to others.

In reality, this is precisely what we can see when we look at the life and ministry of Jesus. He purposely situated himself



in areas of high density of people. He knew that he was in a strategic part of the known world. Locals and visitors to the region would all hear him preach. Many of them fell captivated by his words. Then, when they returned home—near and far—Jesus' words would be shared. God chose that specific part of the world not only because of its religious and symbolic significance to the ancient Jewish people but also because it was a major hub.

To the question of why God chose that particular time of history, there have been many discussions about this by theologians and other scholars. We may recall that Scripture describes God coming in the fullness of time in order to redeem His People who had reached the ultimate pit of despair. But, how did that particular time in history become the "fullness of time"? If God came into the world and took on human flesh because humanity had reached an "all time low," why then and not now? After all, we have seen a lot of cruelty in our own time. We have seen periods of immorality that perhaps rival those of ancient times. Yet, God chose to enter into human history in the first century rather than now.

The reason perhaps is rooted in the way God has acted from ancient times until now. What I mean is that God had always chosen instruments that seem to be of small significance. For example, God chose a simple peasant virgin to be the chosen vessel as the Mother of His Son. God raised up prophets who were less than ordinary people by the standards of their time. God's Son chose as his apostles those who were fishermen, tax collectors, and practical "nobodies" and made them his inner circle. With all of the advances in technology today, we could say that God did not chose this time of history because people may not be prone to listen.

Even with the advances in modes of communication, many people have not developed good listening skills. This was not the case in ancient times. People listened to those who were influential speakers and teachers. The more influence those speakers had on the crowds meant that there was a greater chance of that person's message to be spread.

Yet, what we simply must trust is that God chose that specific time in history for a reason. Perhaps we will never fully understand why until we are standing before God's throne in heaven. Whatever the reason might have been, the first century Middle East was the time in history that God chose to enter into the human condition and transform it forever.

This weekend, as we continue the celebration of God Made Flesh through the Virgin Mary, may we simply be filled with gratitude that God has come to our aid when the need was greatest. With that same grace, may we continue what Jesus first started.

A Blessed New Year to one and all!

Our New Year's Day is truly special with the Solemnity of the Blessed Virgin Mary, Mother of God, and the celebration of World Day of Peace. The assuring presence of a mother who said "Yes" to God's will is the best way to start the new year and turn our resolutions to be better persons, better disciples, better children of God into a reality.

St Luke tells us that "Mary kept all these things, reflecting on them in her heart." God did not tell Mary his entire plan. We know much more than she did about how everything was going to work out. She had to walk in the dim light of faith, one step at a time, trusting in God, witnessing his action, and seconding it whenever she could. But she paid attention. She pondered in her heart all of God's gifts to her, all of his words and deeds.

Granted that many people today are recovering from yesterday evening's festivities, it's not hard to start this New Year as Mary did: peacefully, quietly, and in a spirit of contemplation, not just recuperation. All the fanfare is over, and the new year has just started. Reflect on the things in your heart. There are certainly things there you treasure, but also things there you regret. Now is the moment to inaugurate a year of peace.

Take a moment every now and then not just to think things over but more importantly prayerfully reflect and meditate. Asking for the grace of guidance and enlightenment, this practice increases our selfawareness, a gift that comes with freedom – freedom to choose to do more of the good things we've been doing, and to choose to curtail those that are not good.

CHAPTER ONE

Man's Capacity for God

2. Why does man have a desire for God? (27-30, 44-45)

God himself, in creating man in his own image, has written upon his heart the desire to see him. Even if this desire is often ignored, God never ceases to draw man to himself because only in God will he find and live the fullness of truth and happiness for which he never stops searching. By nature and by vocation, therefore, man is a religious being, capable of entering into communion with God. This intimate and vital bond with God confers on man his fundamental dignity.

3. How is it possible to know God with only the light of human reason? (31-36, 46-47)

Starting from creation, that is from the world and from the human person, through reason alone one can know God with certainty as the origin and end of the universe, as the highest good and as infinite truth and beauty.





DAYBREAK SHELTER BREAKFAST

Daybreak is a shelter located in Joliet and run by Catholic Charities. For the past 25+ years, St. Julie parishioners have provided a hot delicious breakfast on the first Sunday of the month as well as Christmas morning! A typical schedule:

5:00am - arrive and begin to prepare breakfast 6:00am - serve breakfast to some very grateful and beautiful people.

7:00am - clean up what you used and head home! Most teams are home no later than 8:00am. Teams are made up of 5 – 10 people and they decide what to serve. It is totally up to the team members. The warmer months there might be 35 people and in the winter we may serve 50+ because of the weather.

This is truly a great ministry for busy people! Everyone has three hours per year to give. Talk to your friends, family and co-workers! Think about it and if you feel this might be a good fit for you or you just have some questions, please give us a call or email.




